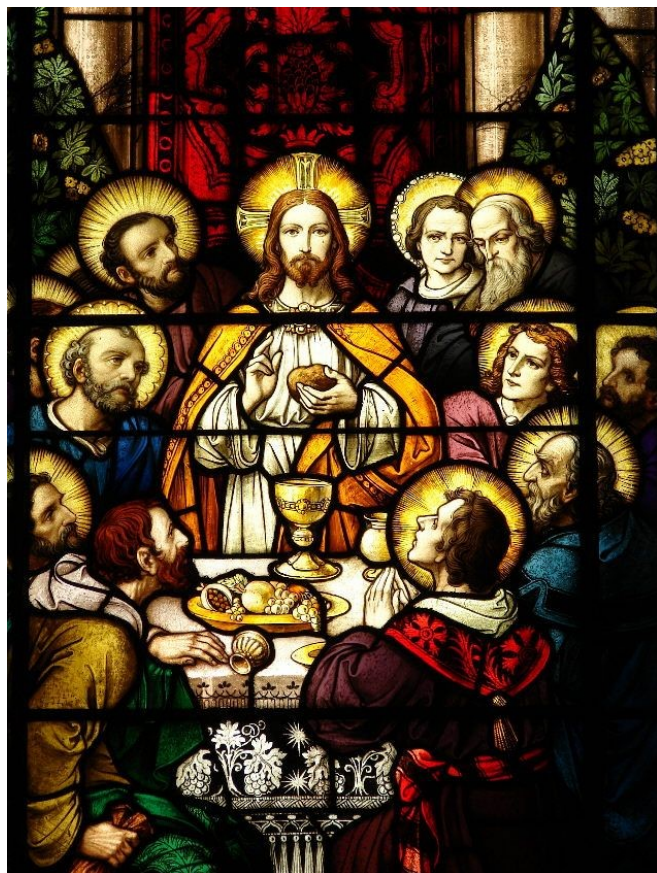

PLEASE NOTE: NEW STARTING DATE — MONDAY AUGUST 20

St. Catherine was born on May 2, 1806 into a farming family in Burgundy, France, the ninth of eleven children. Her mother died when Catherine was a young girl and from that time on she developed a deep devotion to Our Lady. At the age of 22, she asked her father's permission to enter the Sisters of Charity; he refused, but Catherine persisted. Eventually he relented. Catherine entered the convent in January 1830 and began her novitiate in Paris, at the now famous 140 rue de Bac Motherhouse.

At about 11:30 on the night of July 18, 1830, Catherine awoke when she heard her name called in the night. She was amazed to see a young child dressed in white, standing before her. He told her to follow him to the Chapel. After waiting in the Chapel for awhile, the child said, "The Blessed Virgin is coming." Catherine saw a beautiful Lady enter the sanctuary and seat herself in an armchair. Overcome with emotion, Catherine knelt before Her and conversed with Mary for quite some time. Mary told Catherine that she would be given a special mission. Several months later, on November 27, while the sisters were in Chapel for meditation, Mary came to Catherine again. This time Our Lady appeared as she is depicted on the Miraculous Medal. Catherine told her Confessor, Father Aladel, about the vision and Our Lady's request that a medal be struck. After appropriate investigations were carried out to ensure the veracity of the apparition, the medal was cast and spread throughout the world. Miracles began to be reported immediately.

Catherine lived the rest of her life as a humble Sister, quietly going about her duties in Religious Life. Catherine died on December 31, 1876. Her identity as the visionary of the medal was only revealed after her death. Pope Pius XII canonized her on July 27, 1947. Her feastday is celebrated in the Church on November 28.
