FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DERIVAN

Many times we have talked about the beautiful windows in our church. They are lessons in faith and we can learn a powerful message from each of them.

Many times I look at the window in the middle of the church. It is the window of Pentecost, the window that depicts what this feastday is all about, the window that depicts the scene we heard about in the first reading of the Mass, when fifty days after Easter, the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles and Our Blessed Mother under the form of wind and fire—wind to blow away their fears, fire to put them on fire with the zeal to preach the gospel of Jesus to the ends of the earth. That window is really a birthday picture, for Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. We can truly say that we are Christians today because of what happened in that room in Jerusalem two thousand years ago when the Holy Spirit made a frightened group of apostles into the most courageous missionaries the world has ever seen. Today is Pentecost, today is your birthday as members of the Church.

Just a few weeks ago fifty five of our young people received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation is another Pentecost, another coming of the Holy Spirit. Now the Holy Spirit did not fill this church on that Confirmation day as He filled the apostles' room with wind and fire. But nonetheless the Holy Spirit filled those youngsters' hearts with the same gifts that He gave to the apostles, His seven-fold gifts: wisdom and understanding, knowledge and counsel, piety and fear of the Lord. Notice I have left out one of the seven—and often for us it is the most important gift of all, the gift of fortitude, courage, bravery to help us face everything in life. Simply put, we need courage. We need courage to face the temptations of life, to face the secular values all around us, to face the temptations of drugs and alcohol and violence and the equally deadly temptation of selfishness and greed and indifference to others. We need courage if we are to live as Christians. And the Holy Spirit gives us that courage. All we have to do is use it. I tell the young people who are preparing for Confirmation that the seven gifts given by the Holy Spirit are like treasure chests placed in our souls. They are given to us, but we must open the treasure chest. We must use the Holy Spirit's gifts. They are there for the taking. We must have faith enough to let the Holy Spirit give us the fortitude that we need.

Let me tell you about a man who certainly used the Holy Spirit's gift of courage in his life. Archbishop Oscar Romero died on March 24, 1980. He was canonized by Pope Francis just three years ago. Archbishop Romero became Archbishop of El Salvador during a terrible time in that country's history when the Salvadoran government conducted a campaign of repression against the Catholic Church, imprisoning and killing priests, catechists and simple lay people whom the government accused of being enemies of the state. Archbishop Romero was an intellectual, well renowned as a scholar. When he was appointed as Archbishop, the government thought that this quiet man would remain quiet. But he did not. He became the apostle of human dignity, a towering figure who condemned the evil that he saw all around him and pleaded for justice and peace. This quiet man was filled with the Holy Spirit's courage. He condemned evil in his Sunday homilies which were broadcast throughout Central America and people clung to his words of faith and hope. He said, "Bloodshed and death touch the heart of God." People warned him to be quiet because he was risking his life. But he said, "As a pastor, I am obliged by divine command to give my life for those whom I love—all my people, even those who may assassinate me. If the threats should come to pass, I offer to God, from this very moment, my blood for the redemption and the resurrection of El Salvador. May my blood be the seed of freedom and the sign that hope will soon become a reality." On March 24, 1980, he was celebrating Mass. He had just said in his homily, "Let us be united in faith and love." And as he held up the sacred chalice with the Blood of Christ, Archbishop Romero was assassinated, a martyr for Christ. What Archbishop Romero had prayed for and fought for would become a reality when El Salvador once again became a free country, finally a land of peace. The Holy Spirit filled this saintly man with courage even to the point of giving his life for the Lord and His people.

Probably we will not be called to give our lives as Saint Oscar Romero was called to do. But we are all called to be people of courage, living our faith strongly and giving witness to others. Pope Francis reminds us, "As on that day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit is poured out constantly even today on the Church and on each one of us so we may step out of ourselves and communicate to the entire world the merciful love of the Lord. Communicating the merciful love of the Lord: this is our mission!"

Let us give thanks to God for our Pentecost birthday. But let us do more. Let us open our hearts more and more to the Holy Spirit and ask Him to strengthen us in our lives. He will. He never fails. *"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people and kindle in us the fire of your love."*

PENTECOST: BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH

Happy birthday to the Catholic Church! Happy birthday to you, who are the Body of the Church! We're all familiar with our own birthdays, and we celebrate them because they mark the day of the year in which we entered into this life. But did you know you have a second birthday?

Because you are part of the body of the Church, Pentecost is the Church's birthday, and yours as well. And like any birthday, it's a cause for celebration.

The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations.

Pentecost is also a Jewish holiday, which the Jews use to celebrate the end of Passover. Jews celebrate the gift of the law to Moses at Mt. Sinai on this day. But we, as Catholics celebrate the birth of our Church.

At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand one another.

Others who were not so blessed, accused those speaking in tongues of being drunk, but Peter arose and addressed the crowd, explaining that it was only 9 o'clock, and that this phenomenon was not intoxication, but rather this was the work of the Holy Spirit, prophesized in the scripture. Peter then called all those present to be baptized and about three thousand people were baptized that day.

On Pentecost the Holy Spirit manifested Himself under the forms of wind and fire: wind, to blow away the apostles' fears and fire, to put them on fire with the desire to preach the Gospel to every nation. After Pentecost, the apostles began their mission, following Jesus' words at His Ascension, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And behold I am with you always even to the end of time."

PENTECOST SUNDAY

MESSAGE OF OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS FOR THIS SUNDAY

The Time of Easter culminates in today's celebration of Pentecost, centered on the death and Resurrection of Jesus. This Solemnity inspires us to remember and relive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the other disciples gathered in prayer with the Virgin Mary in the Upper Room (cf. Acts 2:1-11). On that day the history of holy Christianity began, because the Holy Spirit is the source of holiness, which is not the privilege of the few, but the vocation of all.

Indeed, through Baptism, we are all called to participate in the same divine life of Christ and, with Confirmation, to become his witnesses in the world. "The Holy Spirit bestows holiness in abundance among God's holy and faithful people" (Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate*, n. 6). God "does not make men holy and save them merely as individuals, without bond or link between one another. Rather has it pleased Him to bring men together as one people, a people which acknowledges Him in truth and serves Him in holiness" (Dogmatic Constitution *Lumen Gentium*, 9).

Through the ancient prophets the Lord had already announced his plan to the people. Ezekiel: "I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to observe my ordinances. You ... shall be my people and I will be your God." The prophet Joel: "I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy.... Even upon the menservants and maidservants in those days, I will pour out my spirit.... All who call upon the name of the Lord shall be delivered (2:28, 29, 32). And all these prophesies are fulfilled in Jesus Christ, mediator and guarantor of the perennial outpouring of the Holy Spirit. And today is the celebration of the outpouring of the Spirit.

Since that day of Pentecost, and until the end of times, this holiness, the fullness of which is Christ, is bestowed upon all those who are open to the action of the Holy Spirit and strive to be docile to him. It is the Spirit who makes us feel complete joy. The Holy Spirit, by coming to us, overcomes aridity, opens hearts to hope, and spurs and fosters interior maturity in our relationship with God and neighbor. It is what Saint Paul tells us: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (Gal 5:22-23). The Spirit creates all this in us. For this reason today we celebrate this richness which the Father gives us.

Let us ask the Virgin Mary to obtain for the Church even today a renewed Pentecost, a renewed youthfulness that will give us the joy of living and witnessing to the Gospel and "to pour out upon us a fervent longing to be saints for God's greater glory" (*Gaudete et Exsultate*, n. 177).

MAY, MONTH OF MARY:

Traditionally May is observed as the month of Our Blessed Mother Mary. During these weeks of May, in our bulletin, we will present the stories of Our Blessed Mother's apparitions throughout the world.

Today we honor: OUR LADY OF KIBEHO (RWANDA, AFRICA)



Most Catholics are familiar with the Marian apparition sites in France, Portugal and Mexico. Yet, many are unaware of the Marian apparitions that took place in Kibeho, Rwanda between 1981 and 1989 to three children. Recognized by the Vatican in 2001, Our Lady of Kibeho is the only Marian apparition site approved by the Catholic Church on the Africa continent.

November 28 is the feast day of Our Lady of Kibeho, and as we commemorate the 30th anniversary of National Black Catholic History Month this November, it is a most opportune time to share the Blessed Mother's message to the world at a time when it needs it most.

At the time of her appearance, Kibeho was a peaceful town. The visitations took place 13 years before the brutal genocide of over one million people in Rwanda. The messages from Our Lady to the three young visionaries included a foreshadowing of the impending tragedy. However, her messages were not only for the people of Kibeho. Our Lady stated, "If I am coming here it does not mean that my message is only for Rwanda, nor just Africa, but for the entire world."

Her messages reminded us to pray the rosary daily. Furthermore, she requested that the visionaries reintroduce the Rosary of the Seven Sorrows of the Virgin Mary to the world. She promised that the recitation of this rosary in conjunction with (not in place of) the traditional rosary would result in forgiveness of our sins as well as the understanding of why we commit such sins, so we can avoid the snares of the devil and fill our hearts with the love of God.

Prayer to Our Lady of Kibeho

Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Word, Mother of all those who believe in Him and who welcome Him into their lives, we are here before you to contemplate you. We believe that you are among us, like a mother in the midst of her children, even though we do not see you with our bodily eyes.

We bless you, the sure way that leads us to Jesus the Savior, for all the favors which you endlessly pour out upon us, especially that, in your meekness, you were gracious enough to appear miraculously in Kibeho, just when our world needed it most.

Grant us always the light and strength necessary to accept, with all seriousness, your call to us to be converted, to repent, and to live according to your Son's Gospel. Teach us how to pray with sincerity, and to love one another as He loved us, so that, just as you have requested, we may always be beautiful flowers diffusing their pleasant fragrance everywhere and upon everyone.

Holy Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, teach us to understand the value of the cross in our lives, so that whatever is still lacking to the sufferings of Christ we may fill up in our own bodies for His mystical Body, which is the Church. And, when our pilgrimage on this earth comes to an end, may we live eternally with you in the kingdom of Heaven. Amen.

THIS MONDAY, FEAST OF MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH

In 2018, Pope Francis added a new feast to the Roman Calendar to be celebrated on the Monday after Pentecost: the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. This title of Our Lady goes back to the 4th century when St. Ambrose used it in honoring Our Blessed Mother. Pope St Paul VI proclaimed Mary Mother of the Church during the Second Vatican Council. Now this feast is extended to the whole Church.

This feast reminds us that Mary's role in the Church flows from her union with Christ and cannot be separated from it. She brought the Word made flesh into the world through her free cooperation. She provided Jesus with His human body. She was there as He grew. She was present at His first public miracle. She was there at the Passion and at the foot of the Cross, alongside the Redeemer. She was there when they laid Him in the tomb. She was there at His Resurrection, His Ascension, and was in the Upper Room with the Apostles at Pentecost.

She was the first and greatest disciple of Jesus Christ. She participated in the Redemption in the world. As a result, united so singularly with her Son, at the end of the course of her earthly life she was taken up, assumed, body and soul into Heaven.

By the grace of God, the Virgin Mary is our model of faith and charity. In the order of grace, she is the Mother of each and every person. She is our Advocate and Helper, pointing us always to her holy Son.

Aside from being the mother of every person, this connection is even more perfected in the baptized members of the Mystical Body of Christ. Through the life-giving waters of Baptism, we are entered into union with the Son of God and Son of Mary. And therefore, Mary's motherhood becomes more perfect in our lives. She is the Mother of the Church.


**MAY 25TH
SAINT MADELEINE-SOPHIE BARAT
Foundress († 1865)**

A native of Joigny, in the Burgundy region, Madeleine Sophie was a teenager in Paris at the height of the Revolution. The violence and chaos deepened the inclinations of her youth to find consolation in the Heart of Jesus, but also spurred her to action. Under the influence of her older brother, a priest, Madeleine met Father Joseph Varin d' Ainville, who drew her into the project of providing for the education of young women.

In 1800, Madeleine and two other women came together for this work in Amiens, the beginning of the Society of the Sacred Heart. Madeleine was made superior at twenty-three. As the order grew, Madeleine rose to the challenge, traveling widely to train and guide the sisters. She weathered more than one challenge to her leadership with patience, prudence, and tact.

Madeleine led the Society for sixty-three years. Jesus was the secret to her strength and endurance. She began each day begging, "Give me a heart that is one with your own." By the time of Madeleine's death, the Society of the Sacred Heart numbered 3,359 women in twelve countries devoted to this mission: "to instruct the young according to the exemplar of Christ and to propagate his worship, his love, and his glory."

Father in heaven, through the intercession of Saint Madeleine-Sophie Barat, grant me endurance.

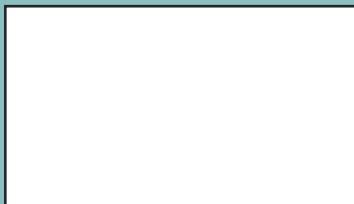



