This weekend we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as óGaudette Sunday.ô Pronounced óGow-day-tayô this Latin words mean óto rejoice!ô On this Third Sunday of Advent the pink candle is lit to remind us the light, THE LIGHT, Jesus is on the way. It is as if the Church is a little child who simply cannot wait for Christmas to come! We take a sneak peak at the gift coming our wayê Jesus our Savior! But, in the end, we put the tape back on the gift and wait for two more weeks before the gift is ours!

We have one remaining óDay of Graceô set for next Saturday, December 20th. A priest will be in the Reconciliation Room at the top of each hour from 9am to 4pm that day. Take the time to make this part of your Christmas celebration by preparing a place in your heart, not just under your tree, for Jesus. Jesus is waiting for you in that sacred room of mercy!

Plan ahead for celebrating Christmas as a parishê the Mass schedule includes three Masses on Christmas Eve: 4pm, 6:30pm and 10pm. Please remember how full the 4pm will be so consider that fact as you plan. Seats are not able to be reserved by sending someone early to óclaimô a pewê come as a family and the ushers will do their best to help you find seating together all at one time. There is more room at the 6:30 and 10pm Masses. Christmas Day Mass is at 10am and although the Church is full, there is usually some chairs still open in the parish hall.

You hopefully noticed the information in last week's bulletin (and it is in again this week) explaining the coming óALPHAô program being introduced at the Newman Center next semester. Training is now underway for students from the Newman and members of our parish who will be leading the program. Students at BSU and NTC will be invited to come to a series of evenings where we will discuss the basic aspects of our faith. The hope is to bring back those who have wandered away and to reach out to those who have never had a Christian background. Please keep this program in your prayers!

Speaking of the Newman, please note there will not be Mass at the Newman over the Christmas break at BSU/NTC. So, the last Mass of this semester is this weekend, December 14th, and the first Mass of the next semester is Sunday, January 11th at 7pm.

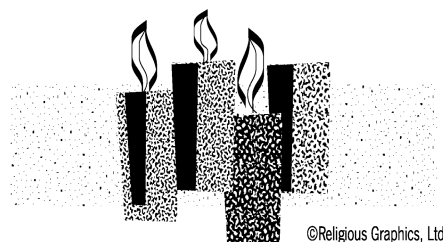

SINCE YOU ASKED...

At the recent *Family Faith Night* held here, there were so many faith questions for Fr. Chuck & Fr. Don, and not enough time to answer them all. All of your questions were worthy of an answer, so they have kept the questions, and will answer them in this column every week:

This week's question is answered by Fr. Don.

Why aren't women ordained in the Catholic Church?

Among the most vocal controversies in the Catholic Church has been the question of the ordination of women. As more Protestant denominations have begun ordaining women, the Catholic Church's teaching on the all-male priesthood has come under attack, with some claiming that the ordination of women is simply a matter of justice, and the lack of such ordination is proof that the Catholic Church does not value women.

First, something we will not know until we get to heaven is why were there no women present at the Last Supper when Jesus gave the Church the Priesthood? Some say it was the culture of the time and women were treated as second class citizens. Yet, Jesus held up and restored the dignity of women in his every action. When he sat with the Samaritan woman at the well, his disciples were scandalized, but Jesus sat with her and changed her life. Jesus was great friends with the sisters of Lazarus, Martha and Mary. He stayed in their home whenever he visited Jerusalem and even though they were just ten minutes away from the site of the Last Supper they were not there. The examples of how Jesus upheld the dignity of women are numerous; yet, no women (not even his mother, the first disciple) were present for ordination. As I said, we do not know why women were not present but it is clear the Lord was deliberate in his planning.

Second, the priest stands in the place of Christ when celebrating the Sacraments. Jesus was a man and so the physical resemblance to Christ, as a man, is valued. This flies in the face of the American culture which sees this, as I said earlier, as a justice issue. The Catholic Church believes strongly that men and women, by their natures, are suited to different, yet complementary, roles and functions. The ordination issue is not to be a matter of who has power, but how are we to serve Christ as he intended while remaining faithful to our nature as men and women.

Finally, even if we disregard the differences between the sexes, we have to face the fact that the ordination of men is an unbroken tradition that goes directly back to Jesus Christ himself. This is how Christ intends it to be and because of that it will not change.

ALPHA IS Coming to the Newman Center!

Alpha is a practical tool inspiring Catholic renewal by answering the call to the New Evangelization. Alpha is proven to awaken faith in lapsed Catholics, those on the fringe of parish life and those outside the Church. It gives faithful Catholics a path and a language to fulfill their baptismal call to evangelize.

Alpha is running in parishes all over the world, in every faith tradition, in workplace settings, prisons, homes, any place where people gather. Alpha has been customized to speak to certain groups of people like youth and college students. In the different contexts which Alpha is offered the focus remains evangelistic in nature and centered on the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Alpha creates an environment and opportunity for an encounter with Jesus, offering as Pope Francis likes to say, the chance for "Jesus to find them." Alpha is an invitation to "drop your nets" and become an intentional follower of Jesus.

Members of the St. Philip's Evangelization Committee are working with Fr. Don at the Newman Center to coordinate our first attempt at ALPHA locally. Fr. Chuck has used the program effectively in previous parishes and is encouraging its use here, starting with the Newman and the students there.

Training of those in leadership positions in the program will be completed in another week. When the students at BSU and NTC return in January, over 2,000 will be invited to participate by other students. The weekly gatherings begin later in January.
