Greetings on the 5th Sunday of Easter,

May 10, 2020

Jesus says: "My father's house has many dwelling places." To me that's a very comforting image and there are many ways in which we can interpret it. Saint Philips is a parish community, our church, where we celebrate together and it's comforting. Even during Covid-19 restrictions, I look out at the pews and see your faces. Over my 6 years here, I see St Philips as one of God's dwelling places: where we live, move and have our being.

God dwells in your homes. I thank you for welcoming me into your life in times of joy and times of sorrow. I believe as Christians members of St Philips and St Charles we understand the importance of living the faith in the real world not just inside the parish buildings. The reception of the Eucharist prepares us for the task at hand, in home or at work.

I often told other priests how fortunate I am to be part of a dynamic, vibrant parish. Yes, we were able to add to the physical campus but more importantly we added to the number and quality of programs that touched people's lives in deep and lasting ways. Today's 2nd reading tells us we are called to be living stones. As a community we are built around the cornerstone, "JESUS" As a community we are called to mirror His influence. Being gentle, kind, compassionate, caring, hospitable, seeking others, praising Him together. We gather in His name for refreshment and to be sent into the world. As stones come in different shapes, sizes, and weights, so do we in our gifts and talents. I am thankful that you the people of God were generous with your time, talent and treasure.

In daily life we as humans will struggle with relationships, and some interactions. I would be remiss if I did not point out the negative effect that gossip and adding to or forgetting part of the story has on those around us. Those are the moments where we have placed God's call to the side and embraced the fully human part of us. I place before you my apology for any times, that I have not lived up to the call of being a Christian. I ask for your forgiveness. I invite you to reach out to another and share the same message of reconciliation.

It is my intent to come back to St. Philip's in late July or early August to celebrate the Eucharist with you. I desire to tell you in person how grateful I am for you. Every Sunday for six years I have prayed for you in the weekend Mass intention called "for the people". This is the privilege of being a pastor. During my sabbatical I will continue the practice, but I will also include the people of Holy Rosary Parish in Detroit Lakes.

During my sabbatical I will spend time on retreat. I hope to enjoy activities that will help me become refreshed physically, mentally, and spiritually. I plan to take my mom on a trip to visit my siblings (I have 11). I have promised my grandchildren that we will be doing some special things to celebrate our relationships. I will even find time to spend with my children. Due to Covid-19 restrictions I will not be able to work in prison or homebound ministry like I wanted, but I trust in Jesus to provide future opportunities for me.

I close with a couple phrases you may have heard me use... May God keep you Holy, Happy and Healthy... Jesus loves you and so do I... and Blessings on your day! Love and prayers...

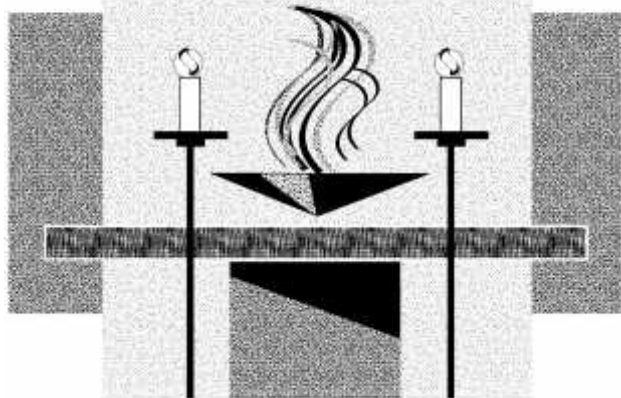

Statement from the Office of Formation in Discipleship re: Cancellation of 2020 St. John Paul II Camp

CROOKSTON, MINNESOTA, May 1, 2020 – In 2006, in an effort to develop leadership growth opportunities for youth of all ages in the Diocese of Crookston, Blessed (Saint) John Paul II Camp was created. Over the years, this summer experience has touched the hearts of hundreds of middle-schoolers and has created leadership opportunities for high-schoolers and college students. As such, countless youth have had beautiful encounters with our Lord Jesus Christ at Saint John Paul II Camp. This camp is and will remain a priority for the Diocese of Crookston.

Over the past few months, we have all been challenged by a change to the rhythm of our everyday lives. We have all made sacrifices we were not anticipating two or three months ago. The COVID-19 public health crisis is causing individuals, families, churches, schools and businesses to reassess and adjust future plans.

Diocese of Crookston staff share in this challenge. We have had many conversations in the past month regarding ministry, specifically our summer youth programming. Our greatest priority is the safety and well-being of everyone, especially the students and staff participating in St. John Paul II Camp.

As difficult as it is, we believe the most prudent decision is to cancel the 2020 St. John Paul II Camp "Into the Deep". We understand this is disappointing to all participants and families, and yet we trust in the Holy Spirit who has guided and will continue to guide this ministry moving forward. All participants will receive a full refund. Participants will also be kept updated regarding ministry, opportunities and programs moving forward.

We are committed to creating life-giving ministry to the youth of the Diocese of Crookston. Our hope and prayer is that the Holy Spirit will continue to guide us as we reach out to our young Church. Although times are challenging, we trust that even greater things are to come as we move forward.

Frequently asked questions:

Q: When will St. Philip's open it's doors for Mass again?

A: Once Governor Walz and then Bishop Hoepfner give their approval for larger groups to reconvene, we will be able to have Mass again in the church.

Q: Is the chapel open for adoration?

A: Not yet, unfortunately.

Q: Can I still go to Reconciliation?

A: Yes, definitely. Confessions are by appointment only at this time, so call the Parish Office to schedule a time with either of the priests.

Q: When will the Clothing Depot open for business, and can I drop off items now?

A: We listen to the governor daily for updates on the status for small business re-opening. As of now, we are unable to open. Please do not bring your item for drop-off until they are open for business.

Q: Can I watch Mass online?

A: Definitely. Go to www.stphilipsbemidji.org; the weekend Mass from St. Philip's is on the home page for you to view. Click on the link to view Bishop Robert Barron's celebration of daily Mass.

Q: I have not been able to drop my stewardship envelopes in the offertory basket. What are options for giving?

A: Although we can't physically worship in the church, financial responsibilities continue (utilities, salaries, building commitments, etc). Thank you to all who provide financial support. There are several options for anyone to do so. (See page three). Please know the most cost-effective way (so your gift has the most impact) is to set up an electronic funds transfer payment. Project Rachel Ministry Confidential Phonenumber

The Project Rachel Ministry confidential phonenumber is now available in the Diocese. This phonenumber is meant to help those who are post-abortive because they had an abortion, they were the father of a child who was aborted, or they have a family member impacted by abortion. The phone line will be answered by Julie Krejci who participated in Project Rachel training sponsored by the USCCB and has a M.A. in Counseling Psychology. The purpose of the helpline is not to provide counseling but to refer the caller to others including priests to allow for healing and reconciliation. The helpline number is 218-470-0112 and the caller's number is not identified by the receiving number.

For this to happen we need someone to coordinate the project, i.e. line up volunteers and schedule times for the blood draws. The Red Cross does all the set up for the drive. Are you considering the Diaconate OR do you know of a man in your parish who should?

If you are considering discerning a call to the Permanent Diaconate please read this announcement. The Permanent Diaconate is a ministry of Word, Sacrament and Service. As a ministry of the Word Deacons proclaim the Gospel during Mass and through their lives. As a ministry of Sacrament Deacons assist at Mass and preside at baptisms, weddings, funerals and wake services depending on the needs of the parish. And as a ministry of Service deacons carry out all manner of works of charity from visiting the sick, caring for the poor, and participating in prison ministry among many other Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. There are currently five Deacon Candidates discerning a call to the Permanent Diaconate who are in their second year of formation – please pray for them. The next group of men will gather for the first year of formation (called the Aspirancy year) in 2021-2022. While this may seem well into the future, if you are considering the Diaconate (or think someone else should) you are encouraged to talk with your priest and to also contact Deacon Mark Krejci, Director of Deacon Formation, mkrejci@crookston.org, so that they can both pray for you and provide you with further information.

We will communicate using email, Facebook (@stpbji), website (stphilipsbemidji.org), weekly bulletin, school email and newsletter (Snippets). **Information and instructions will evolve.** We will continue to adapt together. Thank you.

MASS-SPECIFIC INFORMATION

-)] **MASS TIMES CHANGES:** Adjustments are required to allow for cleaning
 - o Saturday: 5:30 p.m.
 - o Sunday: **(NEW) 7:00 a.m.**, 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.
-)] **ENTERING CHURCH:**
 - o Beltrami Avenue (Door #3) and Parking Lot (Door #2) will be kept open to minimize contact with handles, etc.
 - ↓ Apply hand sanitizer upon entering.
 - ↓ The Adoration Chapel will be closed to minimize areas to clean.
 - ↓ Bring and wear masks at all times (except when receiving communion).
 - o Maintain 6-ft distance from others. (may require waiting outside)
-)] **LIMITED SEATING:** Ushers will seat people as they arrive **AND** dismiss people when Mass concludes to facilitate proper social distancing and seat as many people as possible at each Mass. Please follow their instructions and be courteous to the volunteer ministers. (Please note: you may not be able to sit in the area of your choice.)
 - ↓ Every other row will remain empty.
 - o The Social Hall will be used for seating.
-)] **MINISTRIES (for each Mass)** Call the Parish Office to help with ministries:
 - ↓ **Two readers, up to eight ushers, one musician/one cantor.**
 - o There will be no altar servers.
-)] **WORSHIP AIDS (Hymnals will not be used):**
 - ↓ Music, readings and other information will be available to download to electric devices (phone, tablets, etc.) at stphilipsbemidji.org. A link also will be posted on church monitors and other locations. (PLEASE TURN VOLUME/VIBRATION OFF WHEN ENTERING CHURCH).
 - ↓ A minimal number of worship aids will be available for people unable to use the technology option.

) **STEWARDSHIP:**

- Offertory envelopes can be deposited in designated boxes as you enter the church. There also are “no contact” alternatives for giving (see below).
- **SIGN OF PEACE:** Parishioners will be instructed to extend God’s peace through a simple nod of the head to their neighbors.

) **RECEIVING COMMUNION:**

- ⇓ **There will be no communion procession:** Please remain standing in your pew. Clergy will come to each pew to give you the Body of Christ in the hand only. (Hold out your hands, left on top of right. Do not take the host from the priest, but rather allow them to place it in your hand.). To preserve the safety of all in attendance, we will not distribute Communion on the tongue. Only clergy will distribute Holy Communion.
- Precious Blood will not be offered.

) **OTHER CHANGES:**

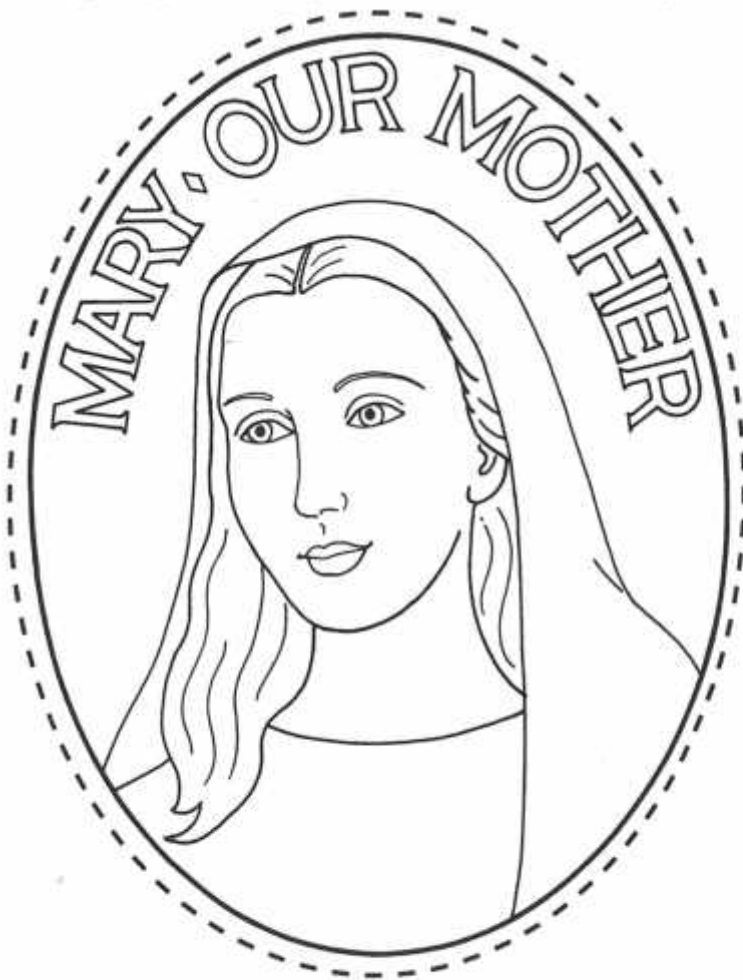
- ⇓ Water fountains will be turned off.
- ⇓ **Holy water fonts** must remain empty.
- ⇓ Obligation to attend Mass is still dispensed. If your health is compromised or you do not feel safe coming to Mass, PLEASE stay home. You may also wish to attend a weekday Mass to avoid crowds.
- ⇓ Coffee and rolls will be discontinued until further notice.
