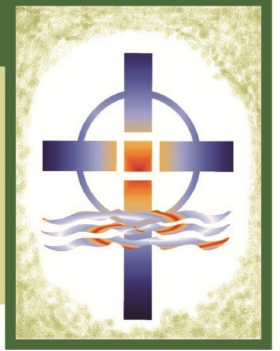

Christ is Risen! The Season of Easter Begins

A blessed season of Easter to all parishioners and guests! For 50 days let us celebrate the most significant event in all of history. The Paschal Mystery is true! The suffering and death of Jesus was a reality, not just a terrible dream. He died for our sins. Jesus was the ultimate sacrifice for all sin for all time. The Resurrection of Jesus from the dead is true, not just a nice idea or wishful thinking. It tells us that the grave is not the end! In fact, Jesus rising from the dead distinguishes Christianity from all other major religions.

From Matthew's account of the Resurrection, we hear in chapter 28 that an angel of God rolled away the stone in front of Jesus' tomb and the guards shook with fear. Later we read that some of the guards reported to the chief priests all that had happened. They were offered a handsome sum of money to say that the followers of Jesus took his body away in the middle of the night when they were asleep. I wonder, did these guards really keep quiet?? They knew the truth! What they saw with their own eyes was greater than anything they had ever experienced. How could any sum of money possibly keep them silent for the rest of their lives? They might not have spilled the beans right away, but over time, I believe each of these guards told someone and that person eventually told someone and that person.... You get the picture. How could anyone keep quiet after seeing an angel move the stone, and see Jesus who was dead emerge from the tomb? How could they keep it inside? My prayer for all of us is that we would deal with the same dilemma. That is, that we would encounter the living Christ so powerfully in our own lives that we will not be able to remain quiet. Not ready to get up on a soap box? Start by telling someone, anyone, what the love of God and the reality of the Resurrection means in your life.

May this season of Easter be a time of great blessing for you and your family!

Saint Spotlight



St. Michael de Sanctis

Born 1591 ~ Died 1625

Feast Day: April 10

Patron: of Cancer Patients

- Michael De Sanctis was born in Catalonia, Spain.
- He told his parents at age six that he was going to be a monk. He imitated St. Francis of Assisi to such a great extent that he had to be restrained.
- He became an apprentice to a merchant after his parents death at age 10.
- He joined the Trinitarian Friars at Barcelona at age 12 & took his vows in 1607.
- He joined the reformed group of Trinitarians and was ordained a priest.
- He was especially devoted to the Most Blessed Sacrament and his ecstasies during the Consecration at Mass.

- Many miracles were attributed to him before and after his death. Often called 'the Ecstatic One.'
- He is recognized by the Church for his innocence, prayerfulness, and penitence.
- After 11 days of prayer, a person was cured of cancer through his intercession.

The History of Hot Cross Buns

Hot cross buns are believed to have first been distributed to poor English Catholics on a Good Friday between the 12th and 14th centuries. Today, the sweet-spiced buns are eaten in England and in Commonwealth countries such as Australia and New Zealand during Lent and Holy Week. While some historic accounts suggest the buns — traditionally made with flour, eggs, yeast, currants, and cardamom — have ancient pagan origins, other records hint that medieval monks Christianized the recipe by baking the buns with distinct crosses to represent the crucifixion of Jesus Christ and using different spices to symbolize his burial.

History of the Easter Egg

The use of painted and decorated Easter eggs was first recorded in the 13th century. The church prohibited the eating of eggs during Holy Week, but chickens continued to lay eggs during that week, and the notion of specially identifying those as "Holy Week" eggs brought about their decoration. The egg itself became a symbol of the Resurrection. Just as Jesus rose from the tomb, the egg symbolizes new life emerging from the eggshell. In the Orthodox tradition eggs are painted red to symbolize the blood Jesus shed on the cross.

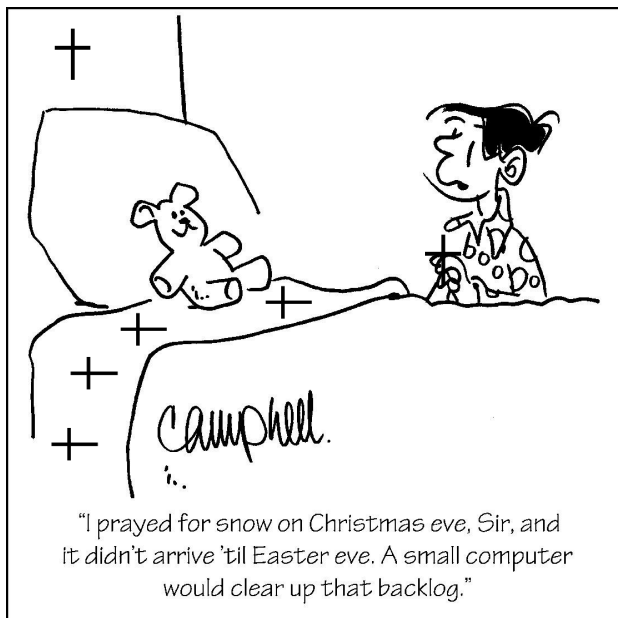
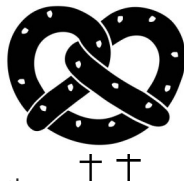

Pretzels

Pretzels, the iconic bread twist simply made with salt, yeast, flour, and water linked to several parts of Europe, are believed to have been invented specifically as a Lenten food by an Italian monk in the early Middle Ages, according to a Vatican Library document. With the purpose of helping Catholics to live the penitential season with prayer and simplicity, the treat's shape resembles hands in prayer, forming three holes representing the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Traditional Hot Cross Buns

Ingredients for the buns:

1 cup milk warmed to 100– 115 °F
2 teaspoons instant dried yeast
4 tablespoons sugar
4 cups + 2 tablespoons all-purpose/plain flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon allspice
¼ teaspoon ground ginger
1 cup dried currants or raisins
6 tablespoons unsalted butter melted
2 large eggs beaten room temperature

Ingredients for the cross:

⅓ cup all-purpose/plain flour
2 tablespoons sugar
Warm water

Ingredients for the glaze:

2 tablespoons powdered/confectioners sugar
Warm water

Instructions for the buns:

1. In a bowl, add the milk and whisk in the sugar and yeast. Allow to sit for 3-5 minutes until it starts to bubble.
2. In a mixing bowl add the flour, salt, cinnamon, allspice, ginger, currants or raisins, mix well.
3. Make a well in the center of the flour mix, add the milk and yeast, butter and eggs. Use a spatula to mix until the dough comes together, then use your hands to make the dough to a large ball. It will be sticky.
4. Turn the dough out on to a floured surface and knead for about 5 minutes, until smooth and elastic, adding small amounts of flour as needed until smooth and no longer sticky. The dough is ready when you stretch a small piece between your fingers and it thins out without tearing. You can also press your finger lightly into the dough—if it springs back slowly, it's ready.
5. Place in a lightly oiled bowl, cover with a towel and leave in a warm place for about 45 mins to rise.
6. Cover a large baking sheet/tray with parchment paper.
7. Once risen, divide the dough into 12 balls and shape each into a bun. Place close together on the baking sheet and cover loosely with a towel. Leave in a warm place for 30 minutes until doubled in size and touching.

Preheat oven to 400°F

Instructions for the crosses:

Add the ⅓ cup flour & sugar to a bowl and mix well. Add just enough warm water to create a thick paste. Add to a zip-top bag, remove the air and seal. Cut a little off the corner off the zip-top bag and pipe a cross on top of each bun. No need to score the dough, the crosses melt into the buns as they bake. Bake for 20-25 minutes until golden brown.

Instructions for the glaze:

Add the powdered sugar to a small bowl with 1 tablespoon warm water and stir until syrupy. Remove the buns from the oven and brush with the glaze while still warm. Cool the buns on a wire rack.

To store the baked buns, keep in an air tight container for up to 4 days. You can also warm them in a preheated oven to 300°F (150°C). Wrap the buns in foil and warm for 10–15 minutes.

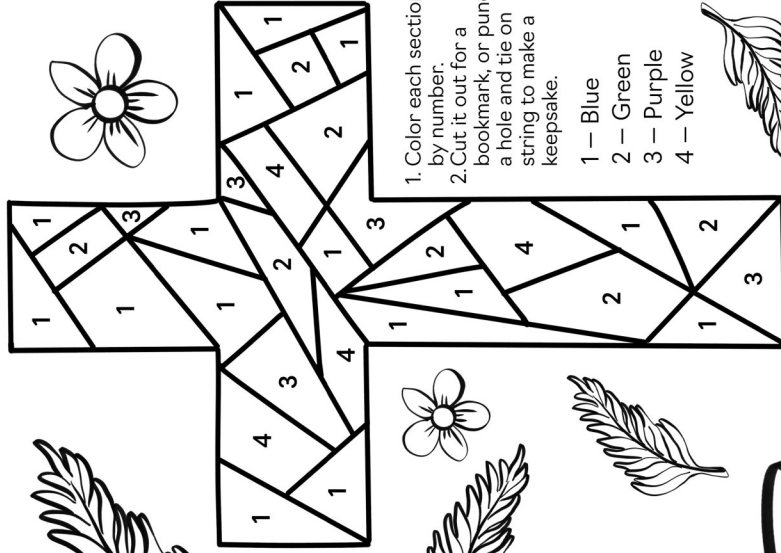

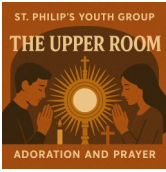


FIAT Ministries Discernment Retreat

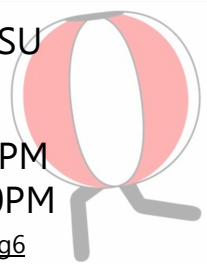
