Thinking About Opportunities for Lent 2019

Ash Wednesday is March 6; it is good to begin thinking about what we will do to make this special time of the year more spiritually fruitful. There are a couple of Parish initiatives that I would like to offer for your consideration:

1. Each year we pray the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 7pm. This year we will offer some time in Eucharistic Adoration. We have Adoration every First Friday throughout the year, but for Lent, we will Expose the Blessed Sacrament at 3pm and have time for prayer until we begin Stations of the Cross. We will offer this devotion in the presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist and after the Stations are completed we will close with Benediction. Eucharistic Adoration is a wonderful opportunity for us to spend time with Our Lord in prayer. What better Lenten devotion could we participate in that we strengthen our relationship with Jesus. The only Friday that this will not take place is April 5. On that day, in addition to being a First Friday, we have Confirmation for our young people. We will still have Stations of the Cross at 7pm, but no Adoration time prior.
2. We will have a Lenten Parish Mission beginning on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, March 25-27. The Mission will be preached by the Priests and Brothers of the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal (the Order founded by Fr. Benedict Groeschel and Fr. Andrew Apostoli). We are looking forward to this special time for prayer and spiritual renewal for our Parish family. Please mark your calendars and plan to join us. More details will be in the Bulletin.
3. Our Women's Guild will hold a Day of Recollection on Saturday, April 6. It will be run by the Sisters of Life. All women in the Parish are welcome to attend; you don't have to be a member of the Guild. More detail will be in the Bulletin.
4. Confession is always an important aspect of our Lenten observances. Confessions are heard every Saturday, 4 to 4:45pm and on Reconciliation Monday, April 15, from 3 to 5pm and again at 7pm. Please plan to make a good confession in preparation for the Great Feast of Easter.
