Greetings on the Feast of Mary Mother of God,

Happy New Year!

During Advent we used 1440 marbles to represent a new day, a day that was refreshed by God and given to us to utilize as we wish. We can think of the New Year as 365 óBIGô marbles that are new and fresh for us. We call the collection of 365 marbles ó2017ô. The New Year is a new start, a new beginning, an opportunity to make a difference.

In our weekly discussions both Father Don and I agreed we would like to try something new in 2017. A tradition in the Catholic Church is for people to celebrate 9 consecutive First Fridays and/or five consecutive First Saturdays. There are special benefits granted to those who are able to fulfill the First Friday or First Saturday requirements. On the first Saturday of every month, starting with Saturday, January 7 we are going to offer Mass at 8:30AM followed by a one hour class on different subjects. The topic for the very first class will be explaining First Friday and First Saturday: how they work and the requirements. Coffee and donuts are served.

Think for a moment about Mary Mother of God: a woman who was conceived without sin but was also a human being with normal worries, doubts and struggles. Remember her decision to say yes came after God invited her to join him, to follow his will, to create with him. Just like God did for her He does for us: God invites us to join him, to follow his will, to create with him. But the decision is always up to us. With our own óyesô to God's voice in our lives we are also asked to nurture the word of God within us and bring Christ into the world.

Here is something else to consider; after Mary said yes, the angel left. After these encounters with God we are left alone to carry out what we are asked to do. Frequently it seems very lonely. That's faith: we are asked to trust that what God has told us is to be trusted. He trusts us to do it.

Mary along with Joseph was entrusted with the Holy Family. The devil has his eye on your family and would like to cause chaos. Use the grace of God to keep the devil from your doorstep. Bless your children daily. Hold each other in prayer and treat each other with dignity. Talk in a civil manner to each other and say please and thank you. It is with the family that either of my favorite expressions can be used: I love you becauseë or I prayed for you today, and I asked God toë

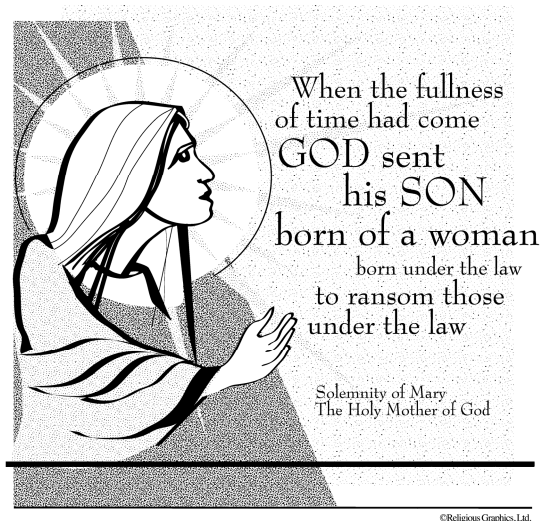

Adoration Etiquette

Following the opening of adoration guidelines: Jesus is placed in the monstrance at the beginning of the time for adoration. When we enter the chapel we either genuflect or bow toward the monstrance with Jesus in it. Many times people will stop for 10, 15 or 30 minutes during the time a regularly scheduled adorer is present. Occasionally the regularly scheduled person needs to leave and the next scheduled person has not arrived. If this happens to you simply take the veil (it is on the small table next to the altar) and place it over the monstrance with Jesus in it. When the next adorer arrives they can remove the veil and continue adoration. The last adorer of the evening will follow the guidelines for reposition of the Blessed Sacrament. These instructions can be found in the adoration book on the bookcase in the chapel. Thank you for taking time to visit with Jesus.

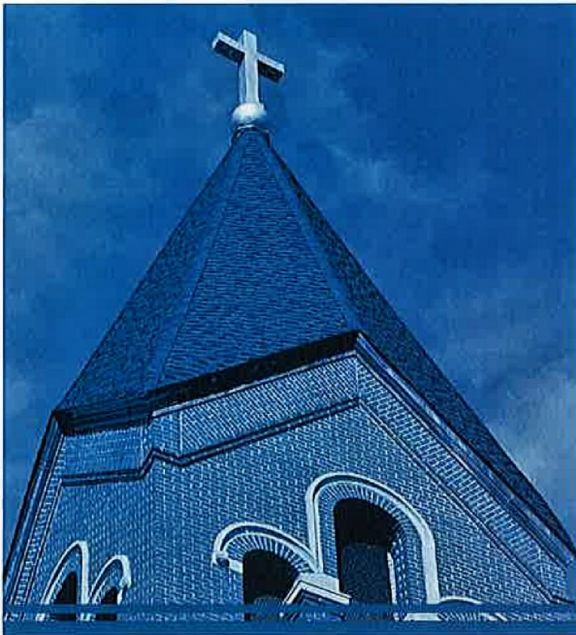

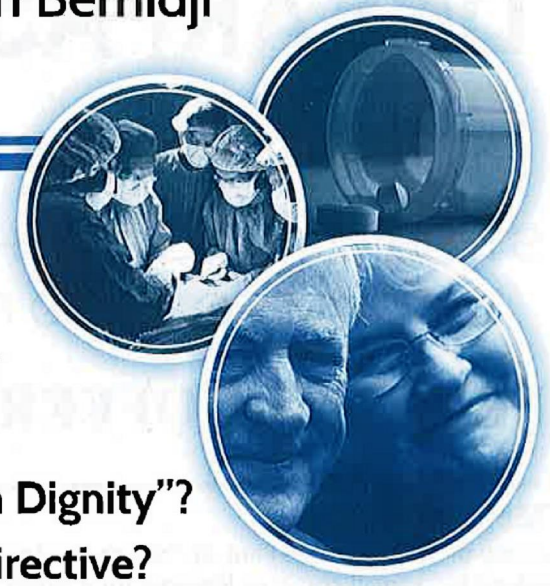

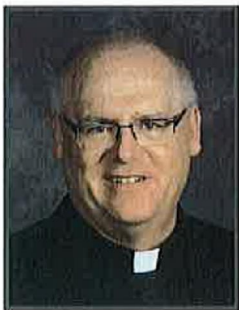
