Dear friends in the Lord:

One hundred years ago, Pope Benedict XV wished to give new impetus to the missionary call to proclaim the Gospel. To mark this occasion, Pope Francis has called for the whole Church to observe an *Extraordinary Missionary Month* in October, which is World Mission month. Our archdiocesan family joins our brothers and sisters around the world who will gather at the altar to celebrate, with great joy, our common vocation as missionaries. May it generate within us a renewed awareness of the need to proclaim the gospel to all corners of the world.
