THINGS ABOVE FROM

Today is one of those days when I believe it is good to just check in and tell you what is going on around campus. Mostly, my information is practical in nature.

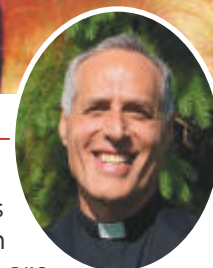
First, a change has been made in the sanctuary, actually, returning to a former time. When the restoration of the church proper, with the addition of the Gathering Space was done, some changes to the appointments in the church were made.

The liturgy documents state that we should be careful not to duplicate symbols. One such appointment is the crucifix. Originally, there was a crucifix in the niche above the tabernacle. The crucifix was taken out and an extended brass pole was attached to it with hopes of using it for the processional cross, which would stay in the sanctuary. What came to pass was the beautiful processional cross was top heavy and thus difficult to carry and manage. Subsequently, another cross was brought into the equation and was used as the processional cross. It was then placed behind the

high altar during Mass (thus eliminating the duplication of symbols for the ornate one, which remained on a stand in the sanctuary). Because we are using the "practical" processional cross during liturgy I decided to place the original crucifix back in its place. The statue of the Sacred Heart, made of plaster, is going to be placed in another location. The original marble statue of the Sacred Heart is in the Gathering Space.

Also, the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph and now the Crucifix niches are lit to enhance the beauty of these areas and help to highlight our sanctuary and sacred appointments. I hope that it helps you to focus in prayer and enter more fully in the sacred mysteries that take place in our noble and sacred sanctuary.

Now moving outside. For many years, prior to my arrival, there was talk of creating signage for the property. We have so many guests arriving at St. Paul who are met with confusion as where to go.

DID YOU KNOW?

The present church was built in 1898. After more than a century of daily usage, it was closed in 2000 at the onset of a major reconstruction project, covering every feature of the building. Its age was clearly showing and its electrical and mechanical systems were hopelessly outmoded. It had been closed earlier on only three occasions—in 1918, during the influenza epidemic; in 1976, in the aftermath of a powerful ice storm; and in 1978, because of a devastating fire.

UPDATE: The church was closed part of August 2015 for a ceiling net installation. It was then closed for a major ceiling repair Nov. 2015–Mar. 2016. The church was also closed briefly in 2020 during the current Covid-19 pandemic.

The parish office is not known by guests. Entrance to the gymnasium (see the signage above the entrance now) was an obscurity. Guests attending a wedding were confronted with not knowing which building is the St. Paul Church or the Academy Chapel. We took a great deal of time and effort to create signage that is dignified and appropriate for our campus. The hope is to be practical yet keep the integrity of our historic buildings. The main signs will be installed in a couple of weeks. You may have, or perhaps not, noticed that all the directional signs on the campus have been replaced. The former ones were faded, discolored and displeasing to the eye. Look around and hopefully you notice a new look emerging.

Our St. Paul parking lot, as I have been told, has always been a place for people to park and walk down to the water or used as a hangout. The police have informed me that late night issues have created problems (they are varied and many.) In my discussion with them, it was agreed upon that once darkness settles they will patrol the lot and ask people to leave.

Now, onto our ministry to the homebound. If you or someone you know brings the Eucharist to the homebound we have instituted new protocols. We want to ensure that the Eucharist is reserved properly in a pyx, taken immediately to the homebound and the

proper prayers are used prior to the reception of Communion. Those who come forward to receive the Eucharist (for themselves and a pyx for a homebound person) will have to show a small identification card, held in the palm of their hand, which lets the Eucharistic Minister know that the person asking has been trained properly and has permission to be a minister of Holy Communion to the homebound. If you have any questions please contact Fr. Colin Fricke.



Finally, and not in any particular order, is our CSA. We still need to raise over \$100,000 to make our goal. As I stated before and I realize that we just finished the 2020 year (because of Covid,) I ask that you help and respond to the letter I sent a week or two ago. As they say, many hands make light work. Together we can do our part to strengthen our local church here in the metro-Detroit area. CSA is instrumental in evangelization: bringing the Good News of Jesus to a very secularized culture. As

Blessed Solanus Casey reminds me to say to you, “Thank you ahead of time” for your generosity and support!

Enjoy these final weeks of August. Know of my prayers as we celebrate the awesome reality of Our Blessed Mother’s Assumption into heaven!

In this volume, Dr. Lawrence Feingold, a professor of Theology and Philosophy at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis, goes through an in-depth study on the Eucharist. He draws from the Old Testament foreshadowing, the Church Fathers, St. Thomas Aquinas, and magisterial teaching to illuminate the great mystery we participate in at every Holy Mass. An excerpt:

In order that the oblation by which the faithful offer the divine Victim in this sacrifice to the heavenly Father may have its full effect, it is necessary that the people add something else, namely, the offering of themselves as a victim ... For the Prince of the Apostles wishes us, as living stones built upon Christ, the cornerstone, to be able as 'a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ' (1 Pet 2:5). St. Paul the Apostle addresses the following words of exhortation to Christians ... 'I beseech you therefore, ... that you present your bodies, as a living sacrifice, holy, pleasing unto God, you reasonable service' (Rom 12:1) ... With the High Priest and through Him they offer themselves as a spiritual sacrifice.

It's fast, easy and convenient. Register today!

When can I register?

Registration for the 2021-2022 school year begins June 7, 2021.

Class placements will take place in September.

Who can register?

All children in grades 1 – 8.

When are classes offered?

Classes will be **in person** on Mondays, beginning October 4, 2021.

Class times are 4:15 – 5:30 p.m. or 6:30 – 7:45 p.m.

How do I register my child for Religious Education?

Registration is only offered online at stpaulonthelake.org/religiouseducation.

If you need assistance, please contact the Religious Education Office at 313-885-7022 and leave a message or email dpeters@stpaulonthelake.org.

How do I pay?

Payment is made at the time of registration through **Faith Direct**.

What is the tuition for Religious Education?

One child – \$250.00, two children – \$360.00, three children – \$425.00, four or more children – \$465.00

Is there anything else I need to register my child?

A Baptismal Certificate or Profession of Faith is required prior to receiving the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. If you are registering a child for 2nd, 7th or 8th grade, please provide a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate to the Religious Education Office. If your child was baptized at St. Paul on the Lake, you can [Request Sacramental Records](#) and the Parish Office will provide a copy to our office. A [Medical Release Treatment Form](#) is required to be on file for each child enrolled in our program.

I cannot afford the fee. What should I do?

It is our desire that every child in the St. Paul parish family has access to Religious Education. If the registration fees impose a financial hardship, please contact the Religious Education Office.

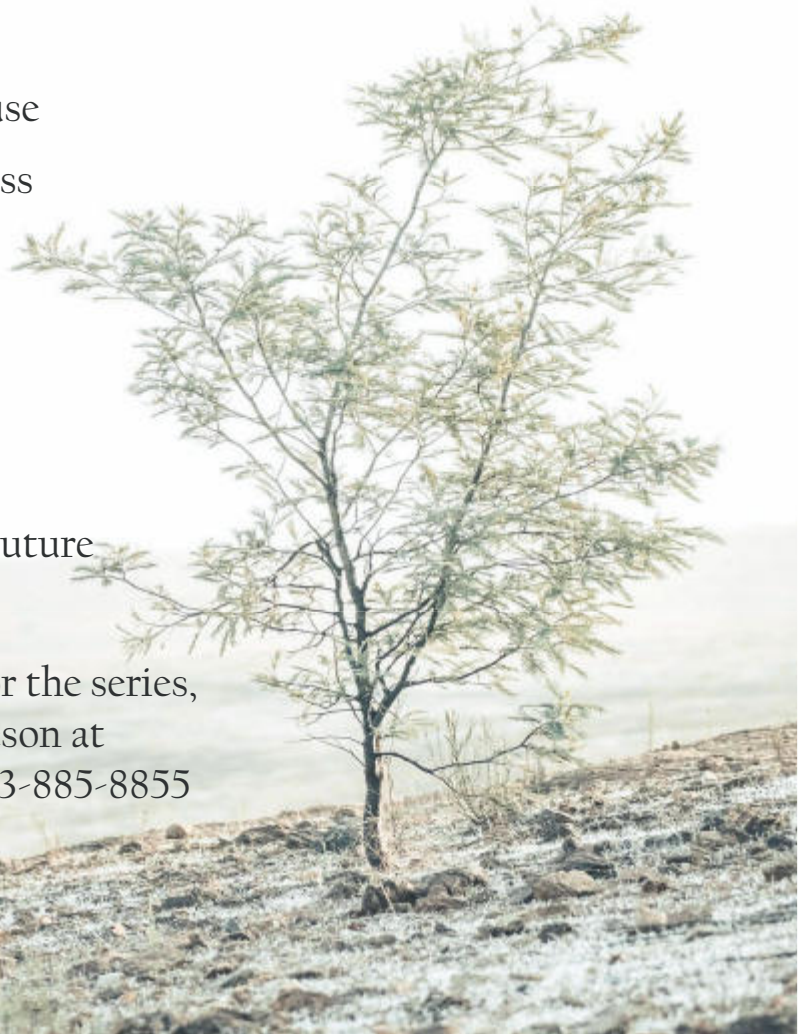

St. Paul Educational Trust Continues “Legacy of Learning” with Support and Academic Rewards to St. Paul School, Students and Staff

The St. Paul Educational Trust completed the 2020-2021 fiscal year with a record-breaking amount in support to St. Paul School and to St. Paul Parish students in the form of merit scholarships and tuition assistance grants.

Despite the pandemic, this past year has been very busy and productive for the Educational Trust. The trust has been able to underwrite some significant technology upgrades to St. Paul School, including new Chromebooks, tablets, and computer carts for each classroom; school security upgrades and a new keying system, as well as updated textbooks and educational materials. The trust also is underwriting a major portion of the expense involved in air conditioning the school building.

In addition the trust funds eighteen endowed scholarships each year – thirteen merit scholarships and five tuition assistance grants totaling \$44,000.

At the end of this challenging school year – during which St. Paul School remained open for in person learning for the entire academic year – the trust board passed a special motion to reward and thank our amazing faculty and staff for the extraordinary effort they put forth to pull off what many other schools in the community were unable to accomplish. Each teacher and school staff member received a monetary academic award from the trust to let them know that their sacrifices were recognized and appreciated.

Over the years the Educational Trust has developed an impressive list of endowed scholarships to benefit the children of St. Paul Parish. The **Monsignor Francis X. Canfield Scholarship**, the **Couzens Family Scholarship** and the **Gertrude and Donald McSorley Scholarship** all support St. Paul students attending Catholic High Schools. The **FitzSimons Family Scholarship**, the **Alice and Joseph Wright Scholarship**, the **Eileen Hickey King Scholarship**, the **Arthur and Honoria Roshak Scholarships**, the **Shields Family Scholarship** and the **William A. Cardinal Scholarship** are given to students attending St. Paul School. The recipients of the merit scholarships are selected by the St. Paul Scholarship Committee based on their review of student-submitted applications. The tuition assistance grant recipients are chosen by the school principal.

Since its founding in 1977 the trust has been managed and administered by a volunteer board of dedicated parishioners willing to share their time, skills and financial expertise to help ensure the long term viability and academic excellence of St. Paul School and to help families who are in need of assistance to provide their children with the benefits and confidence of a Catholic education. Over the years more than \$1.9 million has been disbursed to fund scholarships and to make annual grants to St. Paul School.

The trust was founded by parishioners Tom and Lynn McGann and Tom continues to serve as Chairman Emeritus of the board. The other trustees are Kathleen Conway, Chair, John Capuano, Vice-Chair, Jennifer O'Donnell, Secretary, Ellen Gormley, Treasurer, Bill Hanigan, Brian McCabe, Mary Scott, Don Thorn and Fr. Jim Bilot.

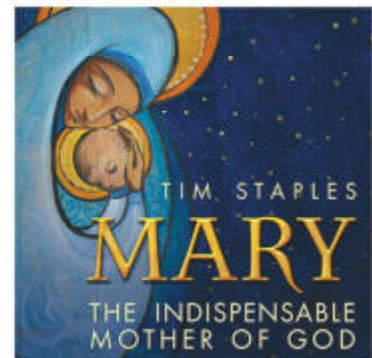

ST. PAUL PRESERVATION ENDOWMENT FUND

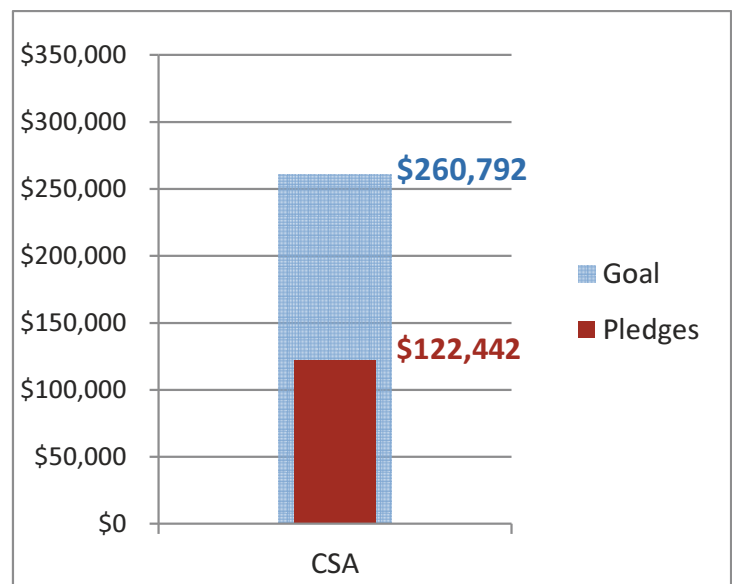

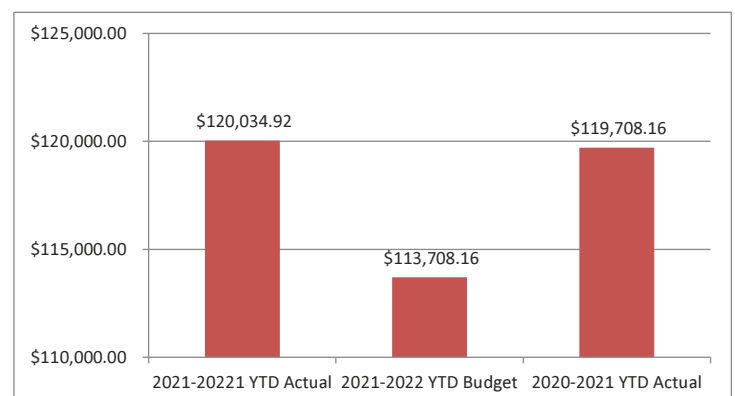
