
SAINT AUGUSTINE PARISH JANUARY 26, 2025 THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Mass Schedule ~ Church Closure



Due to electrical work being done in the church, it will be closed on Monday, January 27. There will be no Monday morning Mass. The church will reopen on Tuesday, January 28, at 8AM.

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord ~ February 2nd ~

In accordance with the Old Law, the Lord Jesus Christ, as the firstborn Son, was presented in the Temple in Jerusalem by his Blessed Mother, Mary, and foster father, Joseph, to be consecrated to the Lord. Following Jewish tradition, the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple took place forty days after the birth of Jesus, when the time of purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary was completed.

As we learn from the Gospel of St. Luke, upon beholding the long-awaited Christ Child at the Temple, Simeon, a devout man, took Jesus in his arms and proclaimed a canticle of praise to God. Through Simeon's canticle and words of prophecy to the Blessed Virgin Mary, following his blessing of the Holy Family, as well as the words of Anna, a prophetess, who worshiped in the temple day and night with fasting and prayer, Jesus is revealed as the Messiah, who has come into the world as the light to all nations and salvation of all peoples.

The Catholic Church specifically prescribes the blessing of candles, to be used throughout the Liturgical Year in the church, to take place at all Masses on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. These candles symbolize Christ who is the Light of the World, thus this Feast is also known as Candlemas Day.

At St. Augustine, the weekend of February 1st and 2nd, the candles to be used throughout the Liturgical Year will be blessed at each Mass, with the addition of the Solemn Entrance with Lighted Candles at the 9:00 a.m. Sunday Mass.

This scripture, from the Entrance Antiphon for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, as well as the Old and New Testament readings for today, compel us to not only look inwardly for our "new song," but to proclaim it outwardly in action and deed in accordance and in alignment with the precepts of our faith. As such, today's prelude is meditative whereas the postlude is full of bold, punctuated musical gestures. Both are by French organist/composer Gaston Litaize (1909-1991) and taken from Volume III of his *Préludes Liturgiques*.
