As we ómarchô through March and the Lenten Season, donã let these days slip by without taking time to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Our parish penance service (with several priests from the area coming to join us for individual confessions) is set for Monday, March 16th at 6:30pm. Other times when a priest will be available in the Reconciliation Room include Fridays at 6pm, Saturdays (except April 4th) at 4:30 and 6:30pm. And on Sunday mornings after the 7:30 and 9am Masses. Even if you have not celebrated the Sacrament in years, treat yourself to ócoming homeô to the Sacrament and rest in the compassion, mercy and forgiveness of Jesus Christ!

Stations of the Cross are prayed at 2:30 and 6:30pm on Friday, March 14, 20 and 27 preceded each week with confessions, as mentioned above, at 6pm.

Mark your calendars for the celebrations of Holy Week! Thursday, April 2nd at 7pm. Good Friday, April 3rd, has two services at 3pm and 6:30pm. Easter Vigil Mass is Saturday night, April 4th at 8:30pm (when the sun sets). Easter Sunday Masses are the usual 7:30, 9 and 11.

These are responses from fellow parishioners here at St Philip's.

#7

I enjoy attending daily Mass because I find it a great way to start the day. Hearing the word of God and receiving the Eucharist is powerful and helps me through the day. I rely on the strength I get from attending mass especially with challenging situations through out the day. I feel fortunate to be able to participate in Mass and feel blessed to have the opportunity be reminded of keeping God first in my day.

One reason I attend Mass daily is, very simply, because I can. I do not take that for granted because that has not always been possible for me and I know it is not for many others. I remember hearing it said that if we really mean what we say about putting God first in our lives we would prioritize our time to reflect that truth and that would include attending Mass on every day that we possibly could. I come to be transformed daily and I come for those who cannot come. I am aware that someday the truth of the scripture that speaks of “when you are old they will lead you where you do not want to go” is a day that will come for each of us. When that day comes I will have to wait patiently for My Lord to be brought to me. For as long as I am able though I will come to Mass every day so I can experience His healing; be taught and inspired by His Word and teaching; receive every grace He has available to me; adore Him; praise Him; worship Him; thank Him for the amazing generosity and mercy He has shown toward me; lift to Him in prayer all those I love and every soul in need; glimpse heaven; and be fed and transformed through the gift of the body, blood, soul and divinity of my Savior truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar – the Eucharist.

I attend mass to ground myself; remind myself that this life is much bigger than me. Mass and other participants is a way for me to physically see that I am not alone in falling short for Christ and yet I am still part of something much more profound. I come to hear the stories and hopefully hear God's voice, although my human ears often are deafened by the chaos of life. I come to take in the body and blood of Christ, although I often allow myself to be distracted. I come to know that God loves me despite these imperfections, is ever present, and has such a bigger and better plan for me than I could ever imagine. I look forward to starting to follow God's path much more devoutly...sometimes giving up control is the hardest part but that's ironically when you can feel the greatest freedom.

I attend for daily guidance. Not only spiritually but emotionally and physically. I like to be in the presence of God. I like the way I feel when I am there and I like to see my community whom I share prayer with. I feel safe and actually feel the warmth of God's presence there. I practice/participate going to Mass for my family/children...to

let them know that at any time, any place, any church in the world they attend, they are being heard and loved by God and their family, community. And that God is a forgiving God and a loving God. And he will not judge you on anything. And by going to Mass, it not only shows that I am a true Christian, but I do believe in our heavenly Father in all his creations.

#11

I attend daily mass because it grounds me and gives me peace. My days go more smoothly when I attend mass regardless of what may be in store for me. Jeff Cavins explained that when we share in the Eucharist at mass we have access to the Tree of Life. I have found that in listening to the readings and the homily, I receive the answer or confirmation to a problem or situation. I enjoy seeing the other “regulars” at mass and am thankful that I get to share in the gift of mass with them.

Starting my day out with Jesus gives me a good feeling, and by my example it will teach my grandchildren and hope that they follow in my footsteps. I also pray for my family and deceased family and friends every day.

I attend Mass so that I will grow in my relationship with Christ, and in holiness, but mostly so that I may partake momentarily in Heaven. That keeps me with my eyes and heart pointed and focused to heaven and not on this world.

Going to Mass helps put my day into perspective. I am reminded of where my focus is to be regardless of how the day unfolds. I have found I accomplish more with greater peace. Why? See Phil 4:13.

Because this is where the Eucharist is! Like Peter said “Where else would I go?”

I come to Mass to become closer to God. I do this by joining in the Mass prayers. Holy Communion is the best way to become close to Him. I attend Mass to become a better person and to become what Jesus wants me to be. Attending Mass is one of the best ways to pray for the needs of other people. I become part of the family of God both on earth and in heaven.

I attend daily Mass because it is that special time to be with “Abba” My Father, My best friend. It is also a chance to be with the Body of Christ Believers.
