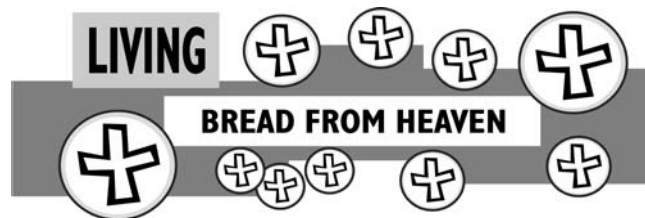

Papal Itinerary ~ Pope Francis will take part in eight public events in the City of Brotherly Love and Sisterly Affection.

Note that **registration is not required for the Papal Visit**. The Holy Father is expected to participate in the Festival of Families, which will be held on Saturday, September 26, and a Papal Mass celebrated on Sunday, September 27. Both of these events will be open to the public.

Saturday, September 26

Independence Hall: (Outdoor; Overlooking Independence Mall) "We Hold These Truths...." Address by Pope Francis; (Expected Themes: Religious Liberty and Immigration). 4:45 p.m. (Open to the public.)

The Benjamin Franklin Parkway:

The Festival of Families is an international celebration of family, community, and faith. Everyone is invited to join in this joyful, global celebration of support and love. During this event, high-level performers, both music and visual, will entertain and educate participants from around the world.

The culmination of the Festival will be a nationally broadcast main stage program of music and spectacular visual arts performances by world renowned artists. Pope Francis will celebrate with us during this time, both to enjoy the show and to listen to six families from different continents briefly describe their joys and challenges. The Holy Father will respond with compassion and words of wisdom for all of us, speaking to those present at the event (more than a million) as well as the additional millions participating through remote viewing. In addition to the main stage, there will be a second stage and exhibits. The second, smaller stage will feature performances throughout the day by many cultural groups, educational institutions, and spiritual organizations. 7:30 p.m. (Open to the public.)

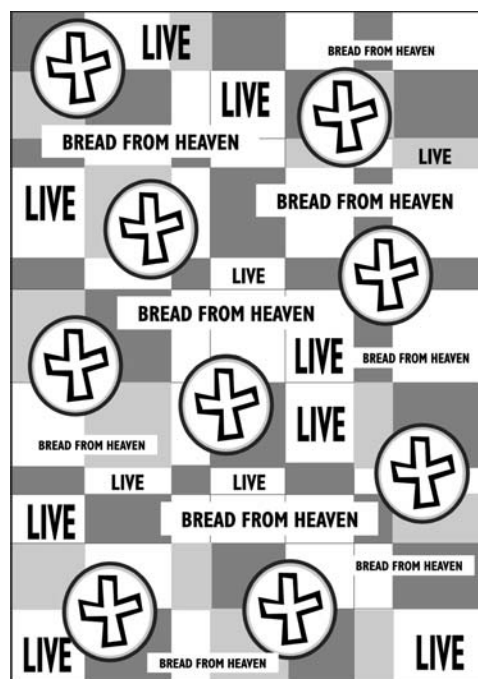
