Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

September 1, 2019

There was a recent survey published by the Pew Research Center concerning Catholic belief about what happens at Mass. If you've never heard of the Pew Research Center before, they are a group that asks people questions about their faith practices and beliefs. They pursue information from various groups, sometimes only Catholics and only Lutherans, etc, and other times they will take a general census from Christians of all denominations. **This recent survey consisted of asking only Catholics in the United States about what they believe happens at Catholic Mass during Communion time.** Perhaps some of you have already seen the results of this survey. The results are certainly enlightening. Here's a paragraph with the statistics, followed by my analysis (which is shared by many others), followed by a short, but clear teaching on what happens at Mass.

In the survey, they asked two main questions and sought out some other information. The two main questions (paraphrased by me): *What does the Catholic Church teach about what happens to the bread and wine during Mass? What do you personally believe about what happens to the bread and wine during Mass?* Overall, 45% of Catholics think the Church teaches that the bread and wine are (merely) symbols of the Body and Blood of Jesus, 50% think the Church teaches that the bread and wine actually change into the Body and Blood of Jesus through transubstantiation, and 5% are unsure what the Church teaches. **This is problematic because what we believe about what happens to the bread and wine at Mass is the central teaching of our Church!** Yikes! Moving to the next question, regardless of what they know or don't know about the Church's teaching, 69% of Catholics personally believe the bread and wine at Catholic Mass are (merely) symbolic of the Body and Blood of Jesus, which leaves 31% believing that the bread and wine actually change into the Body and Blood of Jesus through transubstantiation. They also break down what people believe based on their frequency of attendance at Mass. Out of those people who attend Catholic Mass on a weekly basis, 63% believe the bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus through transubstantiation. You can look up the rest of the results by searching for "Pew Research Eucharist" in your search engine online.

Here's a quick analysis. As I mentioned, the Church's teaching on the Eucharist/Communion at Mass is the central teaching of our Catholic-Christian faith. The fact that people are divided simply in what they *think* the Church teaches about the Eucharist - about 50/50 - is a very big problem. Regardless of what they end up believing, this one statistic shows that we as Catholics have done a very poor job in simply teaching the basic tenets of our Faith. Whether people believe what we profess is not up to us, but we need to at least be clear about what we believe. Here's a brief teaching on what we believe before sharing my final thought.

As Catholic-Christians, we teach that the bread and wine actually change into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ at every valid Catholic Mass around the world. This is not a mere symbol, but Jesus really becomes present on the altar and those who receive Communion really eat and drink the Flesh and Blood of Jesus. If 69% of Catholics don't believe this teaching, it's no wonder our congregations are getting smaller and more people are leaving Catholicism for something more entertaining. It's no wonder people don't think it's a big deal to miss Mass. But for us who do believe it, maybe it's time for us to start telling people about this extraordinary Gift given to us week after week, day after day even. *Perhaps it's time for us to start inviting more people to Mass, even if they can't receive Communion, so they can have the opportunity to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist.* Wouldn't you want someone to tell you about such an amazing event? I know I would. *Maybe it's also time for us to come to Mass during the week if we're able, so we can receive Jesus more frequently.* The Eucharist is such a great gift. Let's take advantage of Jesus' radical generosity. He's waiting to be even more generous.
