Saint Leander of Seville
February 27th
Bishop

Born at Cartagena around 545, he chose the religious life, as did his brothers Isidore and Fulgentis and his sister Florentine, and battles the Arianism professed by the Visigoths then ruling Spain. Following important conversations in the royal family, he was expelled and took refuge on Constantinople, where he met the future pope Gregory the Great. Recalled to Spain, he was made bishop of Seville. He convened the Third council of Toledo, which confirmed the conversion of the Visigoth kingdom to Catholicism. He died around 600.

As we begin this season of repentance and reflection, let us contemplate what this time means and how the three pillars of Lent lead us to a closer relationship with God. The word Lent comes from an old English word meaning “spring,” or “a new birth.” This time of year helps us renew our life in Jesus, his Church, and his Father. These 40 days allow us to journey with Jesus through his passion and death leading us to rejoice in his resurrection. This is the reality of the Paschal Mystery, the essence of our sacramental life in the Church. In order to be fully immersed in the Lenten experience, the Church gives us three extraordinary ways to draw closer into the mystery: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.


