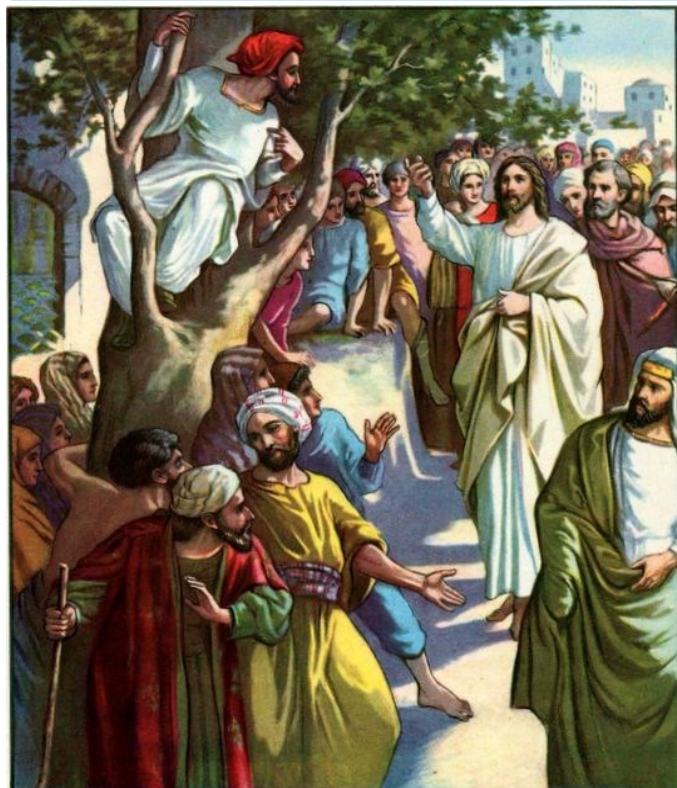

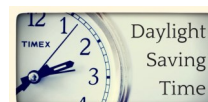
Holy Day
