
BAPTISMS

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER DERIVAN

The month of June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Our Lord. When we speak of the heart, we are speaking about our inner self. What is most dear to you? What is most important? When we say that a loved one is close to our heart, we mean that person is deep within us. Our love makes that person present, whether they are actually here or not. Some of the most beautiful letters I have read are letters from the loved ones of young men and women serving in the Armed Forces. There is no doubt that they are in each other's hearts. Their hearts are symbols of their love for each other. Even though they may be thousands of miles away from one another, their love warms their hearts.

And so it is with the Lord Jesus. This month is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Devotion to the Sacred Heart formally began when the Lord Himself revealed His Sacred Heart to Sister Margaret Mary Alocoque, now St. Margaret Mary, a Visitation sister who lived in her cloistered convent in France. Beginning in 1673 she was blessed with a series of appearances of Our Lord who asked her to promote devotion to His Sacred Heart. As she said, "He disclosed to me the marvels of his Love and the inexplicable secrets of his Sacred Heart." Our Lord asked her to ask people to make up for the offenses against His Sacred Heart. The offenses against His Heart meant offenses to His love. Our Lord told St. Margaret Mary that there were two kinds of offenses against His Sacred Heart—first, the sins committed by so many people, but then also another kind of offenses—being ungrateful to the love of Jesus Christ, the offense of ingratitude. He said, "Behold the Heart that has so loved men ...instead of gratitude I receive from the greater part (of mankind) only ingratitude." Many people have rejected His love through sin, but many more have rejected His love by just not caring, not being grateful to God for His goodness. We all know people who fit into both categories. The Lord wants us to be what He asked St. Margaret Mary to be, "disciples of His Sacred Heart," helping people to come to know the surpassing love of Jesus Christ, a love that He is ready to give everyone from His Sacred Heart.

As I mentioned June is the month of the Sacred Heart. Bring to the Heart of Jesus all of those who are important in your life. June is the month of weddings. Bring to the Heart of Jesus your prayers for married couples, especially couples here in our parish. May the love of His Heart strengthen their hearts as they face the challenges of marriage and family life. Let His love touch them. June is the month of graduations, like the graduation of our 8th Graders from our school and from other grammar schools, high schools and College. Bring to Jesus' Heart your prayers for these young people and all young people. You may not know them by name, but they need your prayers to help them to stay on the right path of life, to take what their parents and teachers have given them and to move on by their good efforts and the grace of God. And let me add June is the month of Flag Day, which we celebrate this week. Bring to the Heart of Jesus your prayers for the young men and women in the Armed Forces, especially those from our own parish. Pray that the love of Jesus from His Sacred Heart will strengthen them and protect them as they continue to serve our country proudly.

And bring yourself to the Heart of Jesus everyday. Do not neglect Him. Do not forget His love for you. Pope Francis says, "Remember that God loved us first: He is always waiting for us, welcoming us into His heart, into His love." Bring yourself to the Heart of Jesus every morning. This month is a special month for another reason. June is the month of the great St. Anthony of Padua, revered and loved by so many people throughout the world. Often when we see a statue of St. Anthony (as we have in our own church), he is depicted holding the Child Jesus. Another friar in his monastery said that once he saw the Child Jesus appearing to St. Anthony who held Him in his arms. That showed how close St. Anthony was to Jesus, how close he was to Jesus' Sacred Heart. May St. Anthony help us to come closer to the heart of Jesus. And may we always be able to say, "Lord, I am here. Your heart is open in love for me. Help me always to open my heart to you."

PADUA AND HOW ST. ANTHONY CHANGED IT

St. Anthony took a long and winding road to his eventual work that made Padua a changed city. After being raised in a wealthy family, Anthony's religious life began at the age of 15 as an Augustinian. But that was not what Anthony felt was his true calling, so he began life again as a follower of St. Francis of Assisi, even meeting the great saint in Assisi and becoming enamored by his humble lifestyle. After a short time in relative obscurity, Anthony's gifts of preaching and evangelization were noticed and he began preaching in many cities in Europe including Bologna, Montpellier, Toulouse and Limoges. He drew large crowds leading many to repent their sins. Anthony was recalled to Italy when St. Francis died in 1226.

A year later, in poor health, he settled in Padua where he exclusively preached and dedicated the remainder of his time to inviting all to embrace the Lord's mercy. Even without all his strength St. Anthony was a force. His preaching converted many and led to an amazing reconciliation of the town. Long-standing quarrels were amicably settled. Prisoners were forgiven and liberated. Thieves with ill-gotten goods were reconciled to honest ways and made restitution, often at his feet. These stories illustrate how much we all search for forgiveness, and for a path back to our merciful and gracious God.

Anthony's tireless work to spread the love of our Lord and reconciliation continued until his untimely death at the age of 36, June 13, 1231. Such grief followed in Padua and all who had followed him petitioned the Church to declare Anthony a saint. Shortly after, he was canonized and his reputation continued to grow.

We can imitate the spirit of St. Anthony even when we don't have his learning power or eloquence. We can seek reconciliation with God and neighbor. It will change not only us but our neighborhood as well. You can even celebrate his feast day, June 13, with some special act of reconciliation to honor his many favors to us all.

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

MESSAGE OF OUR HOLY FATHER POPE FRANCIS FOR THIS SUNDAY

In today's Gospel passage (cf. Mk 4:26-34), Jesus speaks to the crowd about the Kingdom of God and the dynamics of its growth, and he does so by recounting two brief parables. In the first parable (cf. vv. 26-29), the Kingdom of God is compared to the mysterious growth of the seed, which is cast upon the ground and then sprouts, grows and produces ears [of grain], independent of the care of the farmer who, when it is fully grown, sees to its harvest. This is the message that this parable conveys to us: through Jesus' teaching and action, the Kingdom of God is proclaimed, has burst into the field of the world and, like the seed, grows and develops by itself, through its own strength and according to humanly incomprehensible criteria. In its growth and development in history, it does not depend much on man's doing, but is above all an expression of the power and goodness of God, of the strength of the Holy Spirit who brings forth Christian life in the People of God.

At times history, with its events and its protagonists, seems to go in the opposite direction of the design of the heavenly Father, who wants justice, fraternity and peace for all his children. But we are called to live out these periods as seasons of trial, of hope and of vigilant expectation of the harvest. Indeed, yesterday like today, the Kingdom of God grows in the world in a mysterious way, in a surprising way, revealing the hidden power of the little seed, its victorious vitality. Within the folds of personal and social events which at times seem to signal the failure of hope, it is important to remain confident in God's subdued but powerful way of acting. For this reason, in moments of darkness and of difficulty we must not lose heart, but remain anchored in faithfulness to God, to his ever-saving presence. Remember this: God always saves. He is the Savior.

In the second parable (cf. vv. 30-32), Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed. It is a very small seed, yet it grows to become the greatest of all the plants in the garden: an unforeseeable, surprising growth. It is not easy for us to enter this logic of the unforeseeable nature of God and to accept it in our life. But today the Lord exhorts us to an attitude of faith which exceeds all our plans, our calculations, our predictions. God is always the God of surprises. The Lord always surprises us. It is an invitation to open ourselves more generously to God's plans, both on the personal level and on that of the community. In our communities it is important to pay attention to the little and big occasions of goodness that the Lord offers us, allowing ourselves to engage in his dynamics of love, of welcoming and of mercy toward others.

The authenticity of the Church's mission does not come through success nor through the gratification of the results, but by going forth with the courage of trust and the humility of abandonment to God. Going forth professing Jesus and with the power of the Holy Spirit. It is the awareness of being small and weak instruments which, in God's hands and with his grace, can accomplish great deeds, advancing his Kingdom which is "righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Rom 14:17). May the Virgin Mary help us to be simple, to be attentive, to cooperate with our faith and with our work to develop the Kingdom of God in hearts and in history.

Angelus Address, June 17, 2018

Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus by Pope Leo XIII

Most sweet Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us, as we humbly come before you. We are yours and yours we wish to be; but to be more surely united with you, behold each one of us freely consecrates himself today to your most Sacred heart. Many, indeed, have never known you, many too, despising your precepts, have rejected you. Have mercy on them all, most merciful Jesus, and draw them to your Sacred Heart. Be you king, O Lord, not only of the faithful who have never forsaken you, but also of the prodigal children who have abandoned you; grant that they may quickly return to their Father's house, lest they die of wretchedness and hunger. Be you king of those who are deceived by error or whom discord keeps aloof, and call them back to the harbor of truth and unity of faith, so that soon there may be but one flock and one shepherd. Grant, O Lord, to your Church, assurance of freedom and immunity from harm; give peace and order to all nations, and make the earth resound from pole to pole with one cry: Praise to the Divine Heart that wrought our salvation; to it be glory and honor forever.

JUNE 13 ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA Patron of lost items († 1231)

A Lisbon native, Anthony spent ten years in assiduous prayer and study as an Augustinian Canon until the day the relics of some martyred Franciscan missionaries were carried in procession through his city. Anthony promptly joined the Franciscans with hopes of imitating them. Illness interrupted his first mission trip, and having landed unexpectedly in Sicily upon his return, he made his way to Assisi. There, the humility of the flesh-and-blood Saint Francis, who was still living, deeply impressed him. He retired to the order's house in Forli and devoted himself to silence, solitude, and humble service.

Once, some Dominicans came to visit the friars, and it was discovered that no one had been assigned to preach. The task fell to Anthony. He began haltingly, but soon grew in power and command. By the end of his homily, it was evident that Anthony had a great gift. For the next ten years, until his death, Anthony preached with amazing success throughout Italy and France. Heresies were combatted, sinners were reconciled, and miracles abounded.

One miracle occurred after a novice ran away from the friary with Anthony's beloved book of psalms. Anthony prayed that the book would be returned. Upon coming to a river, the novice saw a startling vision on the other side that convinced him to return with the psalter.

Father in heaven, through the intercession of Saint Anthony of Padua, draw me into your embrace, that I might know your care over the smallest things.
