The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

Festivities abound on the feast of the visit of the three Wise Men to the Christ Child. In many European countries, this is the day to exchange gifts. In Eastern European countries, the doorways of homes and Churches are marked in chalk with the date of the present year, the first initial of the names of each of the Magi with Crosses: + 20 + C + M + B + 16. Here in our Parish, we began the custom last year of venerating the image of the Divine Child. As we venerate the Cross on Good Friday as a sign of our love and devotion, so on this Feast we do the same with the statue of the Christ Child. Such devotions are tangible expressions of our faith and love for the great gifts we have received: the gift of the Babe in Bethlehem and the gift of His very life on Calvary.
