Scripture Outline & Reflection

*Wisdom 7:7-11;
Psalm 90:12-13, 14-15, 16-17;
Hebrews 4:12-13;
Mark 10:17-30 or 10:17-27*

When offered the choice between true knowledge or riches, Solomon prays for wisdom of heart (1, Ps). When given the choice between following Jesus or remaining attached to his material wealth, the man chooses his possessions (3). God's word challenges us (2) to be attached to Jesus, and to him alone.

Reflection for 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

BE DETACHED FROM WORLDLY POSSESSIONS TO BE ATTACHED TO JESUS – SECRET TO INHERITING ETERNAL LIFE

The readings of today’s Liturgy invite us to reflect on the themes of invitation, gratitude, and the true nature of wealth. The First Reading from the Book of Wisdom emphasizes that wisdom is more precious than gold or silver, and this resonates with the Gospel reading from Mark. Jesus asks the rich young man who was searching for eternal life to go sell all his possessions and share with the poor; and then, follow Him, but the man’s face fell when he couldn’t part with his possessions. What this lacked was lack of charity – he was not ready to share his wealth and many possessions with the poor in order to gain the eternal treasures of heaven. This highlights the deeper attachment to what we hold dear, such as comforts, status, and identities.

Jesus’ invitation to the rich young man is an invitation to transformation, asking him to let go of what hinders his relationship with God. This is not just a call for the wealthy; it’s a universal call to all of us. What are the “riches” in our lives that keep us from fully following Christ? It could be our jobs, relationships, or even our own self-importance. The contrast between the rich young man and the call to discipleship highlights the radical nature of the Gospel. Jesus emphasizes that it is difficult for those attached to riches to enter the Kingdom of God. This invites us to examine our priorities and confront our worldly attachments.

As we gather around the Eucharistic table today, let us consider how we might respond to God's invitation today. Are we willing to let go of what weighs us down and embrace a life of generosity, not just with our finances but also with our time, talents, and love? In gratitude, let us recognize that all that we have comes from God, and the ultimate wealth is not found in what we possess but in our relationship with Him and the love we share with one another.
