Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time — November 18, 2018 "Always Seek the Truth" Fr. Bosco Padamattummal

Mark 13:28 says, "Now learn the parable from the fig tree. When its branches have already become tender and put forth its leaves, you know the summer is near." Just the day before, our Lord had cursed the fig tree, chapter 11:12-14. He used the fig tree as an illustration of Israel. He went to the fig tree because He was hungry. The fig tree had no fruit. That was unusual because the fruit comes first and the leaves come later on fig trees. Because there were leaves, there should have been some immature fruit that He

could have plucked and it would have been edible. But when He got to the tree, it had leaves but no fruit, and it was a symbol of Israel, nothing but leaves, just religious pretense, and He pronounced curse on that fig tree and it died on the spot. It was a miracle in reverse. It was the only destructive miracle recorded in the New

Testament done by Jesus. This fig tree then was an illustration of Israel's barrenness. But here's another fig tree, in Mark 13 He said, "Now learn the parable from the fig tree. When its branch has already become tender and puts forth its leaves, you know the summer is near. Even so, you too when you see these things happening, recognize that He is near, right at the door." This sermon, given on the Mount of Olives during Passion Week on Wednesday night to His disciples alluding to His return, has not changed. I also want you to understand that the eschatology and what the Scripture says about the end times is not hard to understand. I don't think the Lord wrote His Word to make anything unclear whether it is about His second coming. That's why Revelation starts out by saying, "Blessed is the one who reads this and understands," having said that, we can't understand the second coming of Christ in its totality because it hasn't happened yet. So where the speculation comes in,

different denominations or branches of Christianity teach with some variations on the eschatology. What we can't know is the specificity of the fulfillment that has not happened yet. But the prophecies are very, very clear when it comes to the return of Christ. The culmination of human history occurs at the return of the Lord Jesus Christ to earth. When He comes back, it is time for the living and the dead. The believers who are alive when He comes will be ushered into His glorious Kingdom and the sinners who do not repent, into eternal damnation.

Though we do not often hear from the pulpit on the second coming of Christ, we are looking for that blessed hope and the glorious appearance of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ. We live in hope. The day of judgment should be more of our concern and worry than the price of gas or plowing snow or mowing the

lawn. And although He has said other things in these Gospels about His coming, the main teaching from the lips of Christ about His return is in this message given on Wednesday night of Passion Week, sitting on the Mount of Olives with His disciples as the sun is setting, looking back at the eastern gate, the Herodian temple and the city of Jerusalem. It's the final day that He teaches. It's the final day of public ministry. The next day He will stay in private and He will prepare for the Passover on Thursday night. Friday He is tried and crucified. Sunday He rises from the dead. Forty days later, after appearing only to believers, He ascends to heaven where He now sits, waiting to return. The second coming of our Lord. It is recorded in Matthew 24 and 25, Luke 21 and Mark 13. When the disciples hear all these from their master and they still are trying to figure it out, they pose the question in Mark 13:4, "Tell us, when will these things be, the things that have to do with judgment? And

what will be the sign when all these things are going to be fulfilled? What's the sign of final judgment on sinners? What's the sign of the final establishment of the Kingdom?" He said, "Look, before I come, the world will be characterized by religious deception, massive religious deception." Matthew, Mark and Luke all give us insight into this. It will secondly be characterized by massive disasters, wars, rumors of wars, which means hot wars, cold wars, earthquakes. And if you put them all together, famines, plagues, all kinds of natural disasters. A time of deception, disaster, distress and persecution of believers. Religious deception today proliferates maybe like it never has in the history of the world, natural disasters seem to be getting worse and worse. Believers have always been persecuted. They're being persecuted and even slaughtered around the world today.

Dear brothers and sisters, though all these things are happening now we cannot say anything about the date and time of His second coming. But we know this from the Gospel, that if the homeowner had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have left his house to be broken into. We also must be ready for the "Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour." The Lord Jesus expects us to vigilantly guard and protect the treasure He has given us in this present life. It is the treasure of His kingdom and the gifts and graces He has won for us - the gift of salvation purchased by the blood of Christ who died for us on the cross to free us from slavery to sin and Satan, and the gift of abundant new life which Christ won for us through His resurrection victory over death, and the gift of the Holy Spirit who comes to live in us and empower us with supernatural faith, hope, and love that endure forever. The Father and the Son come to dwell in us through the gift of the Holy Spirit who makes His home with us. But we can lose the treasure and gifts of God if we do not guard our hearts and minds and hold to the truth of God's Word and live according to His wise precepts, teaching, and just laws. The Second coming is not something you should be fearful of. "Don't let your heart be troubled, believe in God, believe in Me." Here's the good news, "In My Father's house are many

dwelling places, or rooms. If weren't so I would have told you, I go to prepare a place for you and if I go and prepare place for you, I'll come again and receive you to Myself that where I am, there you may be also." ≪
