
ST. AUGUSTINE CATHOLIC CHURCH APRIL 6, 2025 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Where Has All the Beauty Gone?

The Organ Music in Today's Liturgy

As you will recall, registration is the process of combining selected organ pipes to create a composite timbre. Physics is involved in this process. Every pipe has a fundamental, which is the frequency of the actual note it produces. The strength of the fundamental can be manipulated by selecting other pipes that will emphasize its overtones. Adding 4' and 2' pipes to an 8' pipe (see the March 3 bulletin) will make the composite timbre "brighter," a subjective term for sure, but one that acknowledges that the overtones are now stronger than fundamental. Other pipes that add "brilliance" and "color" are called mixtures and mutations, respectively. More on that next week! If you would like to know more, please ask Joseph Schubert, the organist.


