Parishioners unable to attend mass and receive communion, please call the rectory.



Reflection for 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

OUR MISSION – CALLED TO IMITATE JESUS THE SERVANT-LEADER

Today, World Mission Sunday, we are called to take a step back to reflect on the universal mission of the Church and our own unique mission as missionary disciples by virtue of our Baptism. Mission as it were, is a gift and Christ is the very gift of mission because the mission is always his mission.

The readings invite us to consider the meaning of true greatness and the nature of service. Jesus’ teachings on leadership and service contrast sharply with our desire for power and prestige. He reminds us that true greatness in His kingdom is not found in authority or status, but in humble service to others. This radical inversion of worldly values challenges us to rethink our own aspirations and ambitions. James and John approached Jesus to asked that he grants them the favor of one sitting at his right and the other sitting at his left. The failed to understand that the mission of Jesus was not a political mission that involves positions of honor but one that is defined by the reality of the cross of suffering. Hence, he asked them: *“Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?”*

The mission of Jesus is one that is characterized by service. And Christ showed us that perfect example of humble service as he embraced the cross. The ultimate example of self-giving love is found in Jesus Himself. He tells His disciples, “For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.” This mission of service is at the heart of our faith as Christian believers. Jesus models for us what it means to truly love and serve one another, culminating in His passion and death on the cross.

On World Mission Sunday, we acknowledge that the Church is a missionary disciple. Every day, countless missionaries—priests, religious, and laypeople—work tirelessly around the globe to bring hope and healing to those in need. They serve in challenging circumstances, sometimes in foreign lands, often facing hardships and dangers, driven by a profound love for Christ and a desire to share that love with others – the joy of the Gospel.

As we reflect on this mission, let us ask ourselves how we can live out our calling to serve like Jesus – the Servant-Leader? Are we willing to let go of our ambitions for the sake of others and embrace the humility that comes with true service? We can commit to supporting missionaries through prayers and donations, or actively engage in service projects within our parish.

Today’s Gospel challenges us to embrace the heart of our mission as followers of Christ—that is, to serve rather than to be served, to love without condition, and to act as ambassadors of His grace in all that we do. Let us pray for the strength to live out our missionary mandate and for all those who dedicate their lives to sharing the Good News. Amen.
