

Seminarian Formation Appeal

All parishioners should have received a mailing from Bishop Daly with information about this year's Seminarian Formation Appeal. It begins the weekend of June 14-15, 2025.

The Diocese of Spokane in blessed to have 19 men in Seminary formation. The path to priesthood can be nine years for a seminarian who begins at Cor Christi, continuing his studies at Bishop White Seminary, and then finishing theological studies at one of the three major seminaries the men are sent to. The cost to form a seminarian over a nine-year period can exceed \$400,000.




St. John the Baptist ~ June 24

John the Baptist, the forerunner of Christ, is one of only three people in history — after Jesus and Mary — whose birthday is celebrated in the Church's liturgy. In fact, the Nativity of St. John the Baptist on June 24 is a solemnity, meaning it is the highest form of Catholic feast day.

The Organ Music in Today's Liturgy

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) began as a local observance in Liège in 1246 and was instituted for the whole church in 1264 by Pope Urban IV. Today's prelude and postlude are from the pen of twentieth century composer, Jean-Jacques French organist and Grunenwald (1911-1982), taken from his Messe du Trés Saint-Sacrement. written for which was solemnity. The prelude is based upon the Gregorian chant for communion: Quotiescumque manducabitis (Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, says the Lord). Its quiet introspection invites us to ponder the mystery of the great sacrament of Holy Communion. The postlude, Paraphrase-Fantasie sur "Lauda Sion," is based upon melodic themes taken from the chant setting of the sequence, Lauda Sion. The kaleidoscopic melodic and harmonic colors and frenetic energy are meant to match the text's overwhelming outburst of praise.
