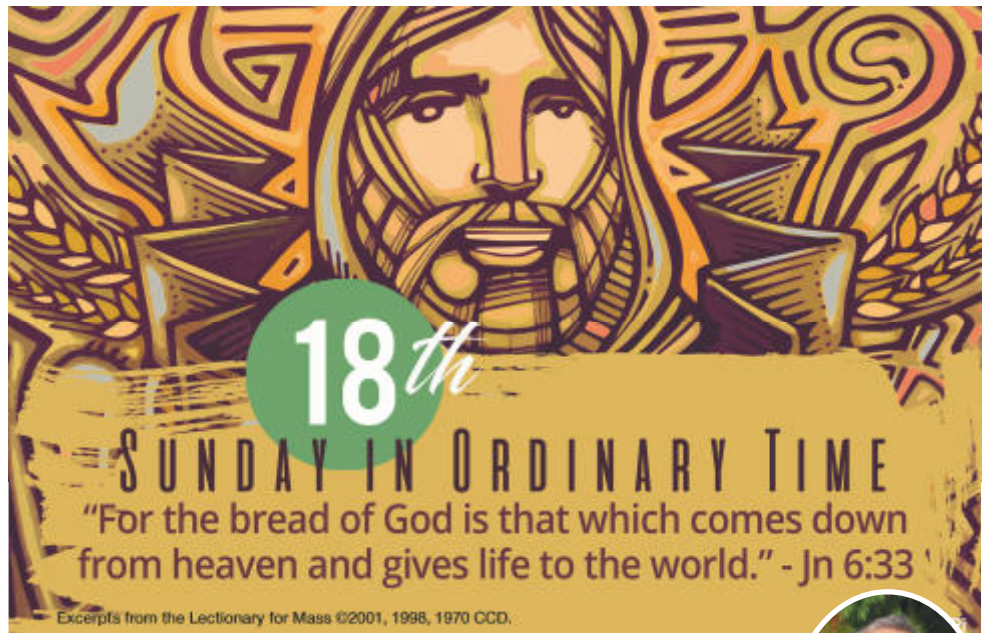

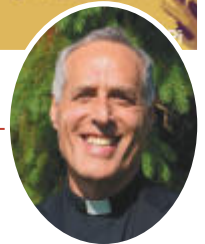
THINGS ABOVE FROM FR. BILOT

Last Sunday, after the 10 a.m. Mass, we had a visitor, an author who wrote a children's book on saints throughout the world. It was nice to see families join the author in the book signing and reading of some of the lives of the saints. I particularly like the book because many of the blessed or saints are not common. The history of those men and women who were beautified (such as Blessed Solanus Casey) and those canonized a saint are vast and many. We tend to focus on the "popular" saints. However, there are so many who did heroic or quiet and beautiful things for Jesus and their witness still speaks to us today, through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the world.

Those who are beatified are in heaven,

as well as those declared saints. The Church dignifies someone as a saint because of proven miracles attributed to them or some exceptional work that is recognized as being done in their life for Jesus Christ and for the Church.

With the breakdown of *the family* due to many and varied causes, all instigated by the evil one we need to hold on to those who can inspire us, console us, motivate us and push us to become the saints of tomorrow. I strongly encourage that more reading and reflecting on spiritual endeavors be a tool in each household. DID YOU KNOW?

In 1825, the Rev. Francis Baden, an assistant of the Rev. Gabriel Richard, who had pastoral responsibility for the area, built the first St. Paul Church, a small free standing chapel, on the Renaud property. In 1846, a non-resident pastor, the Rev. Paul Kindekens, being far-sighted, purchased the land that today is the site of the church and rectory. In 1848, he began construction of a frame edifice of local timber that was not completed until 1857.

time together (just as sports activities are.) The family unit can bond and become stronger, in order to offset the evil and toxic culture.

If we all work together, individually and collectively, we can become a stronger faith community. We will methodically transform the skewed mindset and actions that pull us away from the Gospel Beatitudes and the Ten Commandments. Like the mustard seed, we start small and slowly, then we grow into the people Jesus calls us to be. We become the saints of today...yes today...and then for tomorrow!

In a particular way, have we looked at our families, our friends, our neighbors, our classmates/college roommates, co-workers and peers to see how they are doing in their spiritual life? Are they baptized? Did they stop attending the Catholic Church and need an invitation to return? Do they need to complete their Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Confirmation, or Eucharist? It is our responsibility as disciples of Christ to ask and invite. Plant the seed and encourage them to

come to the Catholic Church to explore their options through the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.) Call the Parish Office and speak to Fran Bauer. She is willing to help and guide all those who seek a deeper faith in Jesus in the Catholic Church through the Sacraments instituted by Jesus Christ.

Finally, next weekend, Jeremy Schupbach finishes his pastoral internship at St. Paul. It seems like he just arrived and here it is three months later. Upon his departure he will attend a conference with Archbishop Vigneron. He then returns to the seminary for his third year of theological formation. The good news is he will come back to St. Paul next spring, with God's will, ordained a Transitional Deacon to spend the weekends with us until his Ordination to the Priesthood in the spring of 2023. Please pray for him as he continues to discern and respond to Jesus' call to the priesthood.

An excerpt:

In Him who was crucified, the denial of false images of God is taken to an extreme. God now reveals His true face in the figure of the sufferer who shares man's God-forsaken condition by taking it upon Himself. This innocent sufferer has attained the certitude of hope: there is a God, and God can create justice in a way that we cannot conceive, yet we can begin to grasp it through faith. Yes, there is a resurrection of the flesh. There is justice. There is an 'undoing' of past suffering, a reparation that sets things aright. For this reason, faith in the Last Judgement is first and foremost hope – the need for which was made abundantly clear in the upheavals of recent centuries. I am convinced that the question of justice constitutes the essential argument, or in any case the strongest argument, in favor of faith in eternal life. The purely individual need for a fulfillment that is denied to us in this life, for an everlasting love that we await, is certainly an important motive for believing that man was made for eternity; but only in connection with the impossibility that the injustice of history should be the final word does the necessity of Christ's return and for new life become fully convincing.

We are excited to offer online registration for 2021-2022 Religious Education classes through the St. Paul website under the Religious Education tab.

It's fast, easy and convenient. Register today!

When can I register?

Registration for the 2021-2022 school year begins June 7, 2021.

Class placements will take place in September.

Who can register?

All children in grades 1 – 8.

When are classes offered?

Classes will be **in person** on Mondays, beginning October 4, 2021.

Class times are 4:15 – 5:30 p.m. or 6:30 – 7:45 p.m.

How do I register my child for Religious Education?

Registration is only offered online at stpaulonthelake.org/religioususedregistration.

If you need assistance, please contact the Religious Education Office at 313-885-7022 and leave a message or email dpeters@stpaulonthelake.org.

How do I pay?

Payment is made at the time of registration through **Faith Direct**.

What is the tuition for Religious Education?

One child – \$250.00, two children – \$360.00, three children – \$425.00, four or more children – \$465.00

Is there anything else I need to register my child?

A Baptismal Certificate or Profession of Faith is required prior to receiving the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. If you are registering a child for 2nd, 7th or 8th grade, please provide a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate to the Religious Education Office. If your child was baptized at St. Paul on the Lake, you can [Request Sacramental Records](#) and the Parish Office will provide a copy to our office. A [Medical Release Treatment Form](#) is required to be on file for each child enrolled in our program.

I cannot afford the fee. What should I do?

It is our desire that every child in the St. Paul parish family has access to Religious Education. If the registration fees impose a financial hardship, please contact the Religious Education Office.

This week I want to share some useful information about the cycle of Gospel readings that we use for Sunday mass, because we are currently at a very interesting point of that cycle. So there are four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, and we hear a reading from one of the Gospels every week. Of the four Gospels, the first three: Matthew, Mark, and Luke are very similar, meaning that many of same stories get repeated in each of them. That is why they are called the “Synoptic Gospels.” The Greek prefix “*syn*” means “with” and “*optic*,” unsurprisingly, means vision. So synoptic means “seeing together.” Matthew, Mark, and Luke are the Synoptic Gospels because they say – or “see” – the same things.

Of the total verses in these three Gospels, 40% are the so-called “triple tradition.” Those are stories that get told in all three Gospels. These stories include: Jesus’s Baptism, Jesus’s rejection in His hometown, the parables of the sower and the seed, Jesus overturning tables in the temple, the Last Supper, and of course, the Jesus’s Passion, death, and Resurrection. And then 15% are stories that appear in Matthew and Luke but not Mark, which includes the “Our Father”, much of the material from the Sermon on the Mount, and the healing of the Centurion’s servant. 12% Appear in Matthew and Mark but not Luke. A meagre 3% appears in Mark and Luke but not Matthew. And then only 30% is material that is unique to the Gospel in which it appears. In distinction, the Gospel of John shares very little material (basically just the Baptism, the multiplication of the loaves, the cleansing of the temple, and the Passion account) with the Synoptics.

Even though many stories get repeated, though, it is important to note that they are not identical, and there are many specific details which only appear in one account or another. With that being said, because the Synoptic Gospels portray things so similarly, the Church only goes through one of them at a time in the Sunday lectionary. Thus the cycle of Sunday Gospel readings has three years to it: A, B, and C. In year A, we hear almost exclusively from the Gospel of Matthew, in year B, we hear almost exclusively from the Gospel of Mark, and in year C we hear almost exclusively from the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of John gets to appear in the mix because we basically pause the readings from the Synoptic Gospels during the Easter season, and hear from the Gospel of John for that liturgical season. Some of the passages from John will also appear for special feasts when they are uniquely appropriate.

This is a very good system, however, there is two problems, the Gospel of Mark is far shorter than the other two Synoptics and there isn’t enough material in it to span the whole year, and the Gospel of John gets a little bit of short shrift. But the creators of the cycle solved both problems at once by taking the entire sixth chapter from John and inserting it into year B from the 17th – 21st Sundays in Ordinary Time.

Why the sixth chapter of John? It is essentially the chapter where Jesus unfolds His teaching about the Eucharist, and it is the only place, apart from the Last Supper, where the Eucharist gets talked about. The Eucharist is obviously one of the most important parts of our faith, and so it is extremely good that we devote special attention to that part of the Gospels.

Essentially what the Church has done, if I may exaggerate slightly, is to say, “We know that, apart from the Easter season, the Gospel readings get a little bit repetitive, (remember most of the stories appear two or three times, albeit with variations). So, in the middle of the cycle, we will take a pause, and focus on this very different, very important text from John’s Gospel, which is absolutely central to our faith. Plus, this way we get to hear from John’s Gospel more.” I have heard this time described before as “the whole Church taking a Eucharistic retreat” for six weeks.

The reason that I am talking about this now, is because we have just begun this Eucharistic retreat! Today is the 18th Sunday of Ordinary Time, year B! So last Sunday we began hearing from John 6, and we will continue to do so for the next four weeks.! A few extra pieces of advice that may help us to appreciate this moment of the liturgical calendar are: take some time to read the whole chapter of John 6 and meditate on it, or maybe go out of the way to spend time in Eucharistic adoration, which is available every Tuesday in the Church! I know these practices, as well as just knowing all of this, creates a sense of excitement for me to listen to the Gospel reading during these weeks, and it helps me to appreciate the cycle of readings more. My hope is that it will do the same for you

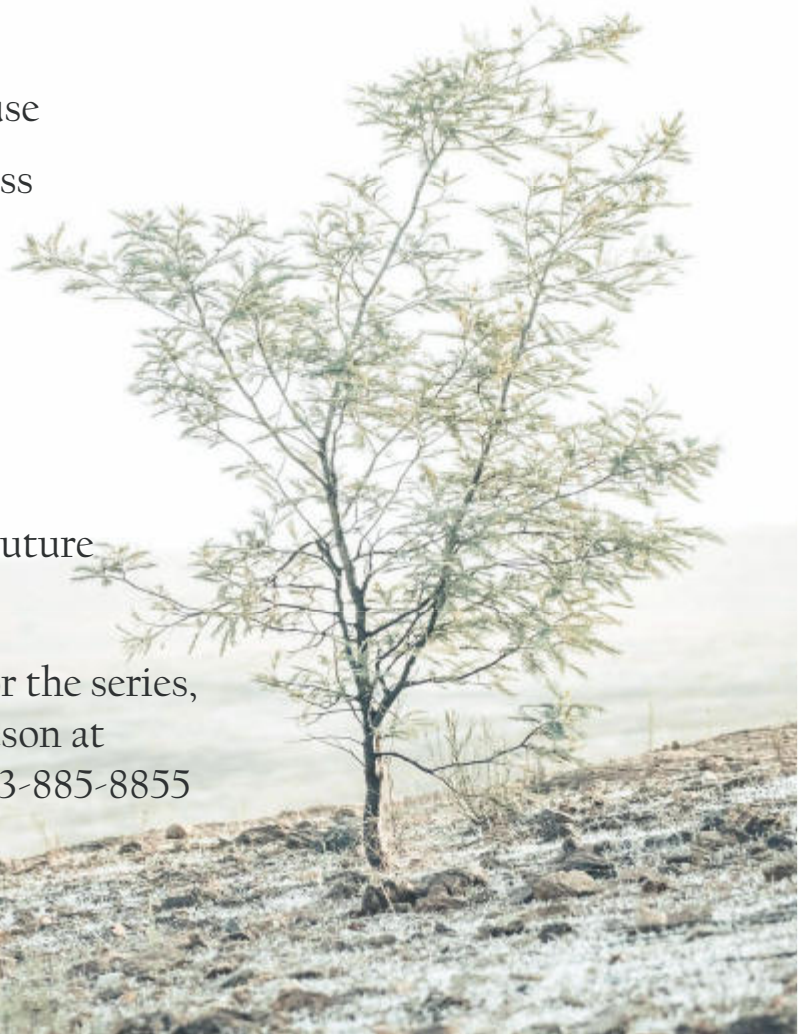

St. Paul Educational Trust Continues “Legacy of Learning” with Support and Academic Rewards to St. Paul School, Students and Staff

The St. Paul Educational Trust completed the 2020-2021 fiscal year with a record-breaking amount in support to St. Paul School and to St. Paul Parish students in the form of merit scholarships and tuition assistance grants.

Despite the pandemic, this past year has been very busy and productive for the Educational Trust. The trust has been able to underwrite some significant technology upgrades to St. Paul School, including new Chromebooks, tablets, and computer carts for each classroom; school security upgrades and a new keying system, as well as updated textbooks and educational materials. The trust also is underwriting a major portion of the expense involved in air conditioning the school building.

In addition the trust funds eighteen endowed scholarships each year – thirteen merit scholarships and five tuition assistance grants totaling \$44,000.

At the end of this challenging school year – during which St. Paul School remained open for in person learning for the entire academic year – the trust board passed a special motion to reward and thank our amazing faculty and staff for the extraordinary effort they put forth to pull off what many other schools in the community were unable to accomplish. Each teacher and school staff member received a monetary academic award from the trust to let them know that their sacrifices were recognized and appreciated.

Over the years the Educational Trust has developed an impressive list of endowed scholarships to benefit the children of St. Paul Parish. The **Monsignor Francis X. Canfield Scholarship**, the **Couzens Family Scholarship** and the **Gertrude and Donald McSorley Scholarship** all support St. Paul students attending Catholic High Schools. The **FitzSimons Family Scholarship**, the **Alice and Joseph Wright Scholarship**, the **Eileen Hickey King Scholarship**, the **Arthur and Honoria Roshak Scholarships**, the **Shields Family Scholarship** and the **William A. Cardinal Scholarship** are given to students attending St. Paul School. The recipients of the merit scholarships are selected by the St. Paul Scholarship Committee based on their review of student-submitted applications. The tuition assistance grant recipients are chosen by the school principal.

Since its founding in 1977 the trust has been managed and administered by a volunteer board of dedicated parishioners willing to share their time, skills and financial expertise to help ensure the long term viability and academic excellence of St. Paul School and to help families who are in need of assistance to provide their children with the benefits and confidence of a Catholic education. Over the years more than \$1.9 million has been disbursed to fund scholarships and to make annual grants to St. Paul School.

The trust was founded by parishioners Tom and Lynn McGann and Tom continues to serve as Chairman Emeritus of the board. The other trustees are Kathleen Conway, Chair, John Capuano, Vice-Chair, Jennifer O'Donnell, Secretary, Ellen Gormley, Treasurer, Bill Hanigan, Brian McCabe, Mary Scott, Don Thorn and Fr. Jim Bilot.

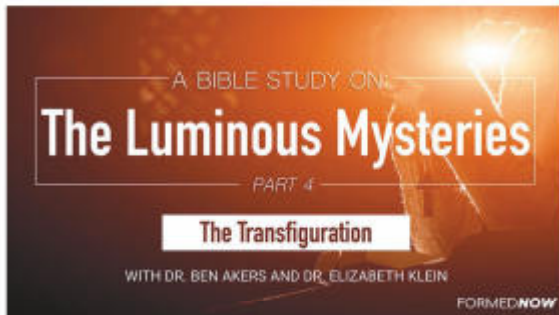

ST. PAUL PRESERVATION ENDOWMENT FUND

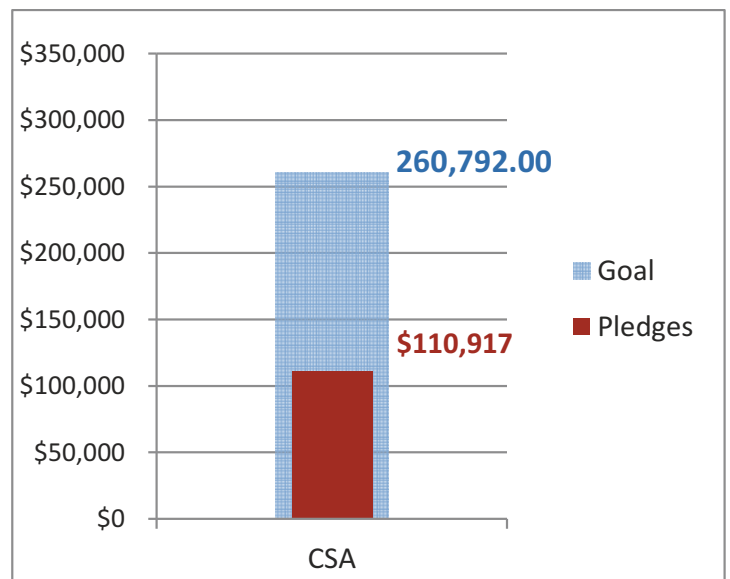

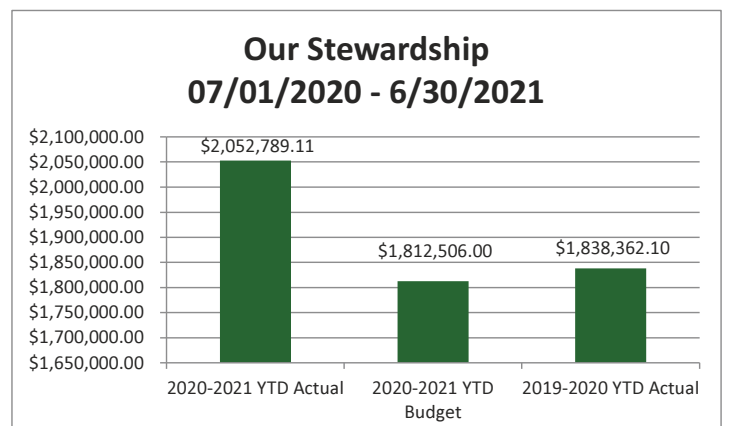
