Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time,

July 9, 2023

Our responsorial Psalm this Sunday is, "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God." I consider myself extremely blessed when I think about this response. The Holy Trinity, God the Father, Jesus his only begotten Son and the Holy Spirit, truly are my king and my God, and it is an honor to be able to be of service to the Church and to God! It is an honor to be able to praise his name in word and in song and by the way we live our lives!

Last weekend we had one of our seminarians, Reilly Swanson, with us to share some thoughts about vocations. I pray that he inspired you to pray for all of our seminarians and for potential seminarians as they discern their possible future in the priesthood. I also pray that all young men in our parish who believe that the Lord God is their king and their God will seriously consider the possibility that God may be calling them to serve him through the priesthood. Also, for the young women, to consider and pray about a life as a religious sister.

We are blessed to have Westin Gourneau from our parish currently walking this path as well as another young man, Tim Guidry, who has recently been accepted to the seminary. Please be sure to pray for them often.

This week, however, I would like to encourage all of the men in our parish between the ages of 28 and 58, who truly believe that God is "their king and their God" to seriously pray about whether God may be looking to them to do something more to serve him. I was an active member in this parish, singing in the folk group, had served on the Pastoral Council and the Diocese Pastoral Council, was active in the Koinonia Retreat movement, etc. But I felt that God may be calling me to do more. To be of service to him in some other way. I was introduced to Deacon Jim Lukenbill and found his path in life was a lot like mine. As I prayed about what God was looking for from me in return for all of the gifts I received from him, entering formation to become a Deacon looked more and more like where God was calling me. I would like to encourage everyone to pray for vocations to the diaconate in our parish. And, if you are a man who loves Jesus and believes him to be your God and king, that you seriously pray about whether or not God is calling you to consider the Diaconate!!! Being a Deacon is very rewarding! Please call me for more information.

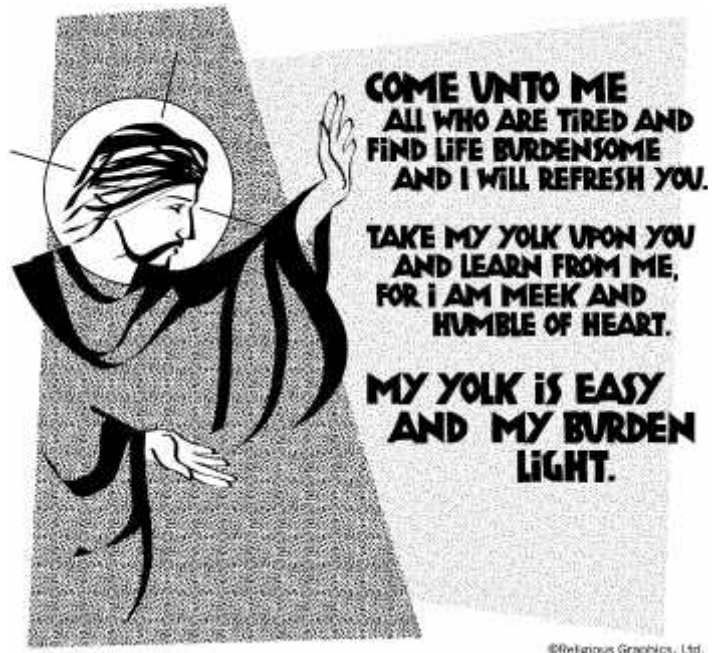

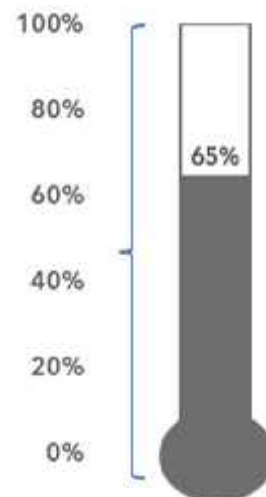

"Discerning the Diaconate"

Are you being called to be a permanent deacon? Do you know someone you can invite to discern the diaconate? You may be reading this because you are interested in exploring the vocation of a permanent deacon. The next formation group will begin in the fall of 2024. From fall 2023 through winter 2024, the Diocese will host a number of "Discerning the Diaconate" sessions around the Diocese for men, and spouses if married, so that they can find out more about the program. If you wish to talk about the program before that time, you can email Dcn. Mark Krejci, Director of Deacon Personnel and Formation for the Diocese at mkrejci@crookston.org to arrange a phone or zoom call. You are also strongly encouraged to talk with your pastor as well as deacons you may already know. If you believe you know a man who should consider the diaconate, I encourage you to share this information with him. In a recent survey of Catholic deacons, they indicated that a parishioner's encouragement played a significant role in the deacon deciding to enter the formation program.
