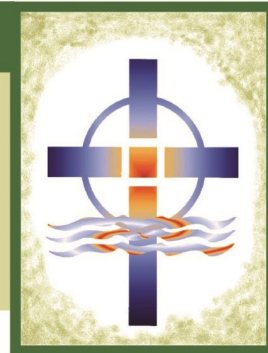

Dear St. Philip's School Families,

I write to give you an update on the situation regarding a priest and a student that has raised concerns at St. Philip's Catholic School. I am grateful for those parents and teachers who met with me on March 14 and 15. I am also grateful for the meetings I have had with the parents of the student involved.

This has been a difficult experience for the St. Philip's community. Given the specific history of this parish, it rightly influences how we respond to any situation that seems questionable. It also creates an opportunity for misinformation to spread. Consequently, we worked hard to listen and fully understand all aspects of these circumstances. It is important to state that in this situation there was never any allegation of abuse or physical contact.

In this situation some things went well. People spoke up when they noticed a possibility that safe environment protocols were not being followed. People bringing this to our attention is a good thing because it means a strong safeguarding culture is present in this parish. The week of March 12, we were informed that Bemidji police were going to do an investigation. We cooperated fully, sharing with them the internal investigation we had already completed. After looking at everything involved in the case, the police notified us the week of March 24 that this appeared to be a matter of internal procedure, and they did not find anything criminal. As a Catholic community concerned with the well-being of children, these checks and balances are all appropriate and healthy.

Additionally, this situation has led to some important learnings to improve our safe environment practices:

- First, a principle we try to follow whenever possible is that using a team approach to minister to youth is always best. In this case, at the student's request, Fr. Josh Salonek was asked to help the student on their faith journey, but from the beginning we should have attempted to involve more people in aiding this student, using a team approach.
- Second, if there is going to be an individual meeting between a student and an adult that is outside of normal school day encounters, we should seek permission in writing from the parents. Parents should not be surprised to find out that an adult in the school had an individual meeting with their student. If an unexpected situation comes up, we should notify parents as soon as possible.
- Third, if a student is going to be removed from class, not only the parents but the principal and the teacher, especially the homeroom teacher, should know when, where, and what the meeting is about.
- Fourth, if an individual conversation needs to happen between a student and an adult, it should happen in a space where the meeting can be easily seen. Examples are the cafeteria, or church gathering space where the large room allows necessary privacy but also allows the meeting to be observed.

What was done?

- Fr. Josh had a conversation with the parents asking about meeting with him and the student. The parents gave general permission for Fr. Josh to meet with the student but expected to learn more about the process and next steps.
- There were some informal meetings and conversations that happened with the student around the school.
- School administration suggested to Fr. Josh a time and a place to have an individual meeting with the student and Fr. Josh was acting on that advice.

Many concerns could have been avoided if the above principles were followed. Based on these learnings we will review our diocesan-wide safe environment practices and enhance our training to ensure all our Catholic schools and youth faith formation ministries work vigilantly in these delicate matters.

Unfortunately, during this process rumors and misinformation have spread about Fr. Josh. Many of these were brought to me as I listened to parents and teachers on March 14 and 15. I would like to clarify some inaccuracies and misconceptions that have circulated:

Rumor #1: Fr. Josh had many assignments and was “moved around” before being sent to Bemidji. This is not true. Fr. Josh was ordained a priest in 2021 and spent three years at a large suburban parish in Eagan, Minnesota. He did very well in all aspects of that assignment and that is why he was recommended for this more difficult missionary assignment away from his home diocese to serve in the Diocese of Crookston. If you search the internet, his name is associated with several parishes from the time he was a seminarian; most seminarians serve in several parishes as part of their field training.

Rumor #2: Fr. Josh was placed on administrative leave during the investigation, and we said he was on retreat. It is true that Fr. Josh was gone the week of the diocesan investigation, but this was because he had his annual spiritual retreat. Every priest is required by Canon Law to take a week of retreat, and travel arrangements with other priests had been scheduled for many months. We received questions concerning Fr. Josh’s contact with the student on a Friday. If there had been any accusation of anything criminal, we would have immediately reported it to the police, but since there was not, we did an investigation which began immediately the following week. This happened to be the week of Fr. Josh’s annual retreat.

Rumor #3: Fr. Josh had gotten a day pass to a local gym to see the student. Fr. Josh did get a day pass to a local gym to try it out, as he was looking for a place to get regular exercise. Having a positive experience that one day, he purchased a month pass at the beginning of December. During that month he visited 12 times to exercise, and three of those times the student was also there. At the end of the month’s membership, he decided not to renew his membership. He never returned to the gym after that month-long membership expired.

Rumor #4: The diocese was covering this up by doing their own internal investigation and not reporting to the police. Again, it is important to state that in this situation there was never any allegation of abuse or physical contact. There was never anything alleged that would have required mandatory reporting. We shared with the Bemidji Police Department the details of our investigation and fully cooperated with them. As noted above, they did not find anything criminal.

We have done a thorough review of all aspects of this situation. After having listened to all concerns raised in this case and having met with the parents and heard their concerns, after having seen everything in our investigation, and having talked to Bemidji police, I can still say that, although we have learned a lot, there is no reason to restrict Fr. Josh’s ministry. My team has presented this to members of our Ministerial Review Board, and they agree with this determination. The review of this situation demonstrates that Fr. Josh has not violated the law or his priestly obligations, and therefore, he remains a priest in good standing and should enjoy the right to a good reputation in the eyes of the Christian Faithful.

Given that the school year will end in less than a month, I have determined it is better for Fr. Josh not to be present in the school or at the school Mass for the rest of this academic year, which ends May 22. This is a compromise I think is prudent and should not be taken as a “restriction” upon his ministry but as an act of charity out of sensitivity for the family involved.

I renew my gratitude to the parents for bringing this forward. We must pay close attention to safe environment practices because so much is at stake for our youth, school, parish, and every adult who works with children in any capacity. I am grateful for the understanding of the parents as we have worked through these difficulties.

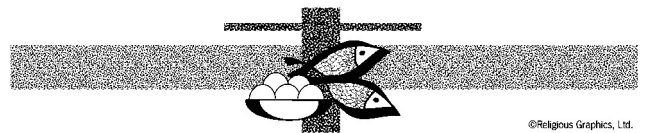
