Happy 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time,

In his homily this past weekend Fr. Chuck talked about how God is calling each and every one of us daily, and how it is good for us to be rubbing shoulders with Jesus. We also heard from four of our fellow parishioners, one at each of the four Masses, talking about their experience of Koinonia. Thank you to Betty Lindy, Brad Arel, Mike Headlee, and Stephanie Glen for sharing and for inviting your fellow members of St. Philip's to register for the upcoming Koinonia retreat.

Brad shared how God had spoken to his wife Monica during their weekend about an important decision in their life and Mike shared that because of his Koinonia experience he has become a better father, husband, son, brother, doctor and member of St. Philips. He also said that because of the Koinonia he has become closer to Jesus. Come and rub shoulders with Jesus and see what it does for you. I would also like to encourage each of you to prayerfully consider joining us. Investing 48 hours of your life in this retreat could be one of the best decisions you will ever make. Koinonia is for men and women of all ages, married or single. If you are married, it is OK to come with your spouse or alone. Koinonia is not a couples retreat, but is nice to share with your spouse.

The retreat will begin with dinner at 5:00 PM on Friday, Feb. 6th and will end with dinner at about 5:00 PM on Sunday the 8th. You get to go home each night and sleep in your own bed. Seven delicious meals and all the supplies are provided for the minimal cost of \$30. If fee does not fit into your budget, just let me know.

There will be talks given on Sacred Scripture, the Paschal Mystery, God is Love, Christian Living, Signs & Sacraments, Prayer and Call to Holiness. We will have time for sharing and discussion about the talks, as well as other activities that will bring us closer to Jesus and to each other. We will also celebrate Mass together!

I challenge you to invest \$30 and 48 hours of your time in your relationship with Jesus. If you come and participate in the weekend and on Sunday evening you are not really happy that you came, I will personally refund your \$30. I have yet to have anyone ask for their money back.

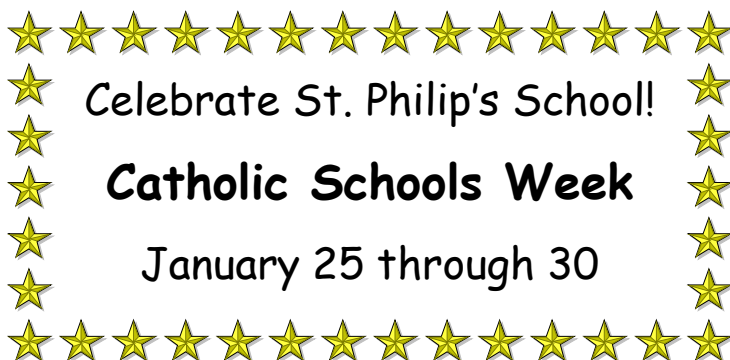
