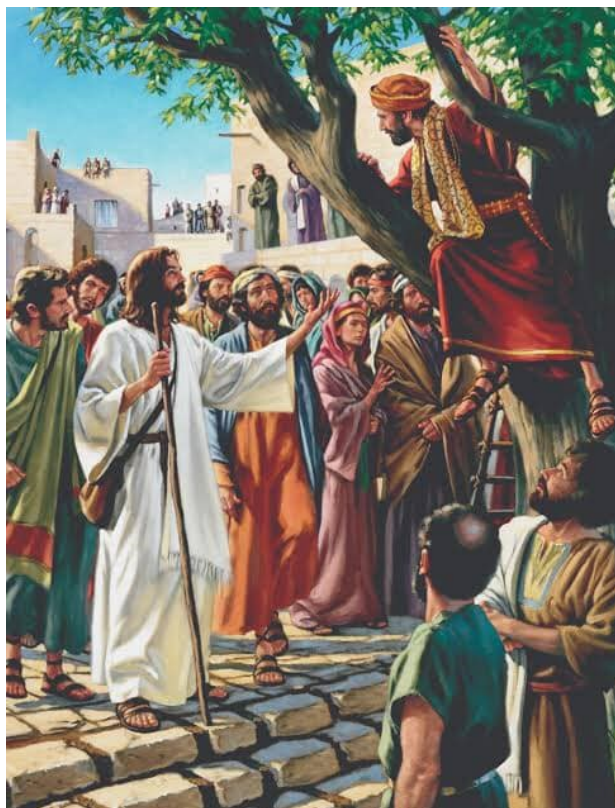

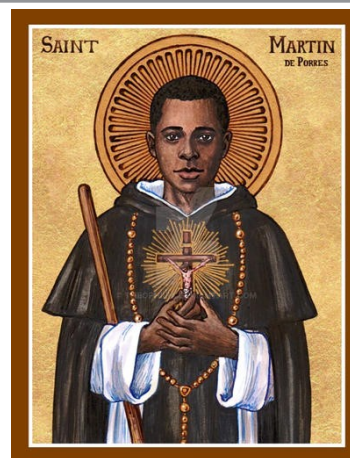

Dear friends in the Lord:

The triennial national collection for *The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS)*, was first approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in 2012 and is to be taken every three years on the Sunday before Veteran's Day —this year on **November 6**. Its mission is "*serving those who serve*".

Originally under the authority of the Archbishop of New York, the AMS was established by Pope St. John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Church's full range of pastoral ministries as any other diocese, but particularly to Catholic men and women of the six branches of United States Armed Forces, those enrolled at one of the United States military academies, under going treatment in any of the 153 departments of veteran's affairs medical centers in the USA, Puerto Rico, and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond United States borders, the diplomatic corps, and families of these populations.

Catholic chaplains for the military and VA medical centers come from the AMS. Its endorsed priests are responsible for pastoral services to 1.8 million Catholics who seek preparation for and participation in the sacraments, who benefit from consultation with a priest, and who are absolved in battle conditions as they defend our rights and liberty. While the salaries and retirement of military chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding in support of its programs vital to its mission and ministry, including vocations, evangelization, and catechesis, a tribunal, and veteran's affairs. It has no parishes of its own, and no weekly collections. It relies solely on the generosity of private donations.

As I write to you today, I ask you to consider a sacrificial gift to this appeal for the military archdiocese and I thank you for your contribution of \$271,941 in the 2019 collection. Your generous support will help the AMS to bring the gospel and the sacraments to men and women who serve our country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from our own archdiocese and parishes.
