The Organ Music in Today's Liturgy

The text of our Entrance Hymn today, "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord, God Almighty," extols the attributes of our Triune God, which is fitting for today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The prelude takes that hymn tune and crafts from it a subtle and lovely meditation: *Nicea* (which is the name of the hymn tune) was composed by American composer and organist Calvin Hampton (1938-1984). As we close out the month of May, and in honor of our Blessed Mother, the postlude for today will have a Marian theme: "Chorale," from *Variations on Ave Regina Caelorum*, by Joseph Schubert (b. 1956).

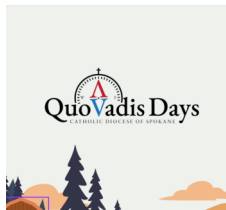
Wisdom

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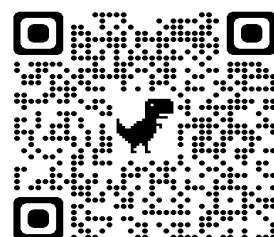

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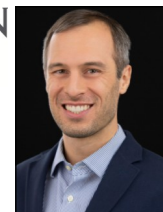
