

# FREQUENT CONFESSION

Pope Pius XII, in his encyclical *On the Mystical Body of Christ*, paragraph 88, highly endorses the pious practice of frequent confession [at least monthly] in order "to ensure more rapid progress day by day in the path of virtue." He says that this practice "was introduced into the Church by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit"!



## BENEFITS OF FREQUENT CONFESSION

The pope then proceeds to list eight benefits that come from frequent confession:

1. Genuine self-knowledge is increased.
2. Christian humility grows.
3. Bad habits are corrected.
4. Spiritual neglect and tepidity are resisted.
5. The conscience is purified.
6. The will is strengthened.
7. A salutary self-control is attained.
8. Grace is increased in virtue of the sacrament itself.

## SEEKING HOLINESS

### FREQUENT CONFSSION

**CCC 1458** Without being strictly necessary, confession of everyday faults (venial sins) is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church. Indeed the regular confession of our venial sins helps us form our conscience, fight against evil tendencies, let ourselves be healed by Christ and progress in the life of the Spirit. By receiving more frequently through this sacrament the gift of the Father's mercy, we are spurred to be merciful as he is merciful:

"Whoever confesses his sins . . . is already working with God. God indicts your sins; if you also indict them, you are joined with God. Man and sinner are, so to speak, two realities: when you hear 'man' - this is what God has made; when you hear 'sinner' - this is what man himself has made. Destroy what you have made, so that God may save what he has made. . . . When you begin to abhor what you have made, it is then that your good works are beginning, since you are accusing yourself of your evil works. the beginning of good works is the confession of evil works. You do the truth and come to the light." (St. Augustine)
