2nd Sunday Ordinary Time Greetings,

On January 18th when the 11:00 Mass is over and I have baptized little Audrey Moran I will be leaving for my annual priest retreat. I ask you to pray for me as I spend the week seeking God and talking with Him. I intend to tell Him about our parishes, our experiences and ask Him for help in discerning how we can become a stronger community of faith. One of the themes I will study and discuss with my spiritual director is Goal #4 from the Pastoral Letter by Bishop Hoepfner. Goal #4 states: Create vibrant parishes that are centers of worship, word and witness and whose unity with the other parishes of the Diocese is expressed in our common public acts of faith.

One aspect I am already thinking and praying about is how we as a community pass on the faith. It is through the whole life of the community that catechesis occurs. Whether our Faith Formation is strong or weak, catechesis is affected by and facilitated through the life of the community. If the life of the community is vibrant, and strongly rooted in faith, our catechetical programs will yield positive outcomes.

It is also the community of the home that catechizes. Many have heard the statement: "Parents are the primary educators in the faith" (GDC #255). This is simply fact. For good or ill, for positive or negative, parents have the first and most faith influence on their children. As your Pastor I am of the belief that we need to spend more time, energy, and resources on helping our adults, and parents, who actually can influence faith formation in those they live with and around. The best thing we as a parish can do for our Faith Formation program is to become an authentic community of faith.

We need to bring all the generations together, leading them through a deliberate, well-conceived and organized plan, and watch the faith learning grow. A positive outcome is that when the whole community learns the same thing at the same time, then it strengthens the sacred nature of the whole community.

Here is a gem I found a few years ago – food for thought

If God brings you to it, He will bring you through it.

Happy moments, praise God.

Difficult moments, seek God.

Quiet moments, worship God.

Painful moments, trust God.

Every moment, thank God.

Have a blessed week – pray for me that I may encounter Jesus during my retreat. Here is a little homework for you, tell someone this week: "I love you because" – Or tell 3 people "Jesus loves you" – Or tell someone something you like about another person – God is Good – Have I told you lately? "Jesus loves you and so do I"
