The Mendham Borough Historical Society will meet on Tuesday, September 22, at 7:30 PM in the Garabrant Center, 4 Wilson Street, Borough. At 7:45 PM, Dr. Jude M. Pfister presents, "Acorn Hall and the Rise of the American Estate." The narrated, illustrated program follows the fate of Acorn's families and the issues that impacted the Hall's owners over the years. The 1840s American estate concept coincided with the site's first home, before it was transformed into Acorn Hall with those concepts in mind. The last full-time resident of the Hall - who was she, what was her contribution, did she succeed, what is her legacy? These questions will be among those explored in the spirit of preservation in general, but particularly regarding Acorn Hall, a local piece of history. Dr. Pfister is Chief of Cultural Resources, Morristown National Historical Park, overseeing the museum, archival and library programs. A historian by training and impacting many of our most important US historic sites, his recent book, "Morris County's Acorn Hall" (May 2015) will be followed by one on the Federalist Papers. The public is invited; parking/program are free.
