First Friday Adoration

Eucharistic Adoration with Benediction is the first Friday of the month immediately following the 8:00 a.m. morning Mass. The students of Cataldo at St. Augustine join us to spend time praying before the Blessed Sacrament. Adoration is followed with Benediction at 11:00 a.m.

The Organ Music in Today's Liturgy

Today's prelude and postlude are both by Léon Boëllmann (1862-1897), French composer, critic, and organist of Église de St. Vincent de Paul, Paris. The prelude, the first of five *élévations* from his *Heures Mystiques*, Op.29, captures the sentiment of the Communion antiphon: "Christ loved us, and gave himself up for us, as a fragrant offering to God." The tumultuous and ominous *Toccata*, from *Suite Gothique*, Op. 25, reaches its apotheosis in a sonic splendor reminiscent of today's psalm: "My God, my rock of refuge, my shield...my stronghold!...The LORD lives, and blessed be my Rock! Extolled be God my savior, You who gave great victories to your king..." If you would like to know more, please ask Joseph Schubert, the organist.

Note that Tuesday morning Mass (October 31) will be at 8:00 a.m. The weekly school Mass is moved to Wednesday for the holy day.

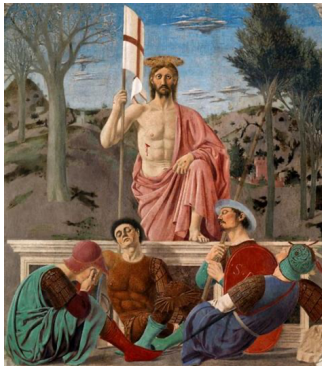
INLAND CATHOLIC
