#### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DERIVAN:

The scene of the gospel today is the Last Supper. The Lord Jesus had just observed the Passover with His apostles. But during that meal, He had done something so different, so strange, so wonderful. He had taken the bread of the Passover meal and said those sacred words, "This is my Body which will be given up for you." And He took the cup of wine, again the drink of the Passover, and said, "This is the chalice of my Blood which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." In that holy moment, the world was changed. The Lord Jesus gave His apostles and us His very self in Holy Communion. He gave us bread that is no longer Bread, wine that is no longer wine. He gave us His Body and Blood to be our spiritual food, to be our life. Since that Last Supper night two thousand years ago, the Church through her priests has followed Jesus' command, "Do this in memory of me." That happens in our church and in every church throughout the world. It happens every time we come to Sunday Mass and, for those who are able to come, to daily Mass. And it will keep on happening until the Lord comes again and brings us all home to His Kingdom.

But right after Our Lord gave us Holy Communion at the Last Supper, He gave us something else. He gave us a new commandment, "Love one another as I have loved you." In the very place where He gave us His Body and Blood, He gave us His new commandment, the commandment of loving one another. Our retired Pope Benedict XVI gave us a beautiful insight on these words of Our Lord. Pope Benedict wrote:

"Jesus speaks of a 'new commandment'. But what is new about it? In the Old Testament, God had already given the commandment of love; but this commandment has become new now because Jesus makes a very important addition to it: "As I have loved you, so you also must love one another". What is new is precisely this "loving as Jesus loved." All our loving is preceded by his love and refers to his love. It fits into his love and is achieved precisely through his love. Jesus gave himself to us as a model and source of love, a boundless, universal love. In giving us the new commandment, Jesus asks us to live his own love always."


To live the new commandment, to love as Jesus loved, even to loving us by dying on the Cross, is at times so very hard. Pope Benedict said, "Clearly, with our own strength alone we are weak and limited. In us there is always a resistance to love. However, the Lord promised us that he would be present in our lives, making us capable of this generous, total love that can overcome all obstacles, even those in our own hearts. If we are united to Christ, we can truly love in this way. Loving others as Jesus loved us is only possible with that power which is communicated to us in the relationship with him, especially in the Holy Eucharist."

Remember Jesus gave us the commandment of love just after He gave us the Holy Eucharist. It was as if He were saying, "I know it will be hard for you to love one another, so I will give you my very self to be your food and strength, to help you love one another as I have loved you."

We live in a world of great selfishness. We live in a world where people are tempted to think of self first and others last. That is not the way of Jesus. One reason why we come to Mass each week is to hear the voice of Jesus, the voice of the Good Shepherd, amid all the other voices that we hear in the world. Certainly another reason why the Church wants us to come to weekly Mass is so that we can have the strength of Holy Communion, to help us love one another as Jesus has loved us. We come here to be reminded that, amid all of the selfishness of the world, we are people of love and we are people of the Holy Eucharist. We come here to remember that the Eucharist and our loving on one another go hand in hand.

In a few weeks, on May 14th, many of our children will receive Our Lord in their First Holy Communion. Their parents and grandparents will smile with pride as these children receive Our Lord for the first time. Pray for them. Pray that they will always draw their strength form the Holy Eucharist. Pray that all of us will have the joy and the amazement of these little ones as they receive Holy Communion for the first time. And pray that Holy Communion will help us all, little children and all of us here, to obey the commandment, "Love one another as I have loved you."

#### APRIL 25 ST. PEDRO DE SAN JOSE BETANCUR (1626-1667)

Central America can claim its first saint with the canonization of Pedro de Betancur by Pope John Paul II in Guatemala City. Known as the "St. Francis of the Americas," Pedro de Betancur is the first saint to have worked and died in Guatemala.

Calling the new saint an "outstanding example" of Christian mercy, the Holy Father noted that St. Pedro practiced mercy "heroically with the lowliest and the most deprived." Speaking to the estimated 500,000 Guatemalans in attendance, the Holy Father spoke of the social ills that plague the country today and of the need for change.

"Let us think of the children and young people who are homeless or deprived of an education; of abandoned women with their many needs; of the hordes of social outcasts who live in the cities; of the victims of organized crime, of prostitution or of drugs; of the sick who are neglected and the elderly who live loneliness," he said in his homily during the three-hour liturgy.

Pedro very much wanted to become a priest, but God had other plans for the young man born into a poor family on Tenerife in the Canary Islands. Pedro was a shepherd until age 24, when he began to make his way to Guatemala, hoping to connect with a relative engaged in government service there. By the time he reached Havana, he was out of money. After working there to earn more, he got to Guatemala City the following year. When he arrived he was so destitute that he joined the bread line which the Franciscans had established.

Soon, Pedro enrolled in the local Jesuit college in hopes of studying for the priesthood. No matter how hard he tried, however, he could not master the material; he withdrew from school. In 1655 he joined the Secular Franciscan Order. Three years later he opened a hospital for the convalescent poor; a shelter for the homeless and a school for the poor soon followed. Not wanting to neglect the rich of Guatemala City, Pedro began walking through their part of town ringing a bell and inviting them to repent.

Other men came to share in Pedro's work. Soon they became the Bethlehemite Congregation, which went on to earn official papal approval after Pedro's death.

He is sometimes credited with originating the Christmas Eve posadas procession in which people representing Mary and Joseph seek a night's lodging from their neighbors. The Custom soon spread to Mexico and other Central American countries.



# THE STORY OF OUR LADY OF GOOD COUNSEL (SKODRA), PATRONESS OF ALBANIA

Devotion to the Mother of Good Counsel is associated with the story of a miraculous icon. The sacred image is found in a church in Genazzano, a beautiful town thirty miles south-east of Rome. The church dedicated to the Mother of Good Counsel was built there in the fourth century. In 1356 the church was given over to the Augustinians. Restoration started in 1467, when a widow, Petruccia, sold all her belongings to help finance the project. However, funds ran out before the task was completed.

That same year, all the residents of Genazzano heard a beautiful melody coming from heaven. As they looked up, they saw a white, shining cloud that descended on the church of the Mother of Good Counsel. The cloud gradually vanished, revealing a beautiful painting of Our Lady tenderly holding her Divine Son in her arms. Immediately, Mary began to cure the sick and grant countless graces.

The news spread throughout the country. Two Albanians from Scutari appeared in the town with a curious tale. They had fled from their homeland to escape the invading Turks. Before fleeing, they had stopped in the church and had seen how the icon of Our Lady, wrapped in a white cloud, lifted off the wall on which it had hung for two centuries. They followed the picture until they could see the towers of Rome, when it suddenly disappeared. The mysterious icon of Genezzano was identical to the one in the church in Scutari.

The amazing news reached Rome. Pope Paul II sent two bishops to investigate the story. The prelates reported that 171 miracles were recorded in the months following the icon's appearance. The pope's commission also found that there was an empty space on the church wall at Scutari. An icon that had been venerated there for centuries was, indeed, missing.

The image was painted on a sheet of plaster so thin that it would have been impossible for any human hand to remove it without damage. It had survived the subsequent centuries through the tumult of several earthquakes and withstood the bombing during World War II. Several altars were destroyed, walls caved in, and the roof was crushed. The icon, only yards away from the explosion, remained intact.

In 1753, Pope Benedict XIV established the Pious Union of Our Lady of Good Counsel to promote devotion to Mary under this title. Pope Leo XIII added the title Mother of Good Counsel to the Litany of Loreto. Pope Pius XIII dedicated his term of office to Our Lady of Good Counsel. And Pope John XXIII visited her shrine to pray for the success of the Second Vatican Council. Our Lady of Good Counsel is revered by Albanian Catholics as their special patroness under the title of Our Lady of Skodra. Her feast day is observed on April 26th.

The icon at Genazzano is about a foot wide and eighteen inches high. It depicts a mother figure that is half turned toward her son and half toward the viewer, reflecting Mary's concern for both Jesus and his Church.

If Our Blessed Mother is willing to ask her Son to work miracles to let us know of her motherly concern, Our Lady of Good Counsel is certainly willing to speak words of advice and instruction to help us over the hurdles of our daily lives.


