## **Ministry to Life**

The Right to Life is Fundamental ~ In the Preamble to the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson made it very clear that all human beings "are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights." Chief and first among those he enumerated was the Right to Life.

Jefferson and our founding fathers knew that without the right to life, no other rights are possible. How can one have the right to vote or the right to free speech, for example, if one does not firstly have the right to exist?

The rights mentioned in the Declaration are no less valid than those articulated in our Constitution. In fact, they are foundational to all the rights and protections which the Constitution guarantees. This applies especially to the right to life, which is not only paramount but is also

clearly protected under the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment by due process of law.

We need to impress upon our children the importance of these two documents and how they already guarantee every American, born or unborn, weak or strong, the blessings of Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness.

# Registration for the 2016-17 Religious Education Program

If you are <u>new</u> to the parish or just moved into town and have not registered your children for **grades K-10**, please contact the Director of

Religious Education, Annette Tracy at 973-543-5950, ext. 13. The Registration Form is available on the parish website at: <a href="https://www.stjoesmendham.org">www.stjoesmendham.org</a>.

Reminder to all families returning to Religious Ed ~ the DEADLINE for all paperwork was July 1. The student fee is now \$55 per child. During the month of AUGUST, letters will be mailed to every family enrolled in the program with the final class schedule.

#### **Tuition**

To operate the Religious Education program effectively and as a self-sustaining program, parents are asked to pay tuition. A schedule of tuition is set by the REFC Board as follows:

**Family Fee** ~ Each family will be asked to pay \$200 each year.

**Student Fee** ~ Grades K – 10, \$55 per child after July 2.

(Early Registration through July 1, was \$30 per child.)

**Sacramental Fee** ~ Students enrolled in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and 10<sup>th</sup> grade pay a \$50 **Sacramental Fee**, in addition to the Family Fee and Student Fee.

**Discount** ~ The Family Fee portion of the tuition (\$200) will be waived for parents who offer to teach class. If two volunteers share the teaching of a class, then each will receive a 50% discount (\$100).

Family Promise of Morris County, Inc. is a non-sectarian, not-for-profit organization dedicated to ending the crisis of homelessness faced by Morris County families by partnering with other public and private agencies, religious congregations and community volunteers to provide shelter, case management mentoring services leading to self-sufficiency. Family Promise currently partners with more than 75 congregations of different faiths and 1,600 of their congregants to provide shelter, overnight staffing, dinner and breakfast to our families. The dedication and commitment of all these partners makes Family Promise the most

cost-effective local shelter program in the community. Volunteers and their families open their congregations, schedules, wallets, and their hearts to them. In addition, they allow the families to stay as long as needed to get back on their feet - for some families, it may be a couple of weeks; for others, it may be a year. Many traditional shelters have a time limit which means families often have to find other shelter before thev have temporary accumulated enough resources or completed necessary schooling to enable them to successfully move on to independent housing. Family Promise maintains a Day Center and office in Parsippany.
