21st Sunday in Ordinary Time Greetings,

This is the second of 5 articles regarding our parish and long range planning. Last week in the bulletin were comments discussing the when, where, and how of the process for long range planning. Questions to contemplate were given. This week our article is dedicated to some of the aspects of our physical campus. As we begin the process of planning we are reminded that to work the best, our long-range planning needs to be faith-based and orientated towards the Gospel message of Jesus. At the September meetings we will discuss old needs and possibly discover some new needs of our parish and community.

St Philips has an impressive campus. As a vibrant active parish there has been a continuous improvement in the facility with the church construction in 1990 and the office/gym complex being completed in 2000. Time moves forward and there are new needs as systems change and wear out.

Here is a task for us to consider as we prepare for discussion: Can you take the time to walk through our campus using the eyes of a visitor. As a visitor do you see signs of us being a welcoming hospitable parish? Does the campus look clean, fresh, organized, and in good repair? Can you find information and locations easily? Are our entry, narthex and worship spaces inviting a visitor into the liturgical celebrations of the church or are they distracting in some manner? What is your opinion for example on carpets are they to be replaced when they ugly out or only when they wear out? Do we have adequate restroom facilities?

Having taken a walk through the campus as a visitor it is now time to switch hats and walk through as a regular member of our parish family. School starts soon. Now would be a good time to make a special trip here and walk the halls of the school: looking for the school office, and ease of movement in the building. Do we have adequate space if the projected growth in school population happens? Discover the back hallway and see how many rooms we have and maybe asking a staff member about the groups that use some of the rooms on a consistent basis. Thinking about the many groups and organizations that use our facilities: do we have adequate space? Are the rooms that are used adequately furnished and comfortable for the intended use? Do you see the parish campus as fully handicap accessible? Are we able to provide adequate security?

Here a couple statistics that may help when we consider the usage of the parish campus. We have 209 more attendees at summer masses than at fall/winter masses. Easter and Christmas bring us 1,100 more guests than the other weekends of the year. Baptisms 1990ñ57, 2000ñ49, 2010ñ30, 2015ñ46 First Eucharist: 1990ñ 57, 2000 ñ 43, 2010ñ47, 2015ñ 55 Confirmations: 1990ñ 40, 2000ñ64, 2010ñ52, 2015ñ44 Marriages: 1990 ñ17, 2000 ñ19, 2010ñ 17, 2015ñ16 Funerals: 1990ñ22, 2000ñ32, 2010ñ20, 2015ñ43 (Just a side note on the funerals I am sure it is not just because I am here the number has taken such a steep jump)

Our school enrollment is a constant 4.2% of the public school enrollment. If they are expected to grow it is reasonable to assume we will also. Our faith formation numbers are amazingly constant year after year. The numbers change but only by few students each year.

I would like to close similar to last week: Our future looks good, we have gifted people, we have a community spirit of worship, we have a faith formation program that is second to none, and our school is a strong healthy presence. What we need is your commitment to pray about and to bring your ideas to the long range planning meeting. More information to follow in next week's bulletin Lord help us be Holy, Happy, and Healthy, as a parish, as individuals, as families. Jesus loves you and so do I Fr Chuck

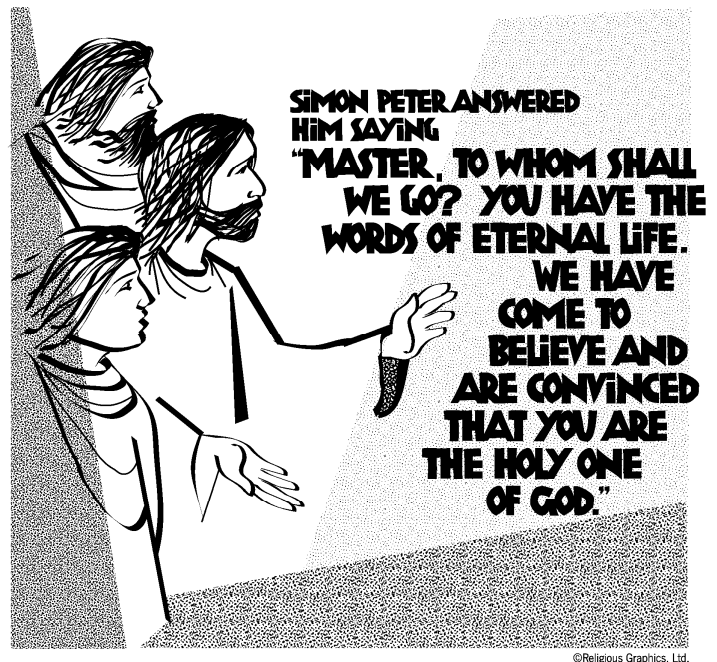

2014 MINNESOTA ABORTION STATISTICS REPORTED

Abortions at Planned Parenthood of Minnesota (PPM) increased by 611 over 2013, leading to a statewide increase of abortions according to a just-released report by the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH). This is the first statewide increase in abortion in Minnesota since 2007.
