FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DERIVAN


“Conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ.” Those are the words St. Paul gives us in the reading of today’s Mass. St. Paul is telling us a basic truth about Christian life. Our faith is not displayed in words; our faith shows itself in Christian action. The way we conduct ourselves should demonstrate whether we are really living up to the way of Jesus. The way we conduct ourselves, Paul says, should be worthy of the gospel of Christ.

There is the old saying: actions speak louder than words. How true that is! The earliest statement about Christian action showing how real their faith was is found in the Acts of the Apostles. People who were not Christians said this, “See these Christians how they love one another.” Sometime ago our Holy Father Pope Francis visited Korea. While he was there, he spoke to the youth in that country, “Draw ever closer to God, and spend these years in building a holier, more missionary and humble Church, a Church which loves and worships God by seeking to serve the poor, the lonely, the infirm and the marginalized.” Since his election as Pope, Pope Francis has captured the love and attention of millions of people, Catholic and non-Catholic alike. And why? The beautiful thing about Pope Francis is that he gets to the point. He says what he believes simply and clearly and people respect that. In a world where there is too much talking, much of it simply useless, the Pope gets right to the heart of the matter. He said in Korea the same thing that St. Paul says in today’s reading. In effect, both Francis and Paul are saying this, “People should see your faith shown in action. It is not your words about faith that count; it is that you show your closeness to God by seeking to serve those who are suffering in any way.” Both Francis and Paul are echoing a statement made by the great St. Francis of Assisi, after whom our Pope took his papal name, “Preach the gospel by living our faith, by showing our love for God in our love for neighbor. That is real faith.”

This week we celebrate the feast of a saint who certainly conducted himself in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ. His name is St. Vincent de Paul and he is called the Apostle of Charity. He lived in France over three hundred and fifty years ago. He was ordained a priest and probably intended to live a simple, quiet life. But God had other plans. One day he was called to hear the confession of a poor man who was dying. This experience changed Father Vincent. He saw that God was calling him to put his faith into action particularly by serving the poor. And so he did for the rest of his life. His sincerity and genuineness touched so many people. They saw in him someone, like our own Pope Francis, who was real and therefore they were attracted to his message. Father Vincent had a great understanding, namely that God puts opportunities to serve Him and others right in our path. All we have to do is open our eyes to see them and open our hearts to do them. One cold morning he walked out of his rectory and found on the steps a basket. He opened the basket and found in it a little baby, crying for food. There was a note attached to the basket, “Father Vincent, please take care of my baby. I have no money to do so.” Father Vincent saw this as a message from God. He established an orphanage to help abandoned children. And this wonderful work would not have happened if St. Vincent had not opened his eyes to see Christ in that abandoned baby and opened his heart to help. Truly St. Vincent fulfilled St. Paul’s words, “conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ.”

The Lord’s message to us is clear. If we want to conduct ourselves in Jesus’ way, then we too must open our eyes to see the opportunities of serving others which God sets before us, even as he set that baby in Vincent’s way. For only if we open our eyes, only then can we open our hearts. May we all have the same grace that St. Vincent had, the grace to see whatever basket the Lord puts on the doorsteps of our eyes. For only then can we put our faith into action. Only then will we conduct ourselves in a way pleasing to Almighty God.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, Priest
September 27th—Patron of Charitable Societies

St. Vincent was born of poor parents in the Village of Pouy in Gascony, France, about 1580. He enjoyed his first schooling under the Franciscan Fathers at Acqs. Such had been his progress in four years that a gentleman chose him as a tutor for his children, and he was thus enabled to continue his studies without being a burden to his parents. In 1596, he went to the University of Toulouse for theological studies, and there he was ordained a priest in 1600.

In 1605, on a voyage by sea from Marseille to Narbonne, the Saint fell into the hands of African pirates and was carried as a slave to Tunis. After two years, he escaped and made a brief visit to Rome.

Returning to France, Vincent became tutor in the family of Emmanuel de Gondy, Count of Joigny, and general of the galleys of France. In 1617, he began to preach missions, and in 1625 he laid the foundations of a congregation that afterward became the Congregation of the Mission, or Lazarists, so named on account of the Priory of St. Lazarus, which the Fathers began to occupy in 1633.

It would be impossible to enumerate all the works of this servant of God. Charity was his predominant virtue. It extended to all classes of persons, from forsaken childhood to old age. The Sisters of Charity also owe the foundation of their congregation to St. Vincent.

In the midst of the most distracting occupations his soul was always intimately united with God. Though honored by the great ones of the world, he remained deeply rooted in humility. The Apostle of Charity, the immortal Vincent de Paul, breathed his last in Paris at the age of eighty, September 27, 1660. He was canonized in 1737 by Pope Clement XII.

Prayer God, You gave St. Vincent de Paul apostolic virtues for the salvation of the poor and the formation of the clergy. Grant that, endowed with the same spirit, we may love what he loved and act according to his teaching. Amen



HE SUMMONED AND SENT THEM

God's works are not regulated by our plans and wishes. We should be content with making the best of the few talents he has placed in our hands, and not distress ourselves about having more or greater ones. If we are faithful in that which is little, he will place us over that which is great. That, however, must come from him, and not be the result of our efforts. Let us leave it to him and curl ourselves up in our shells. The company (his religious order) began without any plan on our part. It has multiplied by God's guidance alone....Let us continue to act in the same way. Such abandonment will please God greatly, and we shall be at peace.

The spirit of the world is restless, and wishes to do everything. Let us leave it to itself. Let us have no desire to choose our own paths, but walk in those which God may be pleased to prescribe for us. Let us regard ourselves as unworthy that he should make use of us, or that others should think of us, and then all will be well with us. Let us offer ourselves to him to do and to suffer all things for his glory and the establishment of his Church. He asks for nothing else. If he desires results, they rest with him and not with us.

Let us courageously extend the confines of our heart and will in his presence, and let us not decide upon doing this thing or that until God has spoken. Let us implore him to grant us the grace to labor meanwhile to practice those virtues which our Lord practiced during his hidden life.

**STS. LAWRENCE RUIZ, Martyr,
AND HIS COMPANIONS, Martyrs
September 28**

From 1633 to 1637 sixteen Martyrs shed their blood out of love for Christ in the city of Nagasaki, Japan. They included members and associates of the Order of Preachers: nine priests, two religious, two virgins, and three laypeople, one of whom was Lawrence Ruiz, the father of a family from the Philippine Islands. All had, at different times and under varying circumstances, preached the Christian Faith in the Philippines, Formosa, and Japan. They manifested the universality of future missionaries and converts.

The list of these Martyrs is as follows: Dominic Ibanez de Erquicia, priest; James Kyuhei Gorobioye Tomonaga, priest; Luke Alonso, priest; Hyacinth Ansalone, priest; Thomas Hioji Rokuyzayemon Nishi, priest; Anthony Gonzalez, priest; William Courtet, priest; Michael de Aozaraza Shoyemon, religious; Matther Kohioye, religious; Madeline of Nagasaki, virgin; Marina of Omura, virgin; Lawrence Ruiz, husband and father; Michael Kurobioye, layman; and Lazarus of Kyoto, layman. They were canonized in 1987 by Pope John Paul II.

PRAYER God, in our service to You and to our neighbor grant us the invincible patience of the holy Martyrs Lawrence and his companions. For those who suffer persecution for justice' sake are blessed in the Kingdom of heaven. Amen

INFORMATION ON THE ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

The Mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

As we celebrate the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul this week, it is good to present some information on the Society named in his honor.

Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

As a reflection of the whole family of God, members, who are known as Vincentians, are drawn from every ethnic and cultural background, age group, and economic level. Vincentians are united in an international society of charity by their spirit of poverty, humility and sharing, which is nourished by prayer and reflection, mutually supportive gatherings and adherence to a basic Rule. Organized locally, Vincentians witness God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice. The Society collaborates with other people of good will in relieving need and addressing its causes, making no distinction in those served because, in them, Vincentians see the face of Christ.

The Society was active in St. Theresa Parish for many years, from 1931 up until the 1960's. It was revived in 2014 and now is affiliated with three other Bronx parishes, Our Lady of Angels, St. Barnabas and St. Frances de Chantal. Each parish group (or Conference) selects one of more charitable activities. Here at St. Theresa's, the Society operates the Food Pantry which assists needy persons on a monthly basis. The Society also joins with other Conferences in hosting children at the St. Vincent de Paul Camp in Putnam Valley during the month of July.

The national headquarters of the Society is in St. Louis, Missouri, where Cardinal Dolan is from. Cardinal Dolan is very supportive of the Society. His late father was active in the Society and his brothers continue that involvement.
