The Organ Music in Today's Liturgy

The Feast of Corpus Christi began as a local observance in Liège in 1246, and was instituted for the whole church in 1264 by Pope Urban IV. Today's prelude is upon the Gregorian chant based communion: Quotiescumque manducabitis (Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, says the Lord). The setting is from French organist Jean-Jacques Grunenwald's (1911-1982) Messe Saint-Sacrement. The postlude, by German composer Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1877), is the final movement (Allegro assai vivace) from his Organ Sonata No.1. Its brilliance and solemnity is fitting both for this important liturgy, which affirms the doctrine of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and as a counterpart to today's sequence, Lauda Sion. Incoming Pastor's Letter

JUNE 1, 2024

DEAR ST. AUGUSTINE PARISHIONERS,



I am excited to join you soon as your pastor. I was born in Spokane and raised on the South Hill, so I will be returning to my old stomping grounds. I look forward to being closer to my family and friends who live in the area. My parents, brother, sister, and brother-in-law all live on the South Hill. Most of them are parishioners at St. Peter's Parish, where I grew up and where my dear friend, Fr. Luke Tomson, is serving as pastor.

It is a strange thing to become the pastor of St. Augustine's while I am living, not only outside of the diocese, but on the other side of the country. As many of you know, the bishop has asked me to prepare a degree in canon law, the internal legal structure that governs the Church throughout the world. I am currently pursuing my degree at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. (where I am residing even as you read this letter). This means, unfortunately, that I will not enjoy the privilege of serving fully at St. Augustine's until the first part of August.

Your retiring pastor, Msgr. Mee, has been very gracious and helpful in arranging this transition. I look forward to being his successor and am appreciative of the leadership he has exercised in the parish. He has generously offered to cover some of the daily Mass schedule while I am away. However, due to my absence and the challenges involved with substitutes, there will be some temporary changes to the Mass schedule for July and August.

Weekend Masses and Confessions will remain the same thanks to the priests who have volunteered to cover the weekends I am away. Daily Mass will only be on Tuesdays and Thursdays during July and August.

Daily Mass attendees are often very committed to their parish and the Lord's presence in the Eucharist. I am sure this is true for those who come to daily Mass at St. Augustine. I know that the reduction in the schedule will be disappointing, and I appreciate your patience. I hope that those committed to daily Mass, as well as all the parishioners of St. Augustine, will keep me in their prayers, not only during these summer months, but throughout my time as pastor.

You will certainly be in my prayers. In fact, one of the legal requirements addressed during my study of canon law in D.C. speaks explicitly about the obligation of a pastor to offer a Mass "pro populo" (i.e., for the people of God) on every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. I gladly take up this duty and privilege on July 1. Although I will not be with you in person every weekend, I will remember you all at the altar of God. My prayers for you will not be limited to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. You will be in my prayers daily. Please keep me in yours.
