THE ORGAN AND TODAY'S LITURGY

The first consideration for registration (the process of combining pipes to create a composite sound) is the type of pipe to choose: principal, flute, string, or The second consideration is the pitch level. The "stops" of an organ each control a set of pipes (a "rank") of a type and pitch level. An 8' rank sounds at unison; so, for instance, the key A around the middle of the keyboard has a frequency of 440 cycles per second in an 8' rank. For a 4' rank, that same A would have a frequency of 880 cps; that A with a 2' rank would sound a 1760 cps, and for a 16' rank would sound at 220 cps. 4' and 2' ranks add brightness to the sound, and during Lent, to create a more somber sound, the 2' pipes and certain 4' pipes are being excluded from registrations. 
St. Margaret's Shelter Move-In Baskets With Cataldo at St. Augustine

ST. PATRICK IN STAINED GLASS

St. Patrick, Apostle of Ireland



A Roman-Briton by origin, St. Patrick's birthplace is unknown. In a dream, St. Patrick studied for the priesthood in Rome and was finally given permission to return to Ireland. He traveled throughout Ireland, planting the faith everywhere despite the hostility of the Druids. He used the Shamrock to explain the mystery of the Trinity. By establishing various bishoprics and holding several

councils, he organized the Church in Ireland. St. Patrick established numerous monasteries for men and women and made Ireland famous for its seats of piety and learning. Many legends surround St. Patrick. Our window depicts one in which he drove all the snakes, representing evil, out of Ireland.

FAITH FORMATION

In the Religious Education program, we strive to foster the spiritual and musical growth of the children.
