Feast Day — October 28th**

Jude (Thaddaeus) was the brother of James the Less. The Gospel of John refers to his presence at the Last Supper, when he asked Jesus, "Lord, how is it that thou wilt manifest thyself unto us, and not unto the world?" And Jesus answered, "If a man love me, he

will keep my words: and my Father will love him and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him." Apocryphal tradition holds that he was active in preaching the Gospel and was martyred, clubbed to death, together with Simon in Persia. He is therefore often depicted with a club. He is invoked for help in hopeless situations.

Name: Jude is from the Aramaic and means "Support of God"

November 2nd — The Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day)

Rooted in ancient Christian tradition (2nd c. And Tetullian), St. Odilo of the Cluny (1 Jan) established a memorial of all the faithfully departed in 988. It was accepted in Rome in the 13th c.

The 1915 Apostolic Constitution of Pope Benedict XV, *Incrumentum altar sacrificium*, granted all priests the privilege of celebrating three Masses today for the following intentions: one Mass for a particular intention, another Mass for all the faithfully departed, and a third Mass for the intention of the pope. A stipend may be received only for the first intention mentioned above.
