

#### **Registration for Religious Education**

Registration begins May 1. This program is for parishioners of St. Joseph Church. There will be a discount for registering by July 1 - (the discounted rate is reflected on the form). Be aware that the student fee will increase an additional \$25 per child after July 1. Universal Registration forms are located on the parish website.

Your prompt registration for religion class is very important, as it will help us to address class size, day preference, teacher recruitment, discounts for textbooks, etc. You will be notified of your child's class placement and schedule over of the summer. All classes are scheduled to begin in September.
