THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: This day is sometimes called Gaudete Sunday because the first word of the entrance antiphon in Latin is "gaudete," which means rejoice. The antiphon is taken from Philippians 4:4, Paul's warm and loving letter to the community he founded in Philippi. It doesn't sound very elegant to call this the "Rejoice Sunday" but that's the idea. It is a day of joy. The prayer of the Church echoes that sentiment as it calls us to "Rejoice! The Lord is near!" We know all too well the challenge of trying to integrate the religious Advent/Christmas message of the liturgy into the "Let's party!" message of our culture. Scripture today shows us that in rejoicing, we are invited to examine our spiritual readiness for the coming of Christ while still being engaged in the task of daily preparations for the Christmas celebration. To strengthen our spiritual readiness, we are offered a summary of the goals of Christian ministry in today's first reading from the Old Testament's prophet Isaiah (Is. 61:1-2, 10-11). Our Lord would recall the words of Isaiah when He stood in the synagogue before the people of His village (see Lk. 4:15-21). In today's second reading (1 Thes. 5:16-24) St. Paul sees joy as a sign of faith – a sign that is not diminished even by suffering or loss or persecution. We have received the gift of the Holy Spirit in baptism – and we are called to be joyful witnesses, even in this "vale of tears." As we prepare for the feast of the Incarnation, we examine our hearts to see how we are doing in our mission given to us in baptism. Once again the prominence of John the Baptist in today's gospel (Jn. 1:6-8; 9-28) will enhance our reflection.



SAINT'S DAY - ADVENT: WEEK THREE

Monday, December 14th – St. John of the Cross

Today is the memorial of St. John of the Cross, the 16th century Spanish mystic and Doctor of the Church. His spiritual classic, The Dark Night of the Soul suggests an important truth to remember in Advent: in darkness – under the shadow of the cross, we find light. St. John teaches us how to seek God's will and trust in God's grace.



Lessons and Carols Concert: This Sunday afternoon, our talented and dedicated choirs (along with some of our eloquent lectors) will present "Lessons and Carols: An Evening of Sacred Christmas Music" under the direction of Mr. John Stufano. The program will include both well-known classical works and traditional carols along with scripture readings in an effort to help us make a prayerful preparation for the Christmas

season. Come support the Adult choir, Youth choir, and all who have worked to prepare for this event. The program begins at 5:00 p.m. and light refreshments will follow. All are welcome.



Confessions in Advent: In addition to our regular confessions next Saturday (December 19th) from 4:00 to 4:45 p.m., we are participating in an Archdiocesan Program, "Reconciliation Monday in Advent" this Monday, December 14th. Confessions that day will be from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. in the afternoon and from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. in the evening. This special opportunity for confessions is being done in conjunction with most of the parishes in the Archdiocese.



<u>Christmas Traditions</u>: The Candy Cane – One of the oldest – and certainly the <u>tastiest</u> – Christian "symbol" is the peppermint candy cane – which is more than a piece of candy; it is rich – not only in sugar – but in symbolism. It's made in the shape of a shepherd's "crook" – which recalls the shepherds who came to see the Christ Child in the manger; the Christ Child who would call Himself the "Good Shepherd." The colors – red and white – are highly significant. The white represents purity – the purity of Our Lord – as well as the purity He calls us to. The red represents the blood He shed for us – and the sacrifices He asks us to make for one another. Remember all these associations when you place candy canes on your Christmas tree during this special season of grace.



<u>Christmas Envelopes</u>: For anyone who did not receive a Christmas envelope in the mail, they are available at the exits of the Church and in the sacristy. Christmas is traditionally a time for giving – because we are especially aware at this holy season of everything that God has given us through His Son. Your special sacrifice at this time of year does so much to insure that St. John's will be able to meet the many needs of our people and continue to be such a special church in which to pray, to hear God's word, and to receive the sacraments. God bless you for your goodness.

Passing the Torch: For a little over a year, Fr. Renny Abraham has been living with us at St. John's, where he served the Eastern Rite Catholics who are part of the Syro – Malabar Catholic community in the tri-state area. Because of his responsibilities in that community, his service here at St. John's was primarily celebrating week day Masses at our parish, because he usually was travelling on weekends. Fr. Renny has been appointed to serve another Syro – Malabar community in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, so he will be leaving us this week. Happily, another priest has been appointed to serve their community in this area and he will be coming to live at St. John's. His name is Fr. Joseph Mathew and we look forward to welcoming him soon. Please keep Fr. Renny in your prayers.



Rest in Peace: Let us pray for Nicholas Riccio and James (Jarlath) Mullin who were buried from our church this past week. Our prayers go out to their families and friends.

Latin Chant: During Advent at our sung Sunday Masses, we will use traditional Gregorian Chant whenever the Sanctus and Agnus Dei are sung. The chant melodies are very easy to sing and the words of these responses are so familiar in English that the Latin shouldn't pose a problem, even for someone who has never studied Latin. Moreover, it gives us an opportunity (however small) to recapture the long tradition of singing Gregorian Chant. The text of and music for these acclamations can be found in the Music Issue: Sanctus (#850); Agnus Dei (#854).
