Background on today's Gospel

In today's gospel, Mark's lean, spare, almost journalistic prose tells the story of not one but two miracles of healing, the first being the woman who for twelve years suffered from hemorrhages and is broke from all the doctors. She is cured when she just touches the hem of Jesus's garment, and, when she collapses in fear, he tells her that it was her faith that cured her. He then is brought to the house of Jairus the synagogue official, whose young daughter has just died. If Jesus is greeted with fear in the first healing, the second one brings him scorn and derisive laughter. The grown woman falls down in fear, the little girl reclines in the slumber of death. Both are raised up by Jesus before the story ends with a meal.



Scripture Outline & Reflection

Saints, Paul and Peter, Apostles



Peter, rescued from the power of Herod, and Paul, protected from his enemies, proclaim with their lives that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Peter c. 64 in Rome under Nero; Galilean fisherman; spokesman for the Twelve who became "Prince of the Apostles";

two epistles are ascribed to him; patron of those in the fishing industry.

Paul, according to tradition was martyred in Rome c. 67; Pharisee who became the "Apostle of the Gentiles", his letters may be dated from c. 50-65; patron of the lay apostolate, the Cursillo Movement, and Catholic Action; also of Malta and Greece.

The *Depositio Martyrum* (256) places the Solemnity of these apostles on this date. Both are the principle patrons of Rome and are mentioned in the Roman Canon.

Names: Peter is from the Greek and means "rock, stone" Paul is of Latin origin and means "small in stature, humble"

Reflection. The early Christian martyrs could only have had the courage to die for the faith if they were filled with the assurance and courage of the Holy Spirit. Otherwise, they would have judged their deaths to be a defeat.

In the Spirit, they came to realize that the blood of the martyrs is the seed of Church.




