32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Greetings,

November 6, 2016

Placed next to the Baptismal font is a white binder with the names of those who have gone before us. Baptismal waters promise us eternal life so we call the book *óThe Book of the Livingó*. Please take time to record the names of your deceased relatives and friends, no matter when they passed away. In this last year we have had many funerals. The deceased were of all age ranges. I was meditating about how we really do not know when we will be called to see Jesus and provide an accounting of our lives. Our death may be years away and it might be in this hour! As I write this I am remembering a Godchild, Mikey. He died this Wednesday morning. As a young boy he and his siblings spent many hours in our home in the daycare Valerie operated. His death was unexpected.

In our life journey we learn of love through our connectedness to family and friends. Some had a full life with many gathered around them. Some infants did not even get to feel the hands of those who loved them, yet in their short lives in the womb many came to love them and anticipated their arrival. Love is present in all lives. Where love is, God is found. We can learn so much from those who have gone before us... we just need to listen! We just need to be quiet and meditate on the joys, light and example they bring.

When someone dies there is the pain of separation: knowing we will not be able to hold them, we will not be able to hear their physical voice. This separation makes this quote from Gabriel Garcia Marquez seem even more important: *"Always say what you feel, and do what you think is good and right. If I knew that today would be the last time I'd see you, I would hug you tight and pray the Lord be the keeper of your soul. If I knew that this would be the last time you pass through this door, I'd embrace you, kiss you, and call you back for one more. If I knew that this would be the last time I would hear your voice, I'd take hold of each word to be able to hear it over and over again. If I knew this is the last time I see you, I'd tell you I love you, and would not just assume foolishly you know it already."*

M. Scott Peck, "A Different Drum" provides us with a similar thought: *"How strange that we should ordinarily feel compelled to hide our wounds when we are all wounded! Community requires the ability to expose our wounds and weaknesses to our fellow creatures. It also requires the ability to be affected by the wounds of others... But even more important is the love that arises among us when we share, both ways, our woundedness."*

We live in a wounded society. We all have things we are not proud of having done or said. Some have the wounds of pain that is masked by cover-ups such as drugs or alcohol. When we rally together, when we support each other, when we are willing to say: I do not know what to say! but I am here for you, I love you and support you. Then there is a sharing of the sorrow, a sharing of the hurt. A hurt shared is a hurt lessened since we do not carry it alone. That is what Jesus calls His disciples to do help one another through the good times but especially the wounded times.

Here is the challenge: don't just assume others know how you feel! Be honest and share your joys, your wounds, and your love for others. Jesus Loves you and so do I.

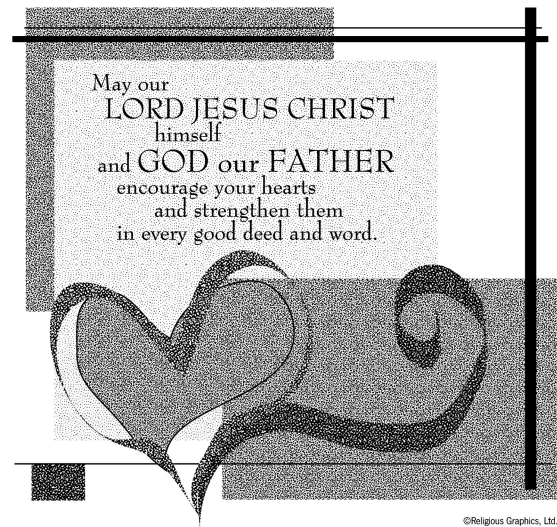

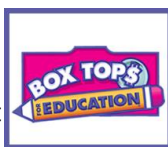
