The Miraculous Medal

PLEASE NOTE: NEW STARTING DATE — MONDAY AUGUST 20

The vision of Our Lady experienced by St. Catherine Laboure on November 27, 1830 makes it clear that the now famous medal originated from the Mother of God herself. St. Catherine describes the vision as follows: “Her feet rested on a white globe. I saw rings on her fingers, each ring was set with gems. The larger gems emitted greater rays and the smaller gems, smaller rays. I could not express what I saw, the beauty and the brilliance of the dazzling rays.” Catherine heard a voice say, “These rays symbolize the graces I shed upon those who ask for them. The gems from which rays do not fall are the graces for which souls forget to ask.” An oval frame formed around the Blessed Virgin and within it in letters of gold Catherine read the words: “O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.” The voice spoke again: “Have a medal struck after this model. All who wear it will receive great graces; they should wear it around the neck. Graces will abound for persons who wear it with confidence.” Catherine recalls that the scene seemed to turn, and she saw the reverse of the medal: a large M stood atop a bar and a cross; beneath the M were the hearts of Jesus and Mary.

The front of the medal represents Mary standing on the earth, her foot crushing the head of the serpent, and her hands outstretched to all who ask her assistance. The prayer encircling her contains one of her most beloved titles: “O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.” The rays of light from her hands symbolize the graces which she is only too eager to bestow upon those who wear the medal and pray to her. It took two years to obtain permission from the Archbishop of Paris to make the medals, primarily because Catherine would not appear before the Tribunal. She wished to keep her identity as the visionary secret, only her Confessor knew and the Tribunal trusted his good judgment. The medal was made according to Our Lady’s design. It was widely circulated and soon reports of wondrous miracles came flooding in.
