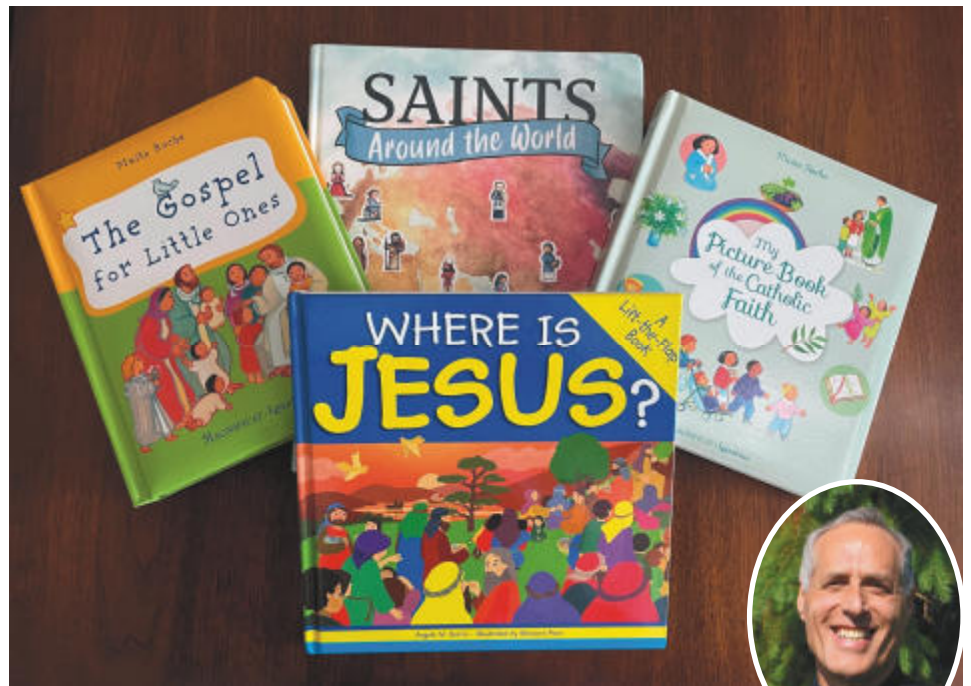

## THINGS ABOVE FROM FR. BILOT

The seminary preached to us that "there is no vacation from a vocation". Those words said to me 3 decades ago resonates in my mind and heart.

play outside and to enjoy the beauty of God's creation. Books are also a wonderful way for children to engage their imagination and to learn that touching, feeling and experiencing the pages of a book are so basic to the human need for connection.

I came across some children's books (and there are many) that I would like to share with you today. Two books from Magnificat/Ignatius Press that are lively, colorful and very informative are: The Gospel for Little Ones (ages 18 months and up) and My Picture Book of the Catholic Faith (ages three and up). Teaching children how to read the Bible on their level or learning about the beliefs/teachings of the Catholic Church are integral to establishing a faith and value system for their young minds. Young children also enjoy, as do

adults, pop-up or lift-the flap books. A very simple book, Where is Jesus by Angela Burrin engages the child (and adult) about the different scenes in Jesus' life, asking questions that help us learn the truths about Him. A final book entitled, Saints Around the World (Emmaus Publishing) beautifully written by Meg Hunter-Kilmer and illustrated by Lindsey Sanders, tells the stories of many saints that we don't hear or even know about. The book is fascinating, enjoyable and real. It is about actual people who lived their lives in the faith of Jesus Christ. One commentator said, "These intriguing stories are not about make-believe characters, but about real people who are now in heaven and can be powerful intercessors for us." Though the book is written on a child's level every adult can enjoy the faith-filled stories to inspire us to be

saints for tomorrow!

In fact, we are blessed. Meg Hunter-Kilmer, the author, is willing to come to St. Paul to read us one of the stories and to talk about the making of the book. She will be here on Sunday, July 25 after the 10 a.m. Mass to enlighten and fascinate us with stories about God and his love for you and me. Please mark your calendars to join us for a summer break to learn about the saints you never knew were saints!!

Know of my prayers as we step back to enjoy the beauty of summer. Also know that I continue to pray for all those who were affected by the flood. I am in disbelief at the devastation that has happened.

## (FR.) COLIN'S COLUMN

**Title:** Saved in Hope (Spe Slavi)

**Category:** Encyclical  
(on Hope + Faith)

In this encyclical, Pope Benedict XVI elaborates upon hope. He explains how faith is the substance of hope, how hope leads to eternal life, and how modern conceptions of hope based merely in 'progress,' are insufficient. It is a great commentary on how modern culture draws one away from true hope and how true hope doesn't disappoint. An excerpt:

'Man was created for greatness – for God Himself; He was created to be filled by God. But his heart is too small for the greatness to which it is destined. It must be stretched. 'By delaying [His gift], God strengthens our desire; through desire He enlarges our soul, and by expanding it He increases its capacity [for receiving Him].' Augustine refers to Saint Paul, who speaks of himself as straining forward to the things that are to come. He then uses a very beautiful image to describe this process of enlargement and preparation of the human heart. 'Suppose God wishes to fill you with honey; but if you are full of vinegar, where will you put the honey? The vessel, that is your heart, must first be enlarged and then cleansed, freed from the vinegar and its taste. This requires hard work and is painful, but in this way alone do we become suited to that for which we are destined.'

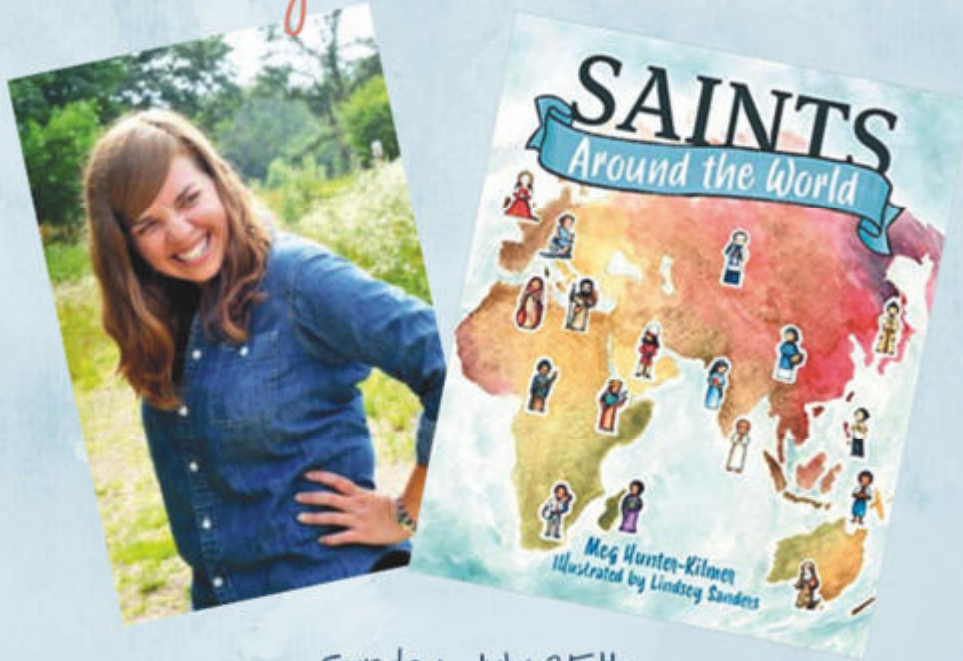

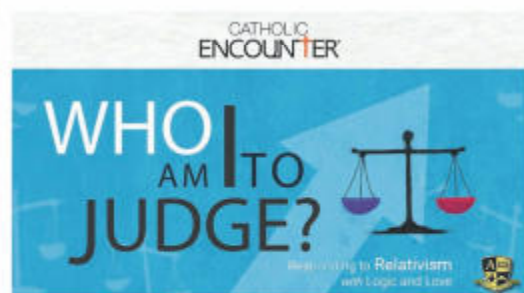

## WATCH

### WHO AM I TO JUDGE? WITH DR. EDWARD SRI - SESSION 1: DON'T IMPOSE YOUR MORALITY ON ME!

What is "right" and "wrong"? Is what's right for you right for me? These are difficult questions to discuss in our culture. We live in a society that supports the opinion that each person should make up his or her own morality, that there is no moral truth that applies to everyone. So, how do we talk about right and wrong in this world? In this series, Dr. Ted Sri explores the fragility of a relativist outlook and the importance of absolute truth.



Last week I shared some tips for paying better attention at Mass. One honest and humble gentleman told me that he had been reading the bulletin during Mass, but when he came to my article, and saw what it was about, he felt a twinge of conscience and decided to put the bulletin down and focus on the Mass going on around him! Being fond of irony, I got a good laugh out of that.

Now, as I mentioned last week, one of the reasons that we all struggle to focus at Mass is that we do it very often and so it becomes commonplace. But this happens with more than just Mass. In fact, with almost everything that we do or encounter regularly, we experience it as ordinary, monotonous, and boring. Yet, instinctively, we know that this is not correct. For instance, one of the most common ways that we praise other people is by saying “they never took anything for granted.”

After writing last week’s article, I was reflecting on this, and how important it is for us to try to break through the veil or pall of “ordinariness” that we cast upon the world around us. This made me recall one of my favorite quotes from G.K. Chesterton:

“All the towering materialism which dominates the modern mind rests ultimately upon one assumption, a false assumption. It is supposed that if a thing goes on repeating itself it is probably dead; a piece of clockwork. People feel that if the universe was personal it would vary; if the sun were alive it would dance. This is a fallacy even in relation to known fact, For the variation in human affairs generally brought into them, not by life, but by death; by the dying down or breaking off of their strength or desire. A man varies his movements because of some slight element of failure or fatigue. He gets an omni-bus because he is tired of walking... The sun rises every morning. I do *not* rise every morning; but the variation is due not to my activity but to my inaction.

Now, to put the matter in a popular phrase, it might be true that the sun rises regularly because he never gets tired of rising. His routine might be due, not to a lifelessness, but to a rush of life. The thing I mean can be seen, for instance, in children... Because children have abounding vitality, because they are in spirit fierce and free, therefore they want things repeated and unchanged. They always say, “Do it again”; and the grown-up person does it again until he is nearly dead. For grown-up people are not strong enough to exult in monotony. But perhaps *God* is strong enough to exult in monotony. It is possible that God says every morning, “Do it again” to the sun; and every evening, “Do it again” to the moon. It may not be automatic necessity that makes all daisies alike; it may be that God makes every daisy separately, but has never gotten tired of making them. It may be that He has the eternal appetite of infancy; for we have sinned and grown old, and our Father is younger than we.”

This idea of Chesterton’s has a powerful appeal for me. It is really just a deep articulation of the very first sentence of the Apostle’s Creed, “I believe in God the Father Almighty, *creator of heaven and earth.*” The idea that the world is *created by God* is a powerful, powerful idea. It means that all things are deliberate, all things stem from and are maintained by a divine idea and a divine act of will. It means, in principle, that nothing is boring. Chesterton is right to identify the experience of monotony as an effect of aging, because who experiences the wonder of the world more freshly than a child?

We all look back on our childhood with a certain amount of nostalgia. We indulge in idyllic reveries about “the good old days.” But that sort of reminiscing is usually colored, explicitly or implicitly, by the qualifier that, “we had to grow up and experience the real world.” Well, actually, if we take our belief in a creator God seriously, the wonder in the eyes of a child is a more accurate representation of the “real world” than the cynicism of a jaded adult. To be a Christian means that the leftover sense of childhood wonder we all have is not naiveté or foolishness, it is actually wisdom.

Chesterton is also right to identify that, just as the Christian is *compelled* to see the world with this childlike freshness; the atheist, or the proponent of “that towering materialism which dominates the modern mind,” is *compelled* to see nothing but inert matter, nothing but death.

So, guided by our faith, by the time we take for prayer, and by our relationship with God, let’s be those people who – when confronted by each sunrise, each new day, each chore, and even each painfully boring part of our lives – choose not to give in to despair and to let a little part of our hearts grow old and die, but to hear the whisper of God the Father saying with childish glee, “Do it again.”

### When can I register?

Registration for the 2021-2022 school year begins June 7, 2021. Class placements will take place in September.

### Who can register?

All children in grades 1 – 8.

### When are classes offered?

Classes will be **in person** on Mondays, beginning October 4, 2021. Class times are 4:15 – 5:30 p.m. or 6:30 – 7:45 p.m.

### How do I register my child for Religious Education?

### How do I pay?

### What is the tuition for Religious Education?

One child – \$250.00, two children – \$360.00, three children – \$425.00, four or more children – \$465.00

### Is there anything else I need to register my child?

A Baptismal Certificate or Profession of Faith is required prior to receiving the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. If you are registering a child for 2nd, 7th or 8th grade, please provide a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate to the Religious Education Office. If your child was baptized at St. Paul on the Lake, you can [Request Sacramental Records](#) and the Parish Office will provide a copy to our office. A [Medical Release Treatment Form](#) is required to be on file for each child enrolled in our program.

### I cannot afford the fee. What should I do?

It is our desire that every child in the St. Paul parish family has access to Religious Education. If the registration fees impose a financial hardship, please contact the Religious Education Office.

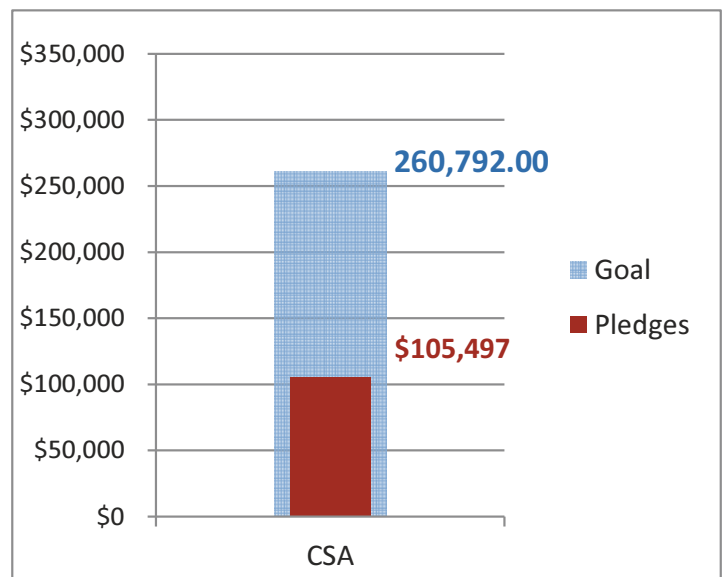
## ST. PAUL PRESERVATION ENDOWMENT FUND

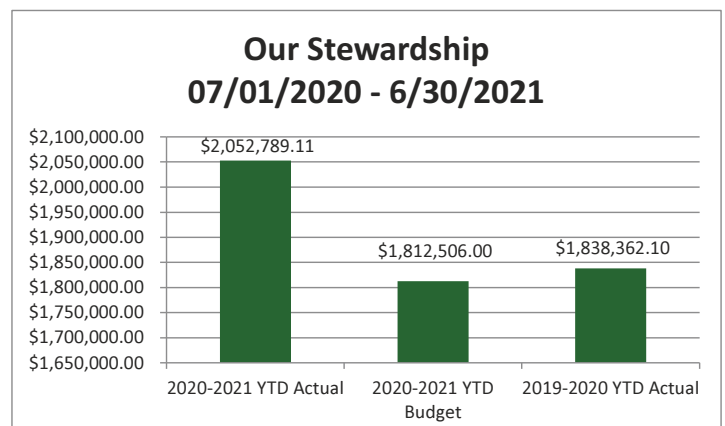
