Special Children's Mass: This Sunday, at our 9:30 a.m. Mass, we once again welcome younger boys and girls to a special Mass where they will be excused after the Opening Prayer and go to the Church Hall for a special Liturgy of the Word. After this Mass please join us for a Family Coffee and Craft Hour in

the school cafeteria at which we will have refreshments and make crafts for the family. We are very grateful to the parent-leaders (as well as some older children) who are assisting with this program.



SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT: Modern science, which has sent vehicles into space to photograph the hidden reaches of our galaxy, has added new depth to today's first reading (Gen. 15:5-18) about Abraham's contemplation of a sky filled with countless start. Abraham's experience has led to a faith so deep that it was sealed by a covenant. Its importance was symbolized by having the parties walk between pieces of animals: failure to keep their word would bring the same fate.

Citizenship is an important concept for Paul in today's second reading (Phil. 3:17-4:1). He assures the Philippians that their real citizenship is in heaven. Therefore, they, and we, would do well to imitate Paul, just as he imitates Jesus, the man of prayer. In this way, we, like Jesus in today's gospel (Luke 9:28-36), will be transformed and united with Christ forever.

Luke's version of the Transfiguration comes shortly after the first announcement of the Passion and resurrection. In this way, the gospel passage underscores the connection between suffering and glory. The mountain is a connection to Sinai and the typical Lucan place of prayer. Moses and Elijah, (law and prophecy), witness to Jesus, their New Testament fulfillment. They speak of Jesus' own Exodus, His journey through the suffering of Good Friday to the glory of Easter.

SAINTS' DAYS – LENT – WEEK TWO

Monday, February 22nd - The Chair of St. Peter, Apostle

The chair (or "cathedra") of a bishop has a place of honor in every cathedral – and is a sign of the unity of faith that connects all Catholics in a diocese. This feast – which has been celebrated since the 4th century – marks the unity of Catholics all over the world who profess the one true Church built on St. Peter and his successors.

Tuesday, February 23rd - St. Polycarp

This second century martyr had been a disciple of St. John the Evangelist. He evangelized in the Middle East and eventually became bishop of Smyrna where he was burned at the stake for being a Christian.



<u>Lent</u>: is a holy season in our Church's year, it is holy because it calls us in a special way to holiness and encourages us to adopt holy habits of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

<u>Prayer</u>: We should try to attend Mass as often as we can during Lent and pray the Rosary and make the Stations of the Cross (which is publicly celebrated every Friday in Lent during the Eucharistic Holy Hour that begins at 7:30 p.m.)

<u>Almsgiving</u>: We should try to make special sacrifices during Lent – and it is fortunate that the annual Cardinal's Appeal continues throughout Lent so that we have a very practical opportunity to assist the Church's works of charity in New York.

<u>Fasting</u>: We should try to practice some form of self-discipline during Lent – so that we might in some small way identify ourselves with Christ who was crucified for us.

Friday Lenten Devotion: On each of the Fridays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Stations of the Cross and a reflection by Fr. Daniel Ulloa, O.P. on the topic: "How to Live the Year of Mercy in an Unforgiving World." The evening Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

<u>Lenten Fast and Abstinence</u>: <u>ALL THE FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE DAY OF ABSTINENCE</u> - All Catholics above the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on the days of abstinence (unless poor health excuses). Additionally, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both fast and abstinence. Not only is meat prohibited, but on these two fast days, only one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken together should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from 18 to 59 (unless poor health excuses).

<u>Latin Chant</u>: During Lent at our sung Sunday Masses, we will use traditional Gregorian Chant whenever the Kyrie, Sanctus and Agnus Dei are sung. The chant melodies are very easy to sing and the words of these responses are so familiar in English that the Latin shouldn't pose a problem, even for someone who has never studied Latin. Moreover, it gives us an opportunity (however small) to recapture the long tradition of singing Gregorian Chant. The text of and music for these acclamations can be found in the Music Issue: Kyrie (#853); Sanctus (#850); Agnus Dei (#854).

Sunday Report: The brutally cold weather last weekend kept our Mass attendance down considerably; however, 940 heavily "layered" parishioners attended Mass. Our collection totaled \$7,157.00 for an average of \$7.61. Thank you for your continued financial support of St. John's and its many needs. Your generosity is essential and greatly appreciated.
