The Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold." God's word has great power to bear fruit beyond expectation, but it is not enough to just hear it; we have to respond to it. In the weekday Mass gospel for this last Thursday, Jesus instructed his apostles to go forth to proclaim that the Kingdom of God was at hand. Then he said: "If they do not listen to you, shake the dust from your feet and go on to the next town." And then he said: "It will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah on the day of judgment than for that town." The choice we make and action we take upon hearing the word of God is very serious.

In my favorite psalm, Psalm 95, God's word says, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts as at Meribah and Massah in the desert where your ancestors tested me and tried me though they had seen all my works therefor I swore in my anger: "They shall never enter into my rest." Again, God requires a response from us in order for his grace and mercy to have its effect in and through us. If there is no response there is no salvation and instead woe for us.

As I make my transition from Roseau to Bemidji and from 46 years of active ministry to semi-retirement it is my 11th transition since my ordination in November of 1977. I have served in 23 different parishes – some of them a couple of times. I have had a very grace-filled life and ministry, but sometimes I think that I have responded to too many things. They have basically all been good things to do, but lately I have been hearing God ask whether all these "good things" were what he really wanted me to do. I had one person whom I worked with a lot and hunted deer with for several years, and when I asked him to do something for me his response was almost always: "I'll pray about it and get back to you." A lot of the time it was just a stalling tactic if he did not want to do something. However, I now understand how much better it is to discern God's will in regard to all that I do.

I feel good to be here at St. Philip's and believe it is God's will. This last move was a lot of work and I do not want to move again anytime soon, so I hope to stay and share life and ministry with this parish for a while. I am still hearing and responding to new calls from God including one to begin this February —a two-year (mostly on-line) course in spiritual direction or mentoring. I have a married brother in Monticello who is also interested in this course. Hopefully this is a charism we can offer to our parish communities in the coming years. – "If today you hear God's voice."

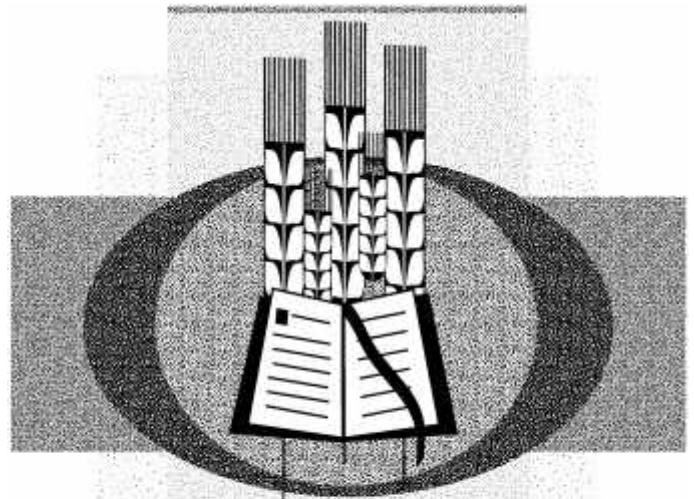

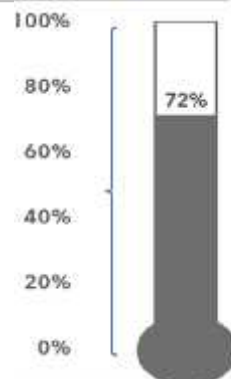

Carmelite Corner

Lay Carmelites of The Most Pure Heart of Mary

The following letter is from a member of the third order Carmelite Community member at St. Philip's. Kim became involved with the community when it began here. She wanted to share with the parish, her witness on what the third order community means to her.



After 33 years in human resources, (as a) wife and mother of two boys, early retirement for me was a conscious decision to place God first in my life, thirsting for a deeper prayer life, simplicity in my lifestyle, daily devotions, service in the Church and deeper meaning in the next chapter of my life. With over 15 years of being an adorer of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, I decided to pursue certification to be a distributor of Holy Communion to serve the elderly confined in the nursing homes. This has been a gift from God to serve him and his precious elderly souls.

My thirst to grow in my relationship with Jesus continued, as I looked to his Mother and completed the Michael Gaitley book, 33 Days to Morning Glory (a consecration to Mary), which led to 33 Days to Great Glory (a consecration to the Father through Jesus) and the Father Don Calloway consecration to St. Joseph. In 2020, my husband and I relocated to Bemidji, MN, became members of St. Philip's where I heard about a Third Order of Lay Carmelites, starting in September.

Little did I know what I would find. A group of like-minded sisters (and/or brothers) to help me grow deeper in my faith. Our monthly 75-minute meeting, we share our prayer requests, united we pray the Liturgy of the Hours together in voice we praise God and harmonize with our hearts, understanding the Bible and especially the Psalms. We study the upcoming Sunday gospel and share using the Lectio Divina model.

I've learned the Liturgy of the Hours is the prayer of the whole "People of God." In it, Christ continues his priestly work through his Church. In my daily morning and evening prayer routine at home, it's a beautiful thing to imagine being a part of his Church members from around the world, participating according to their place (consecrated or laity) in this prayer, lifting up our hearts.

God is good and he's good all the time. I'm blessed beyond my imagination by this Carmelite Ministry as I continue to learn, grow and become the person God wants me to be; more like his Son. As our leader prays with us, "Keep Mary in your mind and Jesus will grow in your heart".

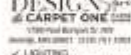
