

Our monthly Holy Hour gives us the opportunity to place ourselves in the presence of the Eucharistic Lord. It is an occasion for us to join our prayers, our work, our joys, our sufferings with Our Divine Savior.



Advanced Planning: February 10th – a week from this coming Wednesday – is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Ashes will be blessed and distributed at all our Masses that day. We will have three Masses:

at 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon and 7:30 p.m. In addition, we will have two prayer services and distribution of ashes at 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Please mark your calendars.



FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: The Gospel today (Lk. 4:21-30) begins with the words of the final verse read last Sunday. Continuing to explain the meaning of the words of the prophet Isaiah, Jesus identifies Himself as a prophet ready to be rejected in His native place. Jesus confounds the listeners with His words and actions, leading us to recognize that He is indeed chosen by God to bring the message of salvation.

The first reading from the prophet Jeremiah (Jer. 1:4-19) warns us about the life of the prophet. Called and dedicated even before birth, a prophet can expect to meet obstacles and opposition, but neither will prevail because of the Lord's promise, "I am with you to deliver you."

In sharp contrast to the struggles of the prophetic life, the second reading offers tremendous consolation with its song of love. This familiar passage from the letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor. 12:31 - 13:13) stresses the many faces of love that come in handy when life's trials prevail. Be mindful of the virtues of faith, hope and charity expressed in this reading and the ways in which they become the hallmark of the prophet wherever he or she is found.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Tuesday, February 2nd – Presentation of the Lord

This feast on the 40th day of Christmas is concerned with the biblical events in the temple of Jerusalem which are reported in St. Luke's gospel (2:22-38). It celebrates when Mary brings the child Jesus to the temple to fulfill the Mosaic Law (Lev. 12:1-8) and to make the traditional offerings to the poor. Since this was the occasion on which Simeon speaks of Jesus as the "Light of revelation to the gentiles" the feast has been the time for processions and the blessing of candles (hence the term "candlemas"). The candles represent Christ – the light that has come into the world and which we pray will always burn brightly in our hearts and minds.

Wednesday, February 3rd – St. Blasé

This 4th century bishop and martyr is said to have healed a boy with a fish bone stuck in his throat; thus becoming the special patron for those suffering diseases of the throat. The blessing of the throats with candles began in the 16th century. The blessing of throats will take place at St. John's immediately following each of our Masses on Wednesday.

Friday, February 5th – St. Agatha

This young woman lived in the 3rd century – during the terrible persecution of the Church by a succession of Roman emperors. She was martyred in Sicily about 251 A.D. because she refused to give up her faith. She is the patroness of Sicily.

Saturday, February 6th – St. Paul Miki and Companions

Paul was a Japanese nobleman who lived in 16th century Japan; converted by Jesuits, he himself became a Jesuit and a successful missionary preacher in Japan. He and his companions were martyred by decree of Japan's brutal, anti-Catholic dictator.

<u>Cardinal's Appeal</u>: Cardinal Dolan has begun this annual Archdiocesan Stewardship Appeal. Some of our parishioners have already received information about the appeal in the mail; many more will receive such information in the days and weeks to follow. In a few weeks we will have our annual "In Pew Sunday" which will give everyone an opportunity to participate in this vital campaign which does so much to assist the Church's pastoral, charitable, and educational efforts throughout our Archdiocese. In the meantime we ask everyone to pray for the success of this appeal.

Mass Requests for 2017: The Mass "book" for 2017 will be open for reservations as of Thursday, February 18th. Because of the number of Parishioners who wish to arrange Masses at St. John's, we must request that Mass reservations be made in person. On February 18th those seeking to make Mass reservations should do so in the lower church (not the rectory) starting at 9:00 a.m. Someone will be there all morning and in the afternoon until 3:00 p.m. After February 18th, Mass requests for 2017 should be made in the rectory, Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Our office staff is simply unable to handle requests by phone if they are to complete the regular volume of work they have. In addition, individual Mass

We are happy to provide Mass cards for these Masses; however, they will not be celebrated here at St. John's.
