The beginning of the last academic year brought news of colleges and universities offering classes remotely, with most college students staying home and managing a new type of learning environment. Many students in the elementary and high schools were also learning from home having to face a computer screen for a good part of the day. The academic situation was not ideal. Through perseverance and determination, the school year ended and summer brought hope of a new beginning for the upcoming school year.

Here at St. Paul we were blessed to have in-classroom learning through the entire

In this book Fr. D'Elbee presents the spirituality of St. Therese of Lisieux in a simple and profound manner. An excerpt: p119-120

'Enter in at the narrow gate: for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and many there are that go in thereat; but narrow is the gate and straight is the way that leads to life; and few there are that find it.'

You will perhaps be astonished that after having preached to you that confidence which so enlarges the soul and expands the heart, I should speak to you about the narrow gate on the subject of the 'little way.' But listen to the Holy Father: 'The gate which is truly narrow, accessible to all, is that of humility.' The narrow way, the narrow gate, is for those who become again like little children.

To His disciples who asked Him who was the greatest in the kingdom of Heaven, Jesus, calling a little child and placing him in the midst of them, answered, 'Amen I say to you, unless you be converted, and become as little children, you shall not enter the kingdom of Heaven. Whoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, he is the greatest in the kingdom of Heaven.'

Religious Education Registration now open Online!

We are excited to offer online registration for 2021-2022 Religious Education classes through the St. Paul website under the Religious Education tab.

It's fast, easy and convenient. Register today!

When can I register?

Registration for the 2021-2022 school year begins June 7, 2021.

Class placements will take place in September.

Who can register?

All children in grades 1 – 8.

When are classes offered?

Classes will be **in person** on Mondays, beginning October 4, 2021.

Class times are 4:15 – 5:30 p.m. or 6:30 – 7:45 p.m.

How do I register my child for Religious Education?

Registration is only offered online at stpaulonthelake.org/religiouseducation.

If you need assistance, please contact the Religious Education Office at 313-885-7022 and leave a message or email dpeters@stpaulonthelake.org.

How do I pay?

Payment is made at the time of registration through **Faith Direct**.

What is the tuition for Religious Education?

One child – \$250.00, two children – \$360.00, three children – \$425.00, four or more children – \$465.00

Is there anything else I need to register my child?

A Baptismal Certificate or Profession of Faith is required prior to receiving the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. If you are registering a child for 2nd, 7th or 8th grade, please provide a copy of your child's Baptismal Certificate to the Religious Education Office. If your child was baptized at St. Paul on the Lake, you can [Request Sacramental Records](#) and the Parish Office will provide a copy to our office. A [Medical Release Treatment Form](#) is required to be on file for each child enrolled in our program.

I cannot afford the fee. What should I do?

It is our desire that every child in the St. Paul parish family has access to Religious Education. If the registration fees impose a financial hardship, please contact the Religious Education Office.

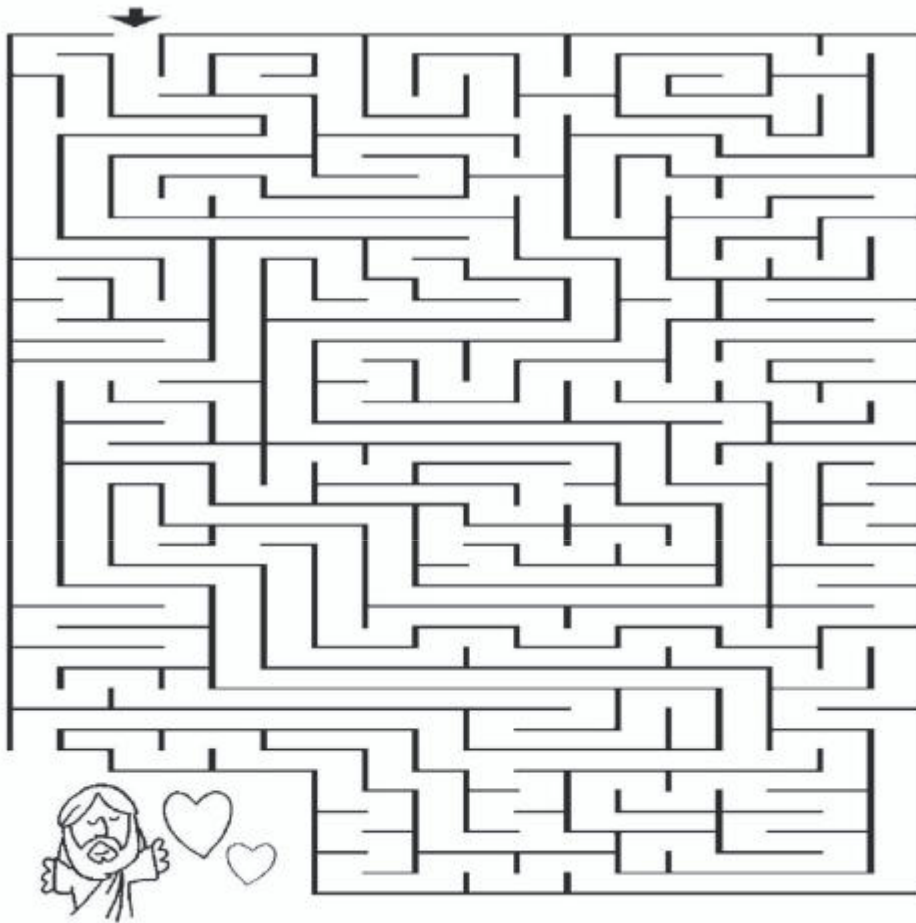

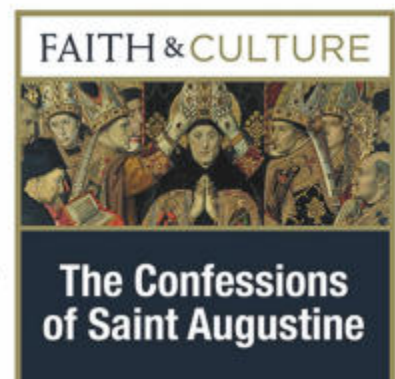

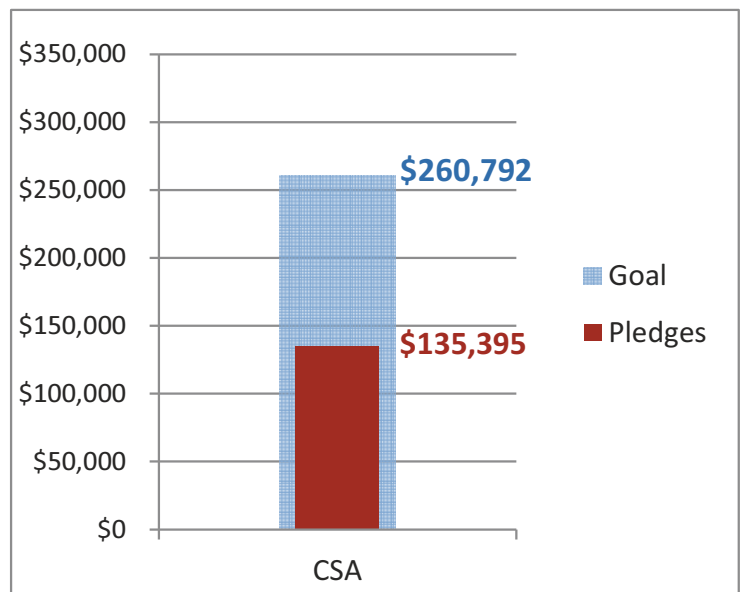
ST. PAUL PRESERVATION ENDOWMENT FUND

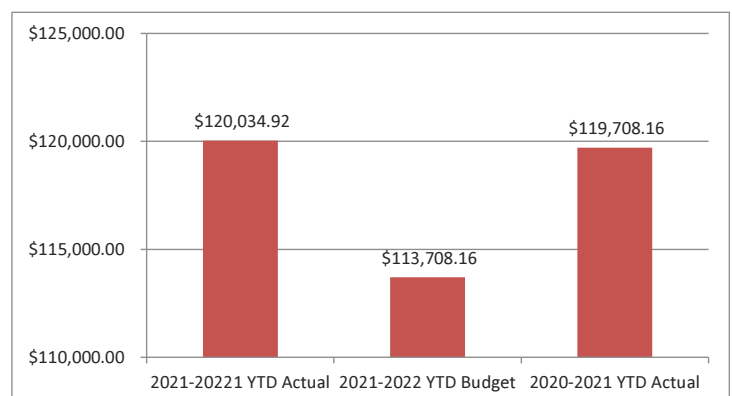
