

From the burning bush, Moses is called by God to lead his people out of slavery into freedom (1, Ps). The parable of the fig tree speaks, on the one hand, of God's patience, but, on the other, of the urgency of the call to conversion (3). Like the Hebrews of old, we too have failed to heed God's call, thinking ourselves to be self-righteous (2).

In Jesus' time, people did not keep gardens primarily for beauty. Theirs were gardens of utility, destined to produce food. As a former small-scale organic farmer, I get this mindset. For nine years, I worked my farm with my own hands, directing every ounce of energy toward the harvest. I embraced the varieties and practices that produced the greatest yield, while quickly setting to the side those that did not. A vegetable variety that brought forth a meager crop one year had to be abandoned the next for one that was more productive.

And so, when Jesus tells the parable of the fig tree that has not borne fruit for three years in a row, I marvel at the actions of that gardener. It is already a great mercy that this little stump has been allowed to remain alive this long. But now the gardener will lavish attention on it. He will ensure it always gets the right amount of water. He will protect it from cruel winds. He will work in the best compost around its roots.

I am telling you: this gardener is extraordinary. He is more than just a gardener. He is in love with this little tree, and he will do anything for it. I would not be surprised if this gardener were to give his life just so that this little fig tree might bear fruit.
